MASS. REVOLUTIONARY ROLLS.

Isaac Lewis of Westfield, appears on list of men raised for six months' service returned by Brig. Gen. Patterson having passed muster in return dated Camp Totoway, Oct. 25, 1780.

Isaac Lewis, private, Capt. Webber's co. Col. Fellows' Regt., dated Dorchester, Oct. 7, 1775. Belonged to Ashfield. Reported went to Quebec. On roll of same co. dated Aug. 1, 1775, enlisted Apr. 27, 1775, service 3 mos. 11 days. Belonged Ashfield.

Isaac Lewis, private, Capt. Ephraim Jenning's co., Col. David Wells Regt.: enlisted Sept. 22, 1777, discharged Oct. 18, 1777, 31 days, also expedition to Northward in Lt. Ephraim Jenning's co., Col. David Field's Regt. (Hampshire co. Regt.), enlisted Aug. 17, 1777, discharged Aug. 21, 1777, 5 days: roll dated Ashfield.

Isaac Lewis, private, Capt. Nathaniel Heath's co. (serving as Guards at Boston under Gen. Gates) enlisted Feb. 13, 1779, discharged May 12, 1779, 3 months.

Isaac Lewis, on descriptive list of men raised to reinforce Continental Army by resolve of June 5, 1780, for 6 months: age 25 years, 5 ft. 11 in., complexion ruddy, residence Ashfield, arrived at Springfield July 21, 1780, 23d division, under command of Capt. Isaac Pope.

Isaac Lewis, private, Col. Benj. Tupper's (10th) Regt., enlisted July 1, 1782, 6 months.

Isaac Lewis, private, Capt. Abijah Savage's co., Col. Henry Sherburne's Regt., dated Rhode Island Aug. 21, 1778.

MADISON, Feb'y 4.—The funeral of Judson S. Lewis, who died here on Tuesday Jan'y 31, 1899, was held yesterday afternoon from the Methodist church. Mr. Lewis was one of the oldest and best known residents of Madison county. He was born here December 1st, 1813, and always lived here. He was a direct descendant from Governor Bradford, who came over in the Mayflower, and also of Roger Sherman, one of the Signers of the Declaration of Independence. His father, Judson W. Lewis (92 v p 69 Vol. IX) one of the pioneers of the county, came to Madison from Stratford, Conn., in 1795, bought a tract of land and located on it.

Mr. Hathorne and Mr. Noyes replied. It was the Judgment of all that were present. they were Bewitched, and only she the Accused Person said, they were Distracted.

On Wednesday the 23d of March, I

went to Thomas Putnam's. on purpose to see his Wife.---

The first of April Mercy Lewis, Thomas Putnam's Maid, in her Fit: said, they did eat Red Bread, like Man's Flesh, and would have had her eat some but she would not: but turned away her head, and spit at them, and said, I will not Eat. I will not Drink, it is Blood, etc. She said, That is not the Bread of Life, that is not the Water of Life. Christ gives the Bread of Life, I will have none of it. Richard, Earl of Bellomont, appointed to succeed Col. Benjamin Fletcher as governor of the province of New York, removed several members of the Governor's Council, including Col. Nicholas Bayard. Sept. 28, 1698, and among the new men appointed was Samuel Staats, Frederick Philipse (v. p. 27, Vol. VII, p. 13, Vol. VIII) resigned his seat next day. The Earl drew up tenseseparate reasons for Mr. Bayard's removal, one being: "3d, That he connived at Fletcher's granting commissions to pirates manned here for the Red Sea; procured protections from the governor, and received a reward; advised to a piratical ship's being admitted into port with her spoils, and connived at Fletcher's receipt of presents from pirates."

Col. Bayard gave a written answer from New Jersey, October 17, 1698. Accounting for the third charge. He says that several years previous he

had by letter to Gov. Fletcher, then at Philadelphia, requested his favor in behalf of one Thomas Lewis (6 who had been abroad in a privateer, some of the crew of which had killed the master: and of one Barent Rynderson (v. p. 28. Vol. VII. p. 158) a comrade of Lewis: that the letter was written at the request of their neighbors Leenders Lewis (Leonard 4) and Samuel Staats, the former a brother to Thomas Lewis and the other brother-in-law to Barent Rhynderson and one of his lordship's new counsellors, and very solicitous to procure Gov. Fletcher's license for the return of their relations, and their settlement in New York. That the governor granted the favor desired and inclosed the licenses to him, which he delivered to Leenders Lewis and Samuel Staats, who, unrequested, offered him a bag of 100 pieces of Eight for the governor, and 18 or 20 ducats for himself, both of which he refused to accept until he was importuned to gratify their desire of testifying their acknowledgment of the great favor they had received: and for the confirmation of this narration he urges the examination of the four persons named, all of them in town. He adds that the licenses were upon condition of continuing in the province and being of good behaviour, and at the time were commonly called 'protections.'
