This genealogy covers three generations of the Author's Benson family beginning with my immigrant ancestor, James Benson, who emigrated from Ireland in the 1700's, eventually settling in South Carolina. The information presented in this genealogy was finalized on 1 April 2019 and consists of approximately 42 pages.

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THE BENSON SURNAME

The name Benson is a patronymic surname of English origin which simply means "son of Ben."

REFERENCES AND INDEX

A listing of references and other source material, as well as an all-name Index, is provided at the end of this genealogy.

DATES

For the most part, many conflicting dates were easily straightened out by simply rechecking the source material or official records. In some cases, however, marriage dates may vary from other published works because the researcher used the date of a marriage bond, or the date a marriage license was issued, instead of the actual marriage date. Even though some of the source material I used did not specify the origin of the marriage date given, I have tried to substantiate the marriage dates as accurately as possible.

In a number of cases an approximate date of marriage, using the abbreviation "ca." for circa (about), is shown based upon information provided in various census documents and other documents. This is also true with respect to death dates which may also vary in that the date of burial, or the date a will was written or submitted for probate, will sometimes be cited by others instead of an actual death date. In those cases where I was unable to determine an actual death date the abbreviation "ca." may be used, or only the known year of death may be cited.

LOCATIONS

With respect to the location at which an event took place, there were many cases when it was not possible to find any record giving the exact location that a birth, marriage or death took place. Because I feel quite strongly that dates should always be accompanied by places, if for no other reason than to aid future research, I made a number of assumptions regarding location based upon available information. For instance, if a family is found in the Fayette County, Indiana census records for 1840 and 1850, and they also show up in the deed and tax records of that county for the same period, I did not feel that it was unreasonable to assume that any children they had during this period were probably also born in Fayette County. In some cases, however, my comfort level with assuming a possible location was limited to a state only.

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GENERATION ONE

1. James Benson. *

James Benson, the earliest known, and immigrant ancestor, of our Benson family to have been verified to date, is said to have been born in about 1730 in County Tyrone, Ireland. ¹ At the present time the only information that has been found which pertains to how and when James Benson came to reside in South Carolina was provided by his great grandsons, Henry Clark Benson and William Martindale Benson. Unfortunately, their two versions conflict with each other as can be seen in the below excerpts.

This excerpt was taken from the "History of Cherokee County, Kansas and its Representative Citizens,." and was provided by William Martindale Benson. ²

"James Benson was born in County Tyrone, Ireland, and shipped to America at the age of 18 years, subject to indenture for his passage money of \$30. This resulted in his working for six years for a Philadelphia weaver, who was a just man and took the young Irish lad into his family as one of his own, winning the youth's lifelong devotion. Prior to the Revolutionary War, he went to South Carolina, where he secured a title to 400 acres of land in Union County, and resided upon it until his death in 1790."

This excerpt was taken from "Copeland, Bostick, Patton, and Allied Families," and was provided by Henry Clark Benson. ¹

"James Benson, born about 1730, attempted to go to America when about twelve years of age because he could not get along with his stepmother. He packed a few clothes, went to Belfast, and booked passage to Richmond, Virginia where his uncle resided. He hoped that his uncle would pay for his passage to America.

"Young James decided to remain in Ireland, however, and did not attempt to make the trip until about two years later. His ship, instead of going to Virginia, went instead to Charleston, South Carolina, and there James was taken over by a man who paid for the passage to America in exchange for James' labor on his farm. James Benson lived in Union District, South Carolina, where he eventually married and where he became guite prosperous."

Regardless of which version is accurate, James Benson was very likely residing in colonial South Carolina by the early 1750's, as his three known children are all believed to have been born there.

James Benson was later married to a woman named Martha Quinn, and even though no record of their marriage has been found, they are said to have been married in South Carolina. ¹ Even though Martha Quinn is believed to have also been born in County Tyrone, Ireland, no information has been found concerning her parentage, or when she arrived in South Carolina. ¹ After their marriage, James and Martha resided in that portion of South Carolina that was originally formed into Ninety-Six District in 1769, but was later made a part of Union County, South Carolina in 1798. ^{1,3}

James Benson's great grandson, Henry Clark Benson, provided an interesting historical note regarding James Benson during the Revolutionary War, which is shown below.

This excerpt was taken from "Copeland, Bostick, Patton, and Allied Families," and was provided by Henry Clark Benson. ¹

"Dr. Benson told an amusing incident about his great grandfather, James Benson, which occurred during the Revolutionary War. James Benson was a Quaker and refused to fight. He sided with the British, however, and vowed not to shave off his beard until King George had conquered the rebels.

"A colonel with a regiment of American soldiers was passing through the neighborhood where James lived, and the colonel, hearing about James, the "rank Tory," sent for a barber who shaved James, taking almost a half of bushel of hair off his face. Strangely enough, James Benson's sons fought on the side of the Americans."

In the above excerpt, Dr. Benson mentions that during the Revolutionary War, James Benson's "sons" fought on the side of the Americans. In another passage he identified these sons as John, William, Henry, and James. ¹ Even though there is always a possibility that James and Martha Benson may have had other sons, James Benson, Jr. is the only son named in his father's will. He is also the only male child of James and Martha Benson's to have been uncovered to date. Aside from the above autobiographical sketch, no documented evidence has ever been found that I am aware of to substantiate that James and Martha Benson had any other sons, and after many years of researching this family I personally do not believe they did. Although there were other Benson's residing in South Carolina during the 1700's, no connection to our Benson family has been found.

According to various court records, James Benson was appointed as "overseer of the road from Cooks Bridge to Daniel Lipham's" on 7 April 1794, and served as a "Petit Juror" on 3 January 1797 in the case of Graffs Edson & Company versus Job Hammond over an unpaid debt. ⁴

Martha (Quinn) Benson appears to have died prior to April 1799 in what had recently become Union County, South Carolina, as she was not mentioned in James Benson's will. ⁵ James, on the other hand, died in Union County, South Carolina in 1801. ⁵ His will, which had been written on 20 April 1799, was subsequently probated before the Union County Court on 17 April 1801. ⁵

GENERATION TWO

2. Mary Benson.

Mary Benson, the daughter of James Benson and Martha Quinn, is believed to have been born in about 1754 in what is now the state of South Carolina. ⁶ Mary was apparently married twice during her life. ⁶ She married first in about 1772 to a man named Jonathan Frost in Ninety-Six District, South Carolina. ⁶ Jonathan, who was born in Frederick County, Virginia, was the son of John and Mary Frost. ⁶

When the Revolutionary War broke out, Mary's husband, Jonathan Frost, was a loyalist who fought on the side of the British. Jonathan, who served as a Major in the Ninety-Six Brigade of the Fair Forest Regiment of Militia during the War, died in action in South Carolina on 13 December 1780. ^{6,11} His widow, Mary, subsequently received thirty-five Pounds Sterling on 7 January 1782 for his six months of military service between 14 June 1780 and 13 December 1780. ¹¹ Although Jonathan Frost did not leave a will, his estate was administered on 11 September 1783 in Ninety-Six District, and an inventory was carried out on 15 September 1783. ¹²

After Jonathan was killed, Mary apparently married for a second time to a man whose name is currently unknown. ⁶ This is substantiated in the genealogy "Frost, Gilchrist and Related Families" compiled by J. Michael Frost. ⁶ It states:

"A letter written by Rhoda Frost, daughter-in-law of Mary (Benson) Frost, to relatives in Tennessee stated that Mary married again after the death of her husband, Major Jonathan Frost. The name of the second husband has not been determined, but Mary Frost named in her will four additional children besides the known Frost children. These children of the second husband were Barnet, Elizabeth, Rachel, and William. Nothing further was learned about these children. Rhoda Frost wrote that the O'Neall family raised the Frost children, presumably after the death of Major Frost."

Mary subsequently died during the month of December 1796 in Old Ninety-Six District, South Carolina. ⁷ Her will, which was dated 25 December 1796, was admitted for probate on 2 January 1797. ⁷ In Mary's will, she specifically referred to her "four youngest children" as being Barnett, Elizabeth, Rachel, and William. ⁷

3. Sarah "Sally" Benson.

Sarah Benson, the daughter of James Benson and Martha Quinn, was born in what is now the state of South Carolina sometime between 1750 and 1760. ^{6,8} She was later married in South Carolina to a man named Alexander Brown. ⁶ Alexander, who was also a native of South Carolina, appears to have also been born sometime between 1750 and 1760. ^{8,16}

Although Alexander and Sarah remained in South Carolina for many years after their marriage, they eventually moved north to Ohio, where they appear to have resided for a time in Miami County, Ohio, but later settled in Darke County, Ohio. Prior to settling in Darke County, Ohio, however, Sarah (Benson) Brown, as a legatee of her father, James Benson, as well as her children; James Brown and his wife, Sarah; Robert Brown and his wife, Hannah; Anna Goens (Goings); Elizabeth Brown; and Polly Brown; sold 100 acres of land along the Tyger River in Union County, South Carolina on 19 October 1821 to her son, William Brown, and his wife, Polly. ¹³ William and Polly Brown subsequently resold this land to a man named Theophilus Penny for \$100.00 on 30 October 1821.

After settling in Darke County, Ohio, Alexander and Sarah acquired 80 acres of land there on 14 March 1825 from the U. S. General Land Office. Alexander and Sarah Brown were last found on the 1830 census of Ohio residing in Twin Township in Darke County. Living nearby were James Brown, Robert Brown, William Brown and David Goens.

4. James Benson. *

James Benson, the son of James Benson, Sr. and Martha Quinn, is thought to have been born in about 1759/1760 in the state of South Carolina. This is somewhat supported by the 1830 census of Greene County, Ohio which indicates he was born between 1750 and 1760. ⁹ During the Revolutionary War, James enlisted as a Private, serving as a horseman in Colonel Thomas Brandon's 2nd Spartan Regiment, and during the years 1781 and 1783, he also supplied provisions and forage to the American forces. ¹⁸

After the Revolutionary War, James Benson was married to a woman named Elizabeth Clark, and from this union ten children were born. ¹⁰ Although the actual date of their marriage has not been determined, it is believed to have taken place in about 1785. This date is primarily based upon the 13 August 1786 birth date of their eldest son, William Benson, as shown in the Union Cemetery records. ¹⁹ Even though William Benson's stated age at the time of his death suggests a birth year of 1784, I do not believe this is correct. ²⁰ Elizabeth, who was the daughter of John Clark and Mary Campbell, had been born on 20 June 1767 in York County, Pennsylvania. ^{10,21,22}

Although James Benson may have been associated with the Quaker Church prior to his marriage to Elizabeth, the earliest Quaker record that has been found which pertains to him was in the minutes of the Bush River Monthly Meeting of Friends in Ninety-Six District, South Carolina (now Newberry County, South Carolina). ²² This entry was dated 26 April 1788, and stated that James Benson had been "received by request." ²²

James and Elizabeth Benson were later united with the Cane Creek Monthly Meeting of Friends, however, in what is now Union County, South Carolina. ²³ In the minutes of this Meeting, dated 24 August 1805, was found the following: "James Benson and family given certificate to Miami Monthly Meeting, Ohio." ²³ Like many of the Quakers residing in the Carolinas and Virginia, James and Elizabeth Benson decided to move to Ohio after it had become a state in 1803. ³ One of the main drawing points of Ohio was that it had been granted statehood as a "free state," and many southern Quakers were known to be anti-slavery. Whether or not the Benson's were anti-slavery Quakers, or whether they were simply looking to settle on new land, is not known, however.

The Benson's were subsequently received on 14 November 1805 at the Miami Monthly Meeting in Greene County, Ohio, and soon took up land along the Little Miami River in Greene County. ²⁴ In 1810, however, a new meeting was established as an offshoot of the Miami Monthly Meeting. It was called Caesar's Creek Monthly Meeting, and was located just over the county line in what is now Clinton County, Ohio. ²⁵ The minutes of the Caesar's Creek Monthly Meeting show that three of James and Elizabeth's children were married there. ²⁵

When the 1820 and 1830 federal censuses of Ohio were enumerated, the Benson's were shown to be residing in Sugar Creek Township in Greene County, and it appears that they remained there until James Benson's death, which probably transpired shortly after the 1830 census was enumerated. ^{9,21,25,26} Prior to his death, James deeded nearly all of his land holdings to his children. They in turn deeded these lands to John Benson after father's death. John Benson was the youngest child of James and Elizabeth, and most of the older children had already moved to Indiana.

On 27 January 1831, James Benson's widow, Elizabeth, was granted a certificate by the Caesar's Creek Monthly Meeting to join the Cherry Grove Monthly Meeting of Friends at Lynn in Randolph County, Indiana to be near several of her children who had previously moved there. ²⁵ According to the minutes of the Cherry Grove Meeting, Elizabeth was received there on 12 March 1831. ²¹ Elizabeth resided in Randolph County, Indiana until her death on 31 January 1844. ²¹ She was subsequently buried in the Quaker Lynn Cemetery at Lynn, Indiana. ^{10,21,27}

Based upon where James and Elizabeth Benson were residing, it appears that their first five children were born in what was still the Ninety-Six District of South Carolina, while their next four children were born in what had become Union County, South Carolina. Their youngest child, John, however, was born in Greene County, Ohio.

21. William Benson.

William Benson, the son of James Benson and Elizabeth Clark, was born in the Ninety-Six District of South Carolina on 13 August 1786. ¹⁹ (Although William's stated age at the time of his death suggests a birth year of 1784, I do not believe this is correct). ²⁰ William was later married on 14 January 1808 in Warren County, Ohio to a woman named Mary Stewart (also written Mary Stuart). ¹⁷ Mary, who was the daughter of Robert Stewart and Ann Hornaday, was calculated to have been born in about 1791 in North Carolina. ^{35,36}

Although William and Mary resided in Ohio for a number of years after their marriage, they eventually moved west into Indiana, where they resided for a time in Randolph County, before settling permanently in Warren County, Indiana. William died on 2 August 1847 in Warren County, Indiana. ^{19,20} He was subsequently buried in the Union Cemetery at Pine Village in John Q. Adams Township in Warren County. ^{19,20}

NOTE: The death date for William Benson's wife, Mary Stewart, as well as her place of burial in the Pine Village Cemetery in Warren County, Indiana, are identical to those attributed to James Benson's wife, Mary Snipes. Unfortunately, I have not been able to determine which Mary was actually buried in the Pine Village Cemetery. As such, this information is not being presented to avoid confusion.

Mary Benson, the daughter of James Benson and his wife, Elizabeth Clark, was born in Ninety-Six District, South Carolina on 22 December 1788. ^{19,20} She was later married to a man named Edward "Neddie" Allen on 28 June 1810 in Greene County, Ohio. ^{10,17} Edward, who was the son of Jackson Allen and Sarah Bond, had been born during the month of December 1790 in Shenandoah County, Virginia. ^{10,43}

Although Edward and Mary were both Quakers, Edward had apparently left that faith prior to his marriage to Mary. As a consequence, Mary was condemned by the Miami Monthly Meeting of Friends on 25 August 1810 for marrying contrary to discipline. They later became affiliated with the Methodist Church. Two years after their marriage, Edward was drafted into the military, where he served in the War of 1812 as a private in the 1st Regiment of the Ohio Militia (4th Brigade, 1st Division). Because of his service, Edward received a warrant for 40 acres of land in Ohio. 10

In 1829, however, Edward and Mary left Ohio and moved into western Indiana, where they settled in Warren County. ¹⁰ Mary (Benson) Allen died in Warren County, Indiana on 27 September 1843 after a lingering illness. ^{10,19,20} She was buried in the Union Cemetery at Pine Village in Warren County, Indiana. ^{19,20}

After Mary passed away, Edward married for a second time to a woman named Nancy Alexander on 29 March 1844 in Warren County, Indiana. ³⁴ Shortly thereafter, Edward and Nancy moved to Wisconsin to be closer to some of his children who had moved there earlier. ^{10,43} According to available census records, Edward and Nancy were residing in Jefferson Township in Green County, Wisconsin in 1850. ³⁰

Several years later, Edward Allen, along with his 16 year old grandson who was also named Edward, made a visit back to Indiana. On their way home from Indiana Edward came down with cholera and died in the vicinity of Elgin in Cook County, Illinois. This was in the year 1855. Whatever became of Edward's widow, Nancy, has not been determined.


23. Henry Benson.

Henry Benson, the son of James Benson and Elizabeth Clark, was born in the Ninety-Six District of South Carolina on 30 October 1790. ²¹ He was later married to a woman named Margaret Hammer at the Caesar's Creek Meeting House in Clinton County, Ohio on 30 January 1812. ²⁵ Margaret, who was a native of North Carolina, had been born there on 6 April 1791. ²¹ She was the daughter of David Hammer and Charlotte Jay. ^{25,47}

In 1825, Henry and Margaret moved to Randolph County, Indiana, where they resided for the remainder of their lives. According to the records of the Caesars Creek Monthly Meeting of Friends in Clinton County, Ohio, Margaret and children, were given a certificate on 30 December 1824 to join the Cherry Grove Monthly Meeting of Friends in Randolph County, Indiana. ²⁵ Margaret and her children, Mary and William, were subsequently received into membership at Cherry Grove Monthly Meeting on 12 February 1825. ²¹

Henry Benson, who was a farmer by trade, died during the month of July 1849 in Randolph County, Indiana during a cholera outbreak. ^{27,28} He was subsequently buried in the Quaker Lynn Cemetery at Lynn in Randolph County, Indiana. ²⁷ Margaret, on the other hand, was last found on the 1850 census of Randolph County, Indiana residing with her son-in-law and daughter, Levi and Mary (Benson) Kenworthy. ⁴⁸

24. Jonathan Benson.

Jonathan Benson, the son of James Benson and Elizabeth Clark, was born in the Ninety-Six District of South Carolina sometime between 1791 and 1800. ⁹ He was later married at the Caesar's Creek Meeting House in Clinton County, Ohio to a woman named Ruth Brock on 2 December 1813. ²⁵ Ruth, who the daughter of George Brock and Charity Cook, was also born in Ninety-Six District of South Carolina. ^{22,25}

By the time the 1820 census of Ohio was enumerated, Jonathan and Ruth had moved to Randolph County, Indiana, where they were residing in West River Township. ⁵⁰ They only remained in Randolph County for a few years, however, before moving back to Ohio. According to the 1830 census of Ohio, Jonathan and Ruth were living in Sugar Creek Township in Greene County during that year. ⁹

Several years later, Jonathan and Ruth apparently decided to move back to Randolph County, Indiana, as on 27 August 1835 Ruth and most of her children were endorsed by the Caesar's Creek Monthly Meeting of Friends in Clinton County, Ohio to join the Cherry Grove Monthly Meeting of Friends in Randolph County, Indiana. With the exception of Elijah Benson who was married, and John Milton Benson who was not yet born, all of Jonathan and Ruth Benson's other children were named in this endorsement. The Ruth Benson and these same children were also named when they were received into membership by the Cherry Grove Monthly Meeting during the month of December 1835.

25. James Benson.

James Benson, the son of James Benson and Elizabeth Clark, was born in the Ninety-Six District of South Carolina on 29 November 1794. ²⁰ He was later married on 13 February 1823 in Warren County, Ohio to a woman named Mary Snipes. ¹⁷ Mary, who was calculated to have been born in 1793 in North Carolina, was the daughter of Matthew Snipes and Mary Crews. ^{36,58}

Although James and Mary originally resided on a farm in Sugar Creek Township in Greene County, Ohio for a short time, they soon moved into Warren County, Ohio, where the 1830 census shows them residing in the vicinity of Harveysburg. ⁵⁹ By 1840, however, James and his family were found residing in John Q. Adams Township in Warren County, Indiana. ⁶⁰ James Benson subsequently died in Warren County, Indiana on 3 May 1876, and was buried in the McCabe Cemetery near Carbondale in Liberty Township in Warren County. ²⁹

The names, birth dates, and death dates of the four siblings of Iverson H. Benson were provided to the Author via an e-mail from Mr. Bill Snipes. ⁵⁸ According to Mr. Snipes, James and Mary Benson had a total of five children, four of whom died during the cholera epidemic of 1833 in Warren County, Ohio. ⁵⁸

NOTE: The death date for William Benson's wife, Mary Stewart, as well as her place of burial in the Pine Village Cemetery in Warren County, Indiana, are identical to those attributed to James Benson's wife, Mary Snipes. Unfortunately, I have not been able to determine which Mary was actually buried in the Pine Village Cemetery. As such, this information is not being presented to avoid confusion.

26. Thomas Benson.

Thomas Benson, the son of James Benson and Elizabeth Clark, was calculated to have been born in about 1799 in Union County, South Carolina. ³⁰ He was later married on 1 August 1816 at the Caesar's Creek Meeting House in Clinton County, Ohio to a woman named Mary Kelly. ²⁵ Mary, who was also a native of South Carolina, was calculated to have been born there in 1799. ³⁰ She was the daughter of Robert Kelly and Sarah Patty.

Although Thomas and Mary originally settled on a farm in Sugar Creek Township in Greene County, Ohio after their marriage, sometime prior to when the 1830 federal census was taken they had moved to Randolph County, Indiana. ⁶³ After residing in Randolph County for about seven years, they subsequently moved on to Warren County, Indiana, where they settled in John Q. Adams Township. ⁶⁰ By 1846, however, Thomas and Mary had moved again, this time to a farm near the town of Monroe in Green County, Wisconsin. ^{30,64}

The child listed below as (female) was abstracted from the 1820 federal census of Greene County, Ohio. ²⁶ This census shows males 101 and females 101. ²⁶ This child is also believed to be one of Thomas and Mary's daughters, but has not been positively identified as yet.

Samuel Isaac Benson, the son of James Benson and Elizabeth Clark, was born in Union County, South Carolina on 1 December 1800. ²⁰ He was later married in Warren County, Ohio on 10 January 1822 to a woman named Martha J. "Patsy" Martindale. ¹⁷ Martha, who was a native of Ohio, was calculated to have been born there in 1805. ³⁶

Samuel and Martha eventually moved to Indiana, where according to the 1850 federal census they were residing on a farm in John Q. Adams Township in Warren County. ³⁶ Samuel later died on 13 December 1866 in Warren County, Indiana. ^{19,20} His will, which had been written on 29 August 1866, was submitted for probate in Warren County on 18 December 1866. ⁶⁹ Samuel was buried in the Union Cemetery at Pine Village in Warren County, Indiana. ^{19,20}

Clark Benson, the son of James Benson and Elizabeth Clark, was born in Union County, South Carolina on 11 January 1802. ^{19,20} He was later married in Greene County, Ohio on 11 November 1824 to a woman named Elizabeth Ann Wilson. ³¹ Elizabeth, who was a native of Ohio, was born there in 1806. ^{19,20}

Clark and Elizabeth Benson eventually moved to Warren County, Indiana, where they purchased 80 acres of land on 4 October 1830 from a man named Samuel B. Clark for \$ 200. Three months later, on 2 December 1830, they acquired an additional 80 acres of land there from the U. S. General Land Office. Clark Benson died in Warren County, Indiana on 22 February 1857, while Elizabeth died there on 22 July 1872. Slave Clark's will, which had been written on 8 July 1854, was submitted for probate on 2 March 1857. Both Clark and Elizabeth were buried in the Union Cemetery at Pine Village in Warren County, Indiana.

The three children listed below as (male) or (female) were abstracted from the 1830 federal census of Greene County, Ohio. ⁹ This census shows males 10001 and females 2001. ⁹ Because the two (female) children do not show up on the 1840 census of Warren County, Indiana, they probably died young. ⁶⁰

29. Hester Ann Benson.

Hester Benson, the daughter of James Benson and Elizabeth Clark, was born in Union County, South Carolina 8 April 1804. ^{19,20} She was later married to a man named Thomas Dunn at Xenia in Greene County, Ohio on 19 March 1829. ¹⁷ Thomas, who was a native of Virginia, was calculated from his age at the time of his death to have been born on 14 March 1806. ⁸⁴

Although Hester and Thomas remained in Greene County for several years after their marriage, by 1840, however, they had moved to Warren County, Indiana. ⁶⁰ Hester died in Warren County on 27 June 1844. ^{19,20} She was subsequently buried in the Union Cemetery at Pine Village in Warren County, Indiana. ^{19,20}

After Hester passed away, Thomas married in Warren County, Indiana for a second time to a woman named Cynthia Berry on 1 May 1845. ⁷⁰ Shortly thereafter, Thomas and Cynthia moved to Wisconsin, where they are shown on both the 1850 and 1860 federal censuses residing on a farm at Monroe in Green County. ^{30,85} In addition to five of the children Thomas had from his first marriage to Hester, seven younger children from his second marriage to Cynthia were also listed. These were: Isaac M., Hester A., and Martin L., Sylvester S., Franklin B., Margaret M., and Baldwin S. Dunn ^{30,85}

Sometime prior to 1870, however, Thomas and Cynthia had moved to Iowa where they were found residing on a farm at Van Meter in Dallas County, Iowa. Thomas died at Van Meter in Dallas County, Iowa on 17 February 1885, and was subsequently buried in the Thornton Cemetery at Van Meter, Iowa. 84

30. John Benson.

John Benson, the youngest son of James Benson and Elizabeth Clark, was born in Greene County, Ohio on 6 February 1809. ^{27,33} John was apparently married twice during his life. He married first on 21 November 1828 to a woman named Jane Hunt in Randolph County, Indiana. ³⁴ Jane, who was a native of South Carolina, had been born there on 7 November 1804. ^{21,27,48} She is strongly believed to be the daughter of Abraham Hunt and Sarah Chamness. ^{21,96}

Although John and Jane resided in Sugar Creek Township in Greene County, Ohio for several years after their marriage, by 1840 they had moved to Randolph County, Indiana. ^{9,97} According to the records of the Cherry Grove Monthly Meeting of Friends in Randolph County, Abraham and Clark, minor children of John Benson, were received into membership there on 17 July 1837. ²¹ Jane died in Randolph County, Indiana on 4 July 1851. ²⁷

After his first wife passed away, John married on 21 December 1854 for a second time, also in Randolph County, Indiana, to a woman named to Gulielma Hough. ³³ Gulielma, who had been born in Wayne County, Indiana on 28 July 1825, was the daughter of Jonathan Hough and Gulielma Hutchens. ^{98,99}

In about 1864, John and his family moved to Wayne County, Indiana, where they settled on a farm in New Garden Township. ³³ John subsequently died in Wayne County, Indiana on 9 August 1879. ^{27,33} John Benson and his first wife, Jane, were both buried in the Quaker Lynn Cemetery at Lynn in Randolph County, Indiana. ²⁷

After John passed away, his widow, Gulielma, and two of the children she had with John, moved to Kansas, where they were found on the 1910 federal census residing at Kansas City in Wyandotte County. Gulielma later died at Kansas City in Wyandotte, County, Kansas on 21 February 1912. She was buried, along with her two eldest children, in the Oak Grove Cemetery at Kansas City in Wyandotte County, Kansas.
