DECLARATION OF A WIDOW FOR PENSION.

To be executed before Judge or Clerk of Court.

On this 29<sup>th</sup> day of June, A. D. eighteen hundred and seventy three  
personally appeared before me, R. S. Waldron, Clerk, of the  
Circuit Court, a Court of Record in and for the County and State aforesaid, Ann  
Waldron, aged Ninety years, a resident of  
Columbia County of Columbia, State  
of Florida, who, being duly sworn according to law, declares that she is  
the widow of Oliver Waldron, who served the full period of sixty  
days in the (1) Military service of the United States in the War of 1812, and who was the identical  
Oliver Waldron who (2) was drafted in Captain  
Lewis Mans Company, .....  
Regiment, ..... Brigade, ..... Division, at  
....., on the ..... day of  
181 , and was honorably discharged at Bryant Co. G. No. 4 on the .....  
day of ....., 181 ; that (3) .....

that she was married under the name of Ann Sylvester to said  
Oliver Waldron, on the ..... day of .....  
....., A. D. 1846, by Godley Smith, at  
Bryant County Georgia, there being no legal barrier to such marriage; that her  
said husband died at Savannah Shoals, on the 5<sup>th</sup> day of  
day of November, 1867, and that she has not remarried since his death; that  
at no time during the late rebellion against the authority of the United States did she or her said husband adhere  
to the cause of the enemies of the Government, giving them aid or comfort, or exercised the functions of any office  
whatever under any authority, or pretended authority, in hostility to the United States; that she will support the  
Constitution of the United States; that she is not in receipt of a pension under any previous act; that she makes  
this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension rolls of the United States, under the provisions of the  
act approved February 14, 1871, and hereby constitutes and appoints, with full power of substitution and revoca-  
tion, James C. Waldron of Columbia County Fla  
her true and lawful attorney, to prosecute her claim, and obtain the pension certificate that may be issued; that  
her post office is at Savannah Shoals, County of Columbia  
State of Florida; that her domicile or place of abode is at J. C.  
Waldrons
