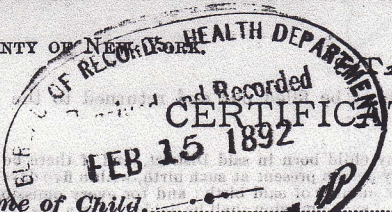

NO MUTILATED CERTIFICATE WILL BE RECEIVED.

Within TEN DAYS from the time of a BIRTH, this form of Report must be filled out and returned to the Division of VITAL STATISTICS, 301 Mott Street, New York City.

From § 13, Chap. 74, Session Laws, 1866.—“It shall be the duty of the parents of any child born in said District, (and if there be no parent alive that has made such a report, then of the next of kin of such child born,) and of every person present at such birth, within five days after such birth or death, to report to said Board in writing, so far as known, the Date, Ward, and Street number of said birth; and for every omission to report a written copy of the same to said Board within ten days after any birth, any person guilty of such omission shall be liable to pay a fine of ten dollars, which may be sued for and recovered in the name of the Board.”

N. B.—This Law is designed to secure a faithful report of Birth from the Attending Physician, or some one of the persons who was present at the birth. This law will be rigidly enforced, both as regards the Medical Attendant and the Parents of the Child.

The Law requires that the Certificate of a Birth shall be returned and registered in the town, village or city where it occurs, within three days after the event.  
 If the "given" name is not then reported, it should be certified as soon as the child receives its full name. The proper forms (blanks) for attesting and returning the delayed "given" name, can be obtained as directed below.




