Age, disability, or dependence have no bearing upon the rights of applicants.

The soldier must have been honorably discharged.

The Act of July 27, 1892, requires a service of thirty days in one of the following Indian wars; Black Hawk, Creek, Cherokee, or Florida war with the Seminole Indians, between 1832 and 1842, inclusive. The applicant must be a citizen of the United States.

The Act of June 27, 1902, requires a service of thirty days in one of the following Indian wars; Florida and Georgia Seminole, 1817-1818; Fevre River, of Illinois, 1827; Sac and Fox, 1831; Sabine disturbances, 1836-1837; Cayuse, 1847-1848; on the Pacific Coast; Florida wars with Seminoles, 1842-1858; Texas and New Mexico, 1849-1856; California disturbances, 1851-1852; Utah disturbances, 1850-1853; and the Oregon and Washington territory wars, 1851-1856. Where there is no record of enlistment or muster into the service of the United States in any of the wars mentioned, the record of pay by the United States shall be accepted as full and satisfactory proof of such enlistment and service.
