

DIED.

At Panacca City, Lincoln County, Nevada, April 19th, 1871, WILLIAM MULLINS, born at Waleswood, Derbyshire, England, June 7th 1824.

He died of consumption of seven years standing; was baptized into the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, Feb. 18, 1849, in the Sheffield (England) Conference; emigrated to the United States, May 19, 1856, and arrived in Salt Lake City, September 1st, 1861, when he went south to Toquerville, Kane County, and assisted in building up that place. In 1869, by the counsel of Elder E. Snow, he came to Panacca to try if a change of climate would prove beneficial to his health. He died in full faith of the Gospel, and leaves a wife and four children to mourn his loss.

Deceased was born near the city of Toronto, Upper Canada, where he embraced the gospel in the year 1836. In 1837 he moved to Kirtland, Ohio, and in 1838, he moved with the Saints from there to Far West, Missouri. He then went to Quincy, Illinois, where he married the daughter of Stephen and Mary Ann Hales. He went to Nauvoo, where he resided until the expulsion of the Saints from the State. He then, with his family, started for the Rocky Mountains, stopping by the way to recruit, at Garden Grove. He reached Salt Lake Valley in the year 1851, since which time he has been a resident of Bountiful until his decease. He has ever been true and faithful in the church and was patient during his afflictions. He leaves a wife, twelve children, twelve grand children, and many relatives and friends to mourn his loss —[COM.]
