Quicker in the State of New York  
who was a private in the Company commanded  
by Captain Moleott of the 25th. commanded  
by Col. Simon in the 2nd Regt. 7 mo.

Recorded on the Roll of New York  
at the rate of 23 Dollars 33 Cents per annum  
commence on the 1st day of March, 1831.

Oreida County Simeon Fuller of Newton in  
Said County aged 70 years being duly sworn does  
depone and say that Sgt Fuller of Floyd in  
Said County is a brother of this deponent, and  
that he knows of the said Sgt Fuller serving  
as a soldier in the Militia during the Revolutionary  
War as follows - viz: That in the year 1776 in  
the months of Sept and October he was out 2  
Months at and about N. York in Capt Saml Wolcotts  
Co - Col Simons Regt - In 1777 in May he  
was out in Capt Demmons Co about one month -  
In June he entered Capt Wolcotts Co and  
went to Saratoga & was gone about two months.  
In fall of same year he was out again with  
Capt Wolcott at taking Burgoyne, about  
one month - In 1778 in July he was  
out again in Capt Demmons Co. One  
Month - Making seven months service  
in the whole or about that time. -

And further this deponent says not.

STATE OF NEW YORK,  
Oneida County,

On this 11th day of Sept 1832 personally appeared in open court  
now sitting, Lot Fuller in the court of Justice of the Peace Oneida Co  
state, aged seventy years, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on  
his oath make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress, passed June 7, 1832.

That he entered the service of the United States under the following named officers, and served as herein stated: That he  
was born at Bolton Conn 6 May 1760. As early as his age he has been informed that  
he lived at Sandisfield Berkshire Co. Mass. when he entered service in the Continental Army  
at Fort Ann. N.Y. Floyd & Oneida Co. Nov. 1776. That he volunteered in Sept  
1776 in Capt Samuel Wolcotts Company Col Demings Regt and went  
to White Plains and served in the Militia 1770 months. Volunteered in  
1777 in May under Capt Demmon and served at Saratoga One  
Month. In June 1777 volunteered in Capt Wolcotts Comp. Col  
Ashley Regt. Gen Yelloms Brigade - before taking Burgoyne,  
and served 1770 months. In September 1777 again volunteered in  
Capt Wolcotts Coy. Col Ashley Regt and served One Month  
and was at taking Burgoyne. Gen Schuyler had command part of  
the time and Gen Gates the residue. In July 1778 went to Albany under  
Capt Demmon as a guard One Month. In the whole of the war served  
20 annes of service to the reputation and honor of the United States.

He hereby relinquishes every claim whatever to a pension or annuity except the present, and declares that his name is not  
on the pension roll of the agency of any state. - Has no other witnesses that he is a Revolutionary Soldier.  
Sworn to and subscribed the day and year aforesaid.

We reading and and hereby certify that we are well acquainted with  
we believe him to be who has subscribed and sworn to the above declaration: that  
neighborhood where he resides, to have been a Soldier of the Revolution, and that we concur in this opinion.  
Sworn and subscribed the day and year aforesaid.

And the said court do hereby declare their opinion, after the investigation of the matter, and after putting the interrogato-  
ries prescribed by the War Department, that the above named applicant was a Revolutionary Soldier and served as he states :  
And the court further certifies, that it appears to them that Augustus Noble Farmer who has  
signed the preceding certificate, is a resident in Floyd in Said County and that  
James Fairchild Farmer who has also signed the same, is a resident in  
Said County and is a credible person, and that their statement is entitled to credit.

From distance of witnesses from County it would occasion  
too much expense to require personal attendance.

George Brown Clerk of the Court of Common Pleas of Oneida Co.  
do hereby certify that the foregoing contains the original proceedings of the said court in the matter of the application of  
Lot Fuller for a pension.

And I further certify that Salmon Bolton was a Justice of the Peace  
and Benjamin P Johnson a Deacon in the Church of the Free Will  
Baptists in the town of Oneida and that the above named witnesses

Dear Madam:

Reference is made to your letter in which you request the Revolutionary War record of Lot Fuller of Floyd, Oneida County, New York.

The data which follow were obtained from papers on file in pension claim, S.13109, based upon service of Lot Fuller in the Revolutionary War.

Lot Fuller was born May 6, 1760, in Bolton, Connecticut. Names of his parents are not shown.

While residing in Sandisfield, Berkshire County, Massachusetts, Lot Fuller volunteered and served September and October 1776, as private in Captain Samuel Walcott's company, Colonel Simon's Massachusetts regiment; volunteered in May, 1777, served one month as private in Captain Deming's Massachusetts company; volunteered in June, 1777, served two months as private in Captain Samuel Walcott's company, Colonel Ashley's Massachusetts regiment; volunteered in September 1777, served one month in Captain Samuel Deming's Massachusetts regiment and was at the taking of Burgoyne; volunteered in July 1778, served one month as guard in Captain Deming's Massachusetts company.

After the Revolution Lot Fuller resided at Fort Ann, New York. He was allowed pension on his application executed September 11, 1832, at which time he was residing in Floyd, Oneida County, New York.

No reference was made to wife or children.

Soldier's brother, Simeon Fuller, was aged seventy years in 1832, and a resident of Steuben, Oneida County, New York.

No further family data are shown.

In order to obtain the date of last payment of pension, the name and address of person paid and possibly the date of death of Lot Fuller, you should address the Comptroller General, General Accounting Office, Records Division, this city, and cite the following data:
