INTRODUCTION

The information presented in this genealogy begins in Generation One with the author's fifteenth generation grandparents and comes down in time an additional seven generations to where the author's direct-line ancestor ties into the Bernard / Barnett family. Even though the Bernard family can be traced back in time at least another six generations beyond what is covered in this genealogy, information pertaining to those generations is more reflective of old English history and beyond the scope of what I am trying to accomplish. My primary goal is to trace families from the Old World to the New World, with more emphasis given to these families after they have settled in America.

DATES

For the most part, many conflicting dates were easily straightened out by simply rechecking the source material or official records. In some cases, however, marriage dates may vary from other published works because the researcher used the date of a marriage bond, or the date a marriage license was issued, instead of the actual marriage date. Even though some of the source material I used did not specify the origin of the marriage date given, I have tried to differentiate the marriage dates as accurately as possible. In a number of cases an approximate date of marriage, using the abbreviation "ca." for circa (about), is shown based upon information provided in various census documents.

Another dating problem involves the recording of marriage banns. A couple's intentions to marry, or banns of marriage, were generally proclaimed in church on three consecutive Sundays, and if no legal impediments precluded the couple from being married, their marriage would be sanctioned after the third proclamation. Unfortunately, the first or second proclamation will often be cited as the marriage date instead of the third. I must admit, however, that this is difficult to avoid in some cases because of missing or damaged records.

Death dates may also vary in that the date of burial, or the date a will was written or submitted for probate, will sometimes be cited by others instead of the actual death date. In those cases where I was unable to verify which of two dates was correct, I generally went with the one that referenced the most credible source material, or simply used the year only.

One of the most common dating conflicts involves the use of the Julian Calendar versus the Gregorian Calendar. On 14 September 1752, the Gregorian Calendar was adopted in both Great Britain and its colonies in North America, and the first day of the year then became January 1. Prior to that date, the Julian Calendar was in effect and the first day of the year was March 25. As a consequence, many dates found in the 1600's and first half of the 1700's for the months of January, February, and March reflect, or should reflect, a double date, such as 15 February 1735/1736. Even though both dates may be perfectly acceptable based upon the calendar that was in use at the time, to be consistent with current dating procedures the second date is most accurate.

LOCATIONS

With respect to the location at which an event took place, there were many cases when it was not possible to find any record giving the exact location that a birth, marriage or death took place. Because I feel quite strongly that dates should always be accompanied by places, if for no other reason than to aid future research, I made a number of assumptions regarding location based upon available information. For instance, if a family is found in the Fayette County, Indiana census records for 1840 and 1850, and they also show up in the deed and tax records of that county for the same period, I did not feel that it was unreasonable to assume that any children they had during this period were probably also born in Fayette County. In some cases, however, my comfort level with assuming a possible location was limited to a state only.

John Bernard, the eldest son of John Bernard and Margaret Daundelyn, is believed to have been born in about 1490 at Abington in Northamptonshire, England. ^{1,3} He was later married in Northamptonshire, England on 16 January 1508/1509 (23rd year of the reign of Henry VII) to a woman named Cicely Muscote. ^{1,2} Cicely, who had been born at Earl's Barton in Northamptonshire, England, was the daughter of John Muscote and Alice Beaufew. ^{1,4}

John's father died in Northamptonshire, England on 28 August 1509, and young John became the next Squire of Abington. ²

John Bernard died on 4 February 1549 in Northamptonshire, England, while his wife, Cicely, died there on 21 September 1557. ^{1,3} Both were subsequently buried in the Abington Church cemetery in Northamptonshire, England. ^{1,3} The exact order of birth of the below listed children is not known.

Francis Bernard, the son of John Bernard and Cicely Muscote, was born in about 1526 at Abington in Northamptonshire, England. ^{3,4,5} He was later married to a woman named Alice Haselwood. ^{1,3,5} Alice, who is believed to have been born in about 1530 at Maidwell in Northamptonshire, England, was the daughter of John Haselwood and Katherine Marmion. ³ She was also the sister of the Mary Haselwood who married Francis Bernard's brother, John. ¹

Francis and Alice were the parents of fourteen children, two of whom apparently died in infancy. ¹ Francis Bernard subsequently died on 21 October 1602 at Abington in Northamptonshire, England. ^{3,5} Alice, on the other hand, survived Francis by about ten years and died there in 1612. ⁵

John Bernard, the son of Francis Bernard and Alice Haselwood, was born at Abington in Northamptonshire, England. ^{1,4} He was later married in England to a woman named Dorothy Cave. ^{1,6} Dorothy was the daughter of Francis Cave of Baggrave in Leicestershire, England. ¹

John was already deceased when his father, Francis, died on 21 October 1602. ¹ There are no known issue from John's marriage to Dorothy Cave. ¹ After John passed away, Dorothy married for a second time to a man named Richard Neale. ¹

Catherine Bernard, the daughter of Francis Bernard and Alice Haselwood, was born at Abington in Northamptonshire, England. ^{1,4} She was later married in England to a man named Ambrose Agard of Broughton in Northamptonshire. ^{1,3}

She married first to a man named John D'Oyly, Esquire, of Merton in Oxfordshire, England. ^{1,3,7} John was the son of Robert D'Oyly (also written D'Oyley) and Elizabeth Cheney. ¹⁰

John D'Oyly, who had served as both High Sheriff and as a Justice of the Peace in Oxfordshire, died at Merton on 17 June 1593. ^{1,7} He was subsequently buried in the Merton Church, where a monument was erected on his behalf by his widow, Anne. ^{1,7}

After John passed away, Anne married for a second time to Sir James Harrington of Riddington in Rutlandshire.^{1,3} After James passed away, Anne married for a third time to a man named Henry Pode of Wiltshire, England.^{1,3} No issue are known from Anne's second and third marriages.

After Alice passed away, Baldwin married secondly to a woman named Eleanor Fullwood.¹ Eleanor was the daughter of John Fullwood and Katherine Dabridgecourt of Ford Hall in Warwickshire, England.¹ Baldwin died in 1610 in Northamptonshire, England.¹ Sometime after Baldwin passed away, Eleanor married for a second time to a man named Edmund Hampden, the son of Griffith Hampden.¹ Eleanor subsequently died in Northamptonshire in 1634.¹

Elizabeth Bernard, the daughter of Francis Bernard and Alice Haselwood, was born at Abington in Northamptonshire, England. ^{1,4} Elizabeth was apparently married twice during her life. She married first to a man named Thomas Harrison of Gobion's Manor in Northamptonshire. ^{1,3,4} Thomas, who had been born in 1568 in Northamptonshire, England was the son of Robert Harrison and Elizabeth Fitz Geoffrey of Stow in Northamptonshire. ^{4,15} Thomas subsequently died in 1625 in Northamptonshire. ¹⁵

After Thomas passed away, Elizabeth married secondly to a man named Henry Favell of Coventry in Warwickshire, England. ^{1,3} No issue are known from Elizabeth's second marriage to Henry Favell.

After his first wife passed away, Francis married for a second time to a woman named Mary Woolhouse.^{3,5} Mary was the daughter of Anthony Woolhouse and Millicent Strelley of Glasswell in Derbyshire, England.^{3,5} Francis died at Kingsthorpe in Northamptonshire, England on 21 November 1630.^{3,5}

Richard Bernard, believed to be the youngest of fourteen children born to Francis Bernard and Alice Haselwood, was born at Abington in Northamptonshire, England. ¹ Richard appears to have been married twice during his life. He married first to a woman named Alice Chibnall on 24 October 1601 at Astwood in Buckinghamshire, England. ^{1,3,5} Alice was the daughter of John Chibnall of Astwood. ^{1,5} She apparently died during the month of April 1606 without issue, and was buried on 24 April 1606 at Turvey in Bedfordshire, England. ⁵

After his first wife passed away, Richard married for a second time to a widow named Elizabeth (Woolhouse) Morley of London, England. ^{1,5,9} Elizabeth was the daughter of Anthony Woolhouse and Millicent Strelley, and the widow of Bartholomew Morley. ^{3,5} Richard Bernard died in 1613 at Turvey in Bedfordshire, England shortly after the birth of his fourth child. ^{3,5} His will, which had been written on 20 February 1612/1613, was subsequently probated on 16 June 1613. ^{3,5,17}

Richard was buried 24 April 1613 at Great Doddington in Northamptonshire, England. ⁵ Elizabeth, on the other hand died on 10 March 1622. ^{3,18}

59. Alice Bernard.

Alice Bernard, the daughter of Richard Bernard and his second wife, Elizabeth (Woolhouse) Morley, was born in England. She was subsequently christened at Turvey in Bedfordshire, England on 15 October 1607.¹⁹ Alice was later married in England to a man named Francis Osbaldeston.²⁰

60. Richard Bernard. *

Richard Bernard, the son of Richard Bernard and his second wife, Elizabeth (Woolhouse) Morley, was christened on 12 March 1608/1609 at Turvey in Bedfordshire, England.¹⁹ Richard was apparently married twice during his life. He married his first wife, Dorothy Aleway, in the St. Faith-in-the-Virgin Church in London, England by a marriage license dated 12 December 1632.²¹ Whatever happened to Dorothy has not been determined, however it is known that Richard married for a second time only two years latter.

Richard's second marriage, which had been authorized by a marriage license that was issue on 24 November 1634, was to a woman named Anne Corderoy (also written Cordray).²² The actual wedding took place in St. Andrew-by-the-Wardrobe Church in London, England on the following day, 25 November 1634.²² Anne, who had been christened at Chute in Wiltshire, England on 29 April 1609, was the daughter of William Corderoy (also written Cordray) and Bridget Goddard.^{5,23}

After their marriage, Richard and Anne settled at Petsoe in Buckinghamshire, England, and it is there that all of their children were born. In about 1647, however, Richard and Anne apparently emigrated to America, where they are found renting a tract of land called "Pryor's Plantation" in York County, Virginia from a man named Thomas Harwood on 3 January 1647.²⁴ Richard appears to have died in either late 1650 or early 1651 in Gloucester County, Virginia. This is based primarily upon the fact that Richard's wife, Anne, obtained a grant on 3 April 1651 of 1,000 acres of land in her husband's name for the transporting of various members of the Barnett and Corderoy families into the Colonies.²⁵ This property was located in Northumberland County, Virginia.²⁵

In a later transaction in 1652, Anne, was referred to as being a widow when she actually purchased "Pryor's Plantation" in 1652 from Thomas and Margaret Edwards of London, England.²⁴ Margaret Edwards was a daughter of William Pryor, deceased, who owned the plantation.²⁴ Anne subsequently acquired an additional 700 acres of land at the head of Jones Creek, and another 300 acres abutting upon lands of William Pryor, deceased, on 2 July 1652 in Gloucester County, Virginia.^{25,26} Anne also obtained a grant for 900 acres of land on 26 February 1653/1654.²⁶ However, because the patent was faulty she did not receive clear title to this property until the patent had been renewed on 27 November 1661.

Anne developed the Gloucester County lands into a plantation which she named "Purton," and it was on these lands that the first church in what was to be called Petsoe, or Petsworth Parish was built.²⁷ This parish was said to have been named after the ancestral parish of the Cordray / Corderoy family in England.²⁷ Anne resided at Purton for the remainder of her days, passing away there in 1670.²⁸ Ann's last name was shown in various Virginia records as both Bernard and Barnett.

NOTE: Unfortunately, the exact order of birth of Richard and Anne's children is not known. Richard, who is generally considered the eldest child, was probably born in about 1635. Very close behind him, however, had to be their daughter Anne. She was already married to John Smith by 2 July 1652, when her mother received a land grant for transporting 20 individuals into the Colony. As such, I believe she was probably born sometime during the latter half of 1636. Elizabeth and Corderoy Bernard were next. William, on the other hand, is still problematic and is addressed below.

61. **Mary Bernard.**

Mary Bernard, the daughter of Richard Bernard and his second wife, Elizabeth (Woolhouse) Morley, was born in England. She was subsequently christened at Turvey in Bedfordshire, England on 5 August 1610. ¹⁹ Mary is believed to have died in England prior to 1613. ¹⁷

62. **John Bernard.**

John Bernard, the son of Richard Bernard and his second wife, Elizabeth (Woolhouse) Morley, was born in England. He was subsequently christened at Turvey in Bedfordshire, England on 29 September 1612. ¹⁹ No additional information has been found concerning this individual.

GENERATION FIVE

63. Richard Bernard.

Richard Bernard (also written Barnett), the son of Richard Bernard and his second wife, Anne Corderoy, was probably born in about 1635 at Petsoe in Buckinghamshire, England.^{29,30} As a boy, Richard emigrated to Virginia with his parents, where his father is known to have leased a tract of land called "Pryor's Plantation" in York County from a man named Thomas Harwood on 3 January 1647.^{24,25} When Richard's mother, Anne Bernard, obtained a grant on 2 July 1652 of 1,000 acres of land in her husband's name for the transporting of various members of the Barnett and Corderoy families into the Colonies, Richard's name was listed.²⁵ He was later married in Gloucester County, Virginia to a woman whose name is currently not known. Although a number of researchers claim that Richard may have been married to a woman named Margaret, this has not been verified to my satisfaction.

According to the records of Petsworth Parish in Gloucester County, Virginia, Richard Barnett served as a Vestryman there in 1677.²⁴ Richard subsequently died in Gloucester County, Virginia in 1691, leaving lands that he received from his mother to his eldest son, Philip.^{24,29,30,31} When Philip passed away, these lands were assigned to his younger brother, John, by right of survivorship.²⁴

64. Anne Bernard.

Anne Bernard (also written Barnett), the daughter of Richard Bernard and his second wife, Anne Corderoy, is believed to have been born in about 1636 (based upon her date of marriage) at Petsoe in Buckinghamshire, England. ²⁹ As a young girl, Anne emigrated to Virginia with her parents, where her father is known to have leased a tract of land called “Pryor’s Plantation” in York County on 3 January 1652 from a man named Thomas Harwood. ^{24,25} When Anne’s mother, Anne Bernard, obtained a grant of 1,000 acres of land in her husband’s name on 2 July 1652 for the transporting of various members of the Barnett and Corderoy families into the Colonies, Anne’s name was listed. ²⁹ Anne was apparently already married by this time, however, to a man named John Smith. ²⁹ John, who had been born on 12 September 1624 in Burnley Parish in Lancashire, England, was the son of Christopher Smith and Elizabeth Townley. ³⁵

After their marriage, John and Anne resided on a plantation situated on Little Poropotank Creek in Gloucester County, Virginia. This creek ran into the Poropotank River, a tributary of the York River. John Smith is believed to have died in Gloucester County, Virginia on 17 April 1689. ³⁵ Although Anne is also believed to have died in Gloucester County, her date of death is not known.

65. Elizabeth Bernard.

Elizabeth Bernard (also written Barnett), the daughter of Richard Bernard and his second wife, Anne Corderoy, was born at Petsoe in Buckinghamshire, England. ²⁹ As a young girl, Elizabeth is known to have emigrated to Virginia with her parents. ²⁵ When Elizabeth’s mother, Anne Bernard, obtained a grant on 3 April 1651 of 1,000 acres of land in her husband’s name for the transporting of various members of the Barnett and Corderoy families into the Colonies, Elizabeth’s name was listed. ²⁵ No additional information has been found concerning this individual.

66. **Corderoy Bernard.**

Corderoy Bernard (also written Barnett), the son of Richard Bernard and his second wife, Anne Corderoy, was born at Petsoe in Buckinghamshire, England.²⁹ As a young boy, Corderoy is known to have emigrated to Virginia with her parents.²⁵ When Corderoy's mother, Anne Bernard, obtained a grant on 3 April 1651 of 1,000 acres of land in her husband's name for the transporting of various members of the Barnett and Corderoy families into the Colonies, Corderoy's name was listed.²⁵ No additional information has been found concerning this individual.

67. **William Bernard.** *

NOTE: Unfortunately, there is some conflict as to whether or not this William Bernard is the son of Richard Bernard and Anne Corderoy. I personally have not been able to substantiate a connection between this William Bernard and Richard Bernard and Anne Corderoy to my total satisfaction. However, because of his estimated age, where he resided, and his association with Petsworth Parish, I do not know where else he could belong at this time. I have seen where a few researchers believe that this William may actually be a son of the Richard Bernard who was born in about 1635 in England and died in 1691 in Virginia, thereby making him a grandson of Richard and Anne (Corderoy) Bernard. However, I have not been able to substantiate a connection here either. William's place in the Bernard / Barnett family may change based upon future research.

William Bernard (also written Barnett), providing he is the son of Richard Bernard and his second wife, Anne Corderoy, would have been born at Petsoe in Buckinghamshire, England. He is known for sure to have been married on 20 January 1678 in Christ Church Parish in Middlesex County, Virginia to a woman named Loretta Pannell.³³ Unfortunately, nothing else has been found concerning Loretta, or her family. Although several of William and Loretta's children were born and christened in Middlesex County, Virginia, the family appears to have moved to Gloucester County, Virginia sometime later, as William was serving as a Churchwarden for Petsworth Parish in 1695.³⁷

According to one source, William wrote his will on 27 April 1704 in Gloucester County, Virginia.³² Because I have not been able to find a record of probate, however, it can only be assumed that William died sometime after this date.

William Barnett, the son of William Barnett and Loretta Pannell, was born in Middlesex County, Virginia. He was subsequently christened on 24 October 1680 in Christ Church Parish in Middlesex County.³³ No additional information has been found concerning this individual.

74. Sarah Barnett.

Sarah Barnett, the daughter of William Barnett and Loretta Pannell, was born in Middlesex County, Virginia. She was subsequently christened in Christ Church Parish in Middlesex County on 19 November 1682.³³ No additional information has been found concerning this individual.

75. John Barnett. *

John Barnett, the son of William Barnett and Loretta Pannell, is believed to have been born in about 1684 in Middlesex County, Virginia. This estimated year of birth is based upon the dates of birth of his siblings. John Barnett was later married to a woman named Ann.³³ Unfortunately, neither Ann's maiden name, nor her parentage, have been determined.

John Barnett died on 31 October 1721 in Christ Church Parish in Middlesex County, Virginia, and was subsequently buried there on 2 November 1721.³³ The below listed children were identified through the Christ Church Parish christening records as being John and Ann Barnett's.

76. John Barnett. *

John Barnett, the son of John and Ann Barnett, was born in Middlesex County, Virginia. He was subsequently christened on 3 December 1704 in Christ Church Parish in Middlesex County.³³ John was later married in Christ Church Parish to a woman named Marran Gibbs on 13 November 1728.³³ Marran, who was also a native of Middlesex County, had been christened on 30 January 1708/1709 in Christ Church Parish.³³ She was the daughter of John and Mary Gibbs.³³

Sometime prior to 1733 John and Marran moved into Spotsylvania County, Virginia, where they resided within the boundaries of Saint Mark's Parish. On 3 April 1733, shortly after moving to Spotsylvania County, John purchased 184 acres of land in St. Marks Parish from a man named Richard Maulder.³⁹ John's brother-in-law, Zachariah Gibbs, purchased the adjoining 100 acres from Mr. Maulder on the same day.³⁹ This property was situated in that portion of Spotsylvania County that was later incorporated into Orange County, Virginia in 1734. John Barnett died in 1750 in Orange County, Virginia.³⁸ His last will and testament, which had been written on 1 April 1750, was probated on 24 May 1750 in Orange County, Virginia.³⁸ Although Marran is known to have also died in Virginia, the actual date and place of her death have yet to be determined.

The children listed below were either named in John Barnett's will, or were identified through subsequent probate records when they became of age or married, and various articles inventoried in John Barnett's estate were distributed to them by their mother.

John Barnett, the son of John Barnett and Marran Gibbs, was born in Virginia.³⁸ No additional information has been found concerning this individual.

82. Sarah Barnett.

Sarah Barnett, the daughter of John Barnett and Marran Gibbs, was born in Virginia.³⁸ She was later married in about 1747 in Orange County, Virginia to a man named John Watts.^{25,38} John, who was born in about 1722 in Spotsylvania County, Virginia, was the son of Thomas and Esther Watts.^{25,53} After their marriage, Sarah and John resided on the plantation he inherited from his father in what was then Culpeper County, Virginia.²⁵

Shortly after the conclusion of the Revolutionary War, the majority of Sarah and John's children moved to the newly formed state of Kentucky. During the Fall of 1793, their son-in-law, Jesse Vawter, returned to Virginia to help John and Sarah move to Kentucky.⁴⁰ They later arrived in Madison County, Kentucky on 18 November 1793, and it is there that they resided for the remainder of their lives.^{25,40}

John subsequently died in Madison County, Kentucky on 20 March 1796.⁵³ His will, which had been written on 4 February 1796, was admitted for probate in the Madison County Court on 5 July 1796.⁵⁴ Although Sarah also died in Madison County, the date of her death has not been determined.

With the exception of John Watts, Jr., the other ten children listed below were named in the will of John Watts. John Watts, Jr. was named in the will of his brother, Thomas Watts, which was dated 5 October 1817 and probated on 8 February 1820 in Madison County, Kentucky.⁵⁵ The exact order of birth of John and Sarah's children is not known.

Agatha Barnett, the daughter of John Barnett and Marran Gibbs, was born in Virginia. ³⁸ She was latter married, probably in Culpeper County, Virginia, to a man named Julius Christy. ^{38,41,42} Julius, who was a twin child, is thought to have been born in about 1730 near the mouth of the York River in Gloucester County, Virginia. ⁴² He was the son of Samuel Christy. ^{41,42}

Later, on 15 August 1754, Julius purchased 100 acres of land from a man named Charles Walker. This property, which was located along the Rapidan River, was situated in both Culpeper and Orange Counties. Julius later built a gristmill on this property, which he operated for nearly twenty years. This mill was subsequently destroyed by a Spring flood, however, and even though Julius rebuilt his mill, it was not long afterwards that he and Agatha sold this property and moved with their children to western Virginia. ^{42,64}

In about 1776/1777, Julius and Agatha moved into that part of Botetourt County, Virginia that is now within the borders of Greenbrier County, West Virginia. They apparently stayed there for approximately nine years, during which time Julius served in the Revolutionary War. According to his tombstone he was a Lieutenant Colonel in the Virginia Continental Line during the War. ⁶⁵ In the record of Land Entitlements for Greenbrier County dated 11 January 1780, Julius received title to 400 acres of land for having settled it prior to 1 January 1778. ⁶⁶ Julius Christy was later listed as being one of the Greenbrier residents who signed a petition on 5 December 1780 to raise "twenty tunns of hemp off the tithable persons in this county for the purpose of making a market road from this place to Richmond." ⁶⁷

Several years later, in about 1785/1786, Julius and his family moved further west into the

state of Kentucky, where they settled in Clark County. Julius died in 1808 in Clark County, Kentucky. His will, which had been written on 5 December 1805, was later probated on 25 July 1808 before the Clark County Court.⁶⁸ Although Julius Christy's actual place of burial is unknown, a U. S. Veterans Tombstone has been erected for his Revolutionary War service in the Christy Graveyard at Winchester in Clark County, Kentucky.⁶⁵ Although Agatha also passed away in Kentucky, the date of her death has not been determined.

With the exception of Mildred Christy, all of the below listed children, including the married names of daughters, were mentioned in Julius Christy's will.

NOTE: The James Barnett who is covered in the Sebree genealogy is not the James Barnett who was the son of John Barnett and Marran Gibbs. That James Barnett was married to a woman named Sarah. Our James was married to Mildred "Milly" Neville, daughter of George Neville and Mary Gibbs.

James Barnett, the son of John Barnett and Marran Gibbs, was born in 1735 in Orange County, Virginia. ³⁸ He was later married in Virginia to a woman named Mildred "Milly" Neville. ^{43,44} Mildred was the daughter of George Neville and Mary Gibbs. ^{43,44,89}

Sometime after their marriage, James and Mildred moved to Frederick County, Virginia, where they resided for the remainder of their lives. James died in Frederick County in 1782. ⁴⁵ His will, which had been written on 7 September 1781, was probated in Frederick County on 4 June 1782. ⁴⁵ Mildred was later found on the 1810 census of Frederick County residing at Pughtown near her son, Ambrose. ⁹¹ Mildred appears to have died in Frederick County, Virginia in either late 1813 or very early 1814. ⁹⁰ Her will, which had been written on 6 April 1813, was probated on 31 January 1814. ⁹⁰ The below listed children were named in James Barnett's will.

85. Ambrose Barnett.

Ambrose Barnett, the son of John Barnett and Marran Gibbs, was born in Orange County, Virginia. ³⁸ He was later married by a bond dated 18 July 1766 in Fauquier County, Virginia to a woman named Judith Neville. ^{25,43,46,47} Judith, who had been born in about 1740 in Virginia, was the daughter of George Neville and Mary Gibbs. ⁴⁷

Ambrose Barnett appears to have died in 1808 in Fauquier County, Virginia. ^{47,94} Although Ambrose does not appear to have left a will, an inventory of his estate was entered into the records of the Fauquier County Court on 26 July 1808. ⁹⁴ A division of his estate, however, did not take place until 10 April 1810, and his farmlands were not divided up between his heirs until 28 January 1811. ⁹⁴ Judith died in Fauquier County, Virginia in 1811. ⁴⁷ Ambrose and his wife, Judith, were both buried in the Barnett Cemetery at Auburn in Fauquier County. ⁴⁷

86. **Anne Barnett.**

Anne Barnett, the daughter of John Barnett and Marran Gibbs, was born in Orange County, Virginia on 30 November 1740. ^{38,48,49} Anne was married twice during her life. She married first to a man named William Johnson on 10 February 1770 in Orange County. ⁵⁰ William apparently died shortly after their marriage, however. Even though no issue have been found, there is a possibility that Anne had a son from her first marriage to William. Although five male children have been identified from Anne's second marriage, the 1790 census of South Carolina indicates there may have been six male children in the household, three of whom being over sixteen years of age. ⁹⁵

After her first husband passed away, Anne married for a second time, also in Orange County, Virginia, to a man named James Gibbs on 8 July 1771. ^{48,49,50,51} James, who was the son of John Gibbs and Suzanne Phillippe, was also Anne's first cousin. ⁴⁸ Shortly after their marriage, James and Anne moved into that portion of the Ninety-Six District of South Carolina that was later formed into Union County, South Carolina in 1798. James had received a land grant of 640 acres on Fairforest Creek in South Carolina in 1772. ⁴⁸ James later served in the South Carolina Militia during the Revolutionary War. ⁴⁸

James Gibbs died in Ninety-Six District, South Carolina on 7 August 1794. ^{48,49} Although he left a will which was dated 8 August 1793, no date of probate has been determined. ⁴⁹ Anne, on the other hand, survived James by nearly thirty-seven years. She died in what had become Union County, South Carolina on 23 March 1831. ^{48,49} Both James and Anne were subsequently buried in the Gibbs family cemetery in Union County. ⁴⁸

Frances Barnett, the daughter of John Barnett and Marran Gibbs, was born in Orange County, Virginia on 3 February 1741.^{38,52} Frances was later married in Virginia to a man named Henry White.^{48,52} Henry, who had been born on 6 May 1740 in Orange County, Virginia, was the son of Joseph White and Elizabeth Russell.⁵²

Although Frances and Henry appear to have resided in Orange County, Virginia for a short time after their marriage, they eventually moved to South Carolina, where they settled in that portion of Old Ninety-Six District that was later formed into Spartanburg County in 1785. During the Revolutionary War, Henry served first as a Lieutenant in the Fifth South Carolina Infantry.⁹⁸ He later served as a Lt. Colonel in the South Carolina Militia.⁹⁸

Frances died in Spartanburg County, South Carolina on 15 May 1784.⁵² Shortly after Frances passed away, Henry married for a second time to a woman named Ann Mitchell, and from this second marriage had a son named Henry.⁵² Henry subsequently died on 30 September 1787 in Spartanburg County, just a couple of years later.⁵²
