MR. MICHAEL LANE.

The funeral obsequies of the late Mr. Michael Lane, Shelbourne Gardens, Thomondgate, took place on Saturday, March 27th, from St. Munchin's Church. The remains were interred in the family burial place at Gillogue. The cortege was of huge dimensions and was representative of the business and public life of Limerick:
