Julia ("Judy") Ann, being sister of Elizabeth CARPENTER, K-2-1-1-2-4, p.403 who m. Milton Kinslow (Kincheloe), K-2-1-2-1, p.399, as "Ambrose, Jr." joined wife, Julia Ann, as "late Julia Ann CARPENTER" in a deed Oct. 1835 conveying land in Barren Co., Ky. inherited by her from her father, said Andrew Carpenter, deceased. Ambrose, Jr. m. 2nd in Barren Co., Ky. 1859 Sarah Ann BUTTONS. 349, 426(8, 17), 455(b), 574(482)(d), (492)(e).

Mary Kinslow (Kincheloe), p.399, K-2-1-1-1-7, 2nd. paragraph above, is probably the "Mary Kinslow" who is so recorded on the membership roll of old Peters Creek Baptist Church, p.398, as the 37th. member of 105 additions to its membership within the first 10 years of its operation after organization in 1830, her marriage in 1835, without change of her maiden surname, was within this 10 years period and leaves uncertain whether she became a member before or after marriage. Dec. 31, 1863, near Glasgow, Ky., Feb. 29, 1864, near Irvine, Estill Co., Ky., Apr. 30, 1864, Lexington, Ky. Aug. 31, 1864, Mt. Sterling, Montgomery Co., Ky., Aug. 31, 1864, was honorably discharged Dec. 29, 1864, Descendants remember his expressed affection for his nephew, Page C., his comrade in arms and associate and his desire to have a grandchild named in his honor. William m. Sumner Co., Tenn. Dec. 3, 1850 Mary Frances HAYNER (Haines?), b. Allen Co., Ky. 1832, d. Scottsville, Allen Co., Ky. Aug. 26, 1913 (1916?) and is buried in Sikes' Cemetery. William became a minister of the gospel and served Allen Co., Ky. churches as pastor over a long lifetime. He and wife were members of the Missionary Baptist Church, early housed in building made of logs, on Walnut Creek, Allen Co., Ky. 5 miles east of Scottsville. Rev. William d. Allen Co., Ky. Aug. 1, 1906 and is buried in Friendship Cemetery, Allen Co., Ky. Ch. (b. Peters Creek, Barren Co., Ky.) 1- Susan, Nov. 21st, d. 24th 1851, 2- John C. M., July 24, 1853, d. ,1820, apparently relating to "10 legatees of Nimrod Kinslow, deceased", which did not name the legatees, imply Nimrod had d. leaving a will, although searches for such will or record thereof in Barren Co., Ky. public records have been fruitless.

In a legal proceeding filed in Barren Co., Ky. June 17, 1829 by Nimrod's sister, Elizabeth Kinslow (Kincheloe), K-2-1-1-2 to "quiet" or perfect the title to lands of the estate of their parents, Conrad and Rachel Kinslow (Kincheloe), K-2-1-1, pp. 396-398 as to their heirs who had not conveyed their interest by the deed signed by other brothers and wives in 1822, that she might close the estate of her deceased husband, Andrew CARPENTER, K-2-1-1-2, pp. 398 and 403. Elizabeth's proceeding read in the name of: "Elizabeth Carpenter versus Kinslow Heirs". In this proceeding Elizabeth recited that she was daughter of Conrad Kinslow (Kincheloe) and she had married Andrew CARPENTER, who became the purchaser of Conrad's estate lands in the deed of 1822. In this proceeding made parties of Nimrod's "heirs", and of the husbands of Nimrod's 2 daughters, then married, listing 7 "children" then surviving, of "10 legatees". There may not have been 10 children or 9 children and a widow, mentioned in the will, the word "legatee" implying a will had been signed by Nimrod. This being all the information available for reconstructing Nimrod's large family. The name of his wife has not been learned. Ch. (b. Barren Co., Ky.) 1-Ambrose,

Nimrod may have been dead by Mar. 25, 1815 when papers in connection with his "heirs" were first filed in Barren Co. court. 339(a)(1), 426(15, 17), 574(492, 509)(a, b).

These 3 sons joined their wives, as Adam

(m. before 1820) and Aaron and Jane, (m. Dec. 28,

1814) with 3 other brothers, Reuben, then widower,

Ezekiel and wife, Elizabeth, and Andrew C., unm

in signing deed May 20, 1822 as "part of the

heirs and distributees of Conrad Kinslow, deceased"

conveying lands of their father's estate

to Andrew Carpenter, husband of their sister,

Elizabeth Kinslow (Kincheloe), K-2-1-1-3, pp.

397-403. Many of the children of Adam, Joshua

and Aaron Kincheloe (Kinslow) b. in the period

1809-1829 can not be listed with their father's

other children from the one or more marriages

made by them. All Kincheloes (Kinslows) of the

generation of these latter 3, Adam, Joshua and Aaron's

children, found in Barren Co., Ky. and not

otherwise authentically connected as descendants

of Conrad and Rachel through their other sons

will be listed alphabetically by Christian names

at the close of the section of descendants of

Conrad and Rachel Kincheloe (Kinslow), beginning at pp.413-4 headed by a statement that they probably are ch. of 1 or the other of these 3, Adam, Joshua or Aaron Kincheloe (Kinslow). Compiler regrets inability to be more specific and hopes readers, especially descendants of Conrad and Rachel, may assign many, if not most of these to parents.

In the sketches of Adam, Joshua and Aaron Kincheloe (Kinslow) compiler will estimate the number of such unidentified children of Adam, Joshua and Aaron which appear to be unaccounted for in authenticated listings for the families of each and afford any other available information as to the more probable proper connections thereto.

In the 17 years between the dates of the 1st. marriage of Adam Kincheloe (Kinslow), K-2-1-1-4, pp. 398 and 403, to Charlotte DRAKE and his 2nd. marriage to Eliza PICKETT there was time for 6 or 7 ch. to have been born to Charlotte. Adam and Louisa had 8 children in the 1st. 20 years of their marriage. Adam was probably father of 15 or 16 children. Of Adam's children, for whom names and dates

or years of birth have been found there are 8, - all of his 2nd marriage to Louisa PICKETT. Unless some of first marriage d. in infancy or childhood there are about 8 of the unidentified possible of assignment to Adam and Charlotte DRAKE, who m. Barren Co., Ky. Charlotte d. by 1826, when Adam m. 2nd. Barren Co., Ky. Louisa PICKETT, b. Va. 1801-02, d. before recording the 1860 U.S. Census which showed Adam as widower living and their dau., Rebecca, b. Ky. 1841-42, keeping house for him and the only child then sharing his home. For Adam's possible children by his 1st. marriage to Charlotte DRAKE SEE pp.402, 413-14. Ch. (of Adam and Louisa (PICKETT)): 9- John Pickett, 1826, 10-Adam, Jr., 1829, 11- Nancy, 1830-31, 12-Harriet I, 1835-36, 13-Mary, 1837-38, 14-Louisa, 1839-40, 15-Rebecca, 1841-42, 16-Julia F. 1845-1846, all shown by 1850 Census of Barren Co., Ky. and otherwise of Adam's 2nd. marriage, all being b. in Barren Co., Ky. Adam signed contract with his son, John Pickett Kincheloe (Kinslow) in 1847, - upon his becoming of lawful age, that he was to have Adam's home farm at father's death. 339(a)(1), 426 SEE p.422. (4, 17, 34, 53-71).

Nancy had d. before June 17, 1829. when her sister, Elizabeth (Kincheloe (Kinslow) Carpenter, - in administering the estate of her deceased husband, Andrew CARPENTER, K-2-1-1-2, pp.398-404, sold his lands by a proceeding in court of Barren Co., Ky.

to perfect title thereto in purchaser naming as parents having interest outstanding in such land, among other descendants of Conrad and Rachel Kincheloe (Kinslow), deceased, "Heirs of Nancy Coleman, deceased", and summons issued to 3 therein named, who may have been adult and there may have been other and younger Coleman children of Nancy Kincheloe (Kinshallow, or Kinslow) represented as minors by guardian ad litem. These 3 children named were: 1-Margaret ("Peggy"), 2-Conrad, 3-Ambrose, 4-James W. 1814-15, K-2-1-1-4-1- Margaret ("Peggy") Coleman had m. before June 17, 1829 Heston C. , whose surname is not given, possibly because it was also COLEMAN.

Kinslow (Kincheloe) descendants yet living in Barren Co., Ky. remember their aunt, Mrs. Adam (Juliet (Julia)) Ann (BRITT) Kincheloe (Kinslow), II, (K-2-1-2-5-2, pp.400 and 401) referring to their "Coleman cousins" of Barren Co., Ky. 426(80, 17), 574(426)(c), (492), 349

K-2-1-1-5- Reuben Kinslow (Kincheloe), p.398, served as a private in 4th. (Ewing's) Regt. of Mounted Ky. Vols. in the War of 1812. Reproduced indexed copies of heads of families throughout Barren Co., Ky. of the recorded U.S. Census for 1810 include his 3 older brothers and father, but his name does not appear therein as head of family or otherwise. Descendants who have reconstructed the membership of his family and obliged compiler of copy for use herein indicated his wife, apparently his first, of a probable 3, called her "Polly" as nickname, - apparent true name, "Mary" ADAMS, dau. of Elijah, b. HOLLAND and emigrated to American Colonies in 1750. The chart shows children's names before the 1st. of the 6 other ch. b. to Reuben after his marriage to his last wife, Judith EMMERSON, recorded as solemnized in Barren Co., Ky. in 1823. His 7th. to 11th. ch. inclusive are recorded in the 1850 Census of Barren Co., Ky. in the home with his wife, Judith, b. in Va. 1791-92, it appearing she may have been his 3rd. wife. A marriage of this Reuben in Barren Co., Ky. is recorded there in 1819 to Amy WHEELER, apparently his second marriage. By May 20, 1822 he was a widower when he signed without being joined by wife with 5 brothers, 4 of whose wives joined with them in a deed to Andrew CARPENTER, husband of their sister, Elizabeth (Kincheloe, Kinslow) CARPENTER, K-2-1-1-2, pp.397-403, 398, as "part of the heirs and distributees of the estate of Conrad Kinslow (Kincheloe), deceased". N O T E this was 1 year previous to his marriage there to Judith EMMERSON. This leaves Reuben's 6 older children probably as mainly of his first mar

riage to Mary ("Polly") ADAMS, probably in Bar-
ren Co., Ky. and after the 1810 U.S. Census for
Barren Co. had been gathered. His 2nd wife, Mary,
lived less than 3 years after she married Reuben.
He took deed to land in Barren Co., Ky. Dec. 4, 1826,
was joined by wife, Judith, in signing deed Feb.
1849 conveying to his son, Stephen William Kinslow.
land in Barren Co. and recorded there. Reuben is
in 1850 U.S. Census of Barren Co. as "farmer, b. Va.
1788-89". Reuben signed will, 1857, recorded

William Thomas Adams left among his old papers a statement that the surname, "Kincheloe", had sometimes been spelled "Kaunslau". A deed dated Sept. 20, 1864, recorded in Barren Co., Ky. names William Thomas and Margaret (KINCHELOE) ADAMS children as follows: "widow, Margaret", "children, 1-Hardin Cohorn, 2-John H., 3-James V., 6-Thomas J., 7-Elizabeth McCONNELL, wife of J.D., 8-Sarah ADAMS, 10-Jantha ("Fitty") Ann DEARING, wife of Matthew. It is a small book with wooden covers and has in it no family records. Its existence has prompted the inquiry as to who of the Barren Co., Ky. Kinslow (Kincheloe) ancestors were of Holland-Dutch extractions. There are some inferences that it might have been Rachel, wife of Conrad Kincheloe (Kinslow), patriarch and pioneer, the first of the name to arrive in Barren within a very few years after KENTUCKY statehood in 1792. 412(82) 426(77, 78, 82), 574(426) (a-c), (492) (a, b), 601.

It recites his parentage as Scotch-Irish, his birth as Barren Co., Ky. Oct. 18, 1823, educated at Farmington (Mo.) Academy, studied medicine, graduating Mar. 4, 1846, - in Medical College in Ohio, located to practice at Belmont, Panola Co., Miss. On declaration of War with MEXICO he volunteered as surgeon, enlisting at Vicksburg, Miss. Jan. 6, 1847, commissioned and assigned to duty in 2nd. Miss. Vols. Regt., later placed in charge of hospital at Buena Vista, where he remained until the close of the war, contracted bronchitis in MEXICO, from which he suffered in his last illness. He had served earlier as Asst. Surgeon in Co. I 2nd. Miss. Inf. At enlistment he is recorded as 5 ft. 10 inches tall, fair complexion, dark eyes, black hair. He was honorably discharged July 20, 1848.

After the war he located at Sardis, Panola Co., Miss. to practice medicine. In the 1850 U.S. Census of Panola Co., Miss. he is recorded as a physician. Throughout his long life he adhered to the original American spelling of his surname as "KINCHELOE", except for dropping the middle syllable "e" and writing it as "Kinchloe" since so few, if any people sounded the "e" as the middle syllable with full knowledge that most of his father's brothers and their descendants, remaining in Barren Co., Ky. had submitted to the corruption in spelling and speaking of the name in Barren as "Kinslow". This having been done by him by his adult manhood and finishing of his literary education is offered as his conclusion that the original and complete surname was always earlier in America "KINCHELOE" and had its beginning as "Kinslow" first in Barren Co., Ky. principally by people holding public office, State and national, there, without qualifying education, recording it by sound, and spelling it "the easiest way they could"

He was a successful physician and surgeon in private practice and owned substantial property, including the home occupied by his widow in Oakland, Yazobusha Co., Miss., an elegant one, and reported to leave family in good financial condition.

When Secession swept over the South in 1861 he served as Captain and Surgeon in various commands and finally as Chief Surgeon of the Staff of General Withers and was surrendered with the Army of the Tennessee at Greensboro, N.C. being recorded as "Surgeon, Field and Staff, -44th. Miss. Inf. Regts. Col. A.R. Blythe and Jacob H. Sharp, commanding. He was nominated to Confederate Congress as "D.A. Kincheloe of Miss." as surgeon. Sept. 11, 1862 and Sept. 26, 1862 and confirmed by the Confederate Senate. In Confederate Medical Director's report Apr. 7, 1862, - on casualties Apr. 6 and 7, 1862, - near Shiloh: "The surgeons... stood well to their duty. I should be unjust were I not to bring to the notice of the Maj. Gen. the conduct of... and surgeon

Kincheloe. These gentlemen proved themselves worthy of the high trust confided to them and reflected fresh honors on the profession of which they are worthy members" "... Report by Dr. D.A. Kincheloe, Regimental surgeon" of the engagement Sept. 14, 1862 near Cave City, Barren Co., Ky. by Blythe's (41th. Miss.) Regt. showed 4 killed and 38 wounded." "... On duty, Chattanooga, Aug. 3, 1863, - granted leave of absence by special order, - for 15 days as "D.A. Kincheloe, Surgeon, C.S. His widow was granted U.S. Pension for his services in the War with MEXICO, beginning Jan. 29, 1887 at \$8 per month. He apparently never applied for pension for his services in either war in which he participated. N O T E :- In the nation-wide research for publishing this book a score or more names spelled "KINSLOW" have been gathered without learning if they come from the Barren Co., Ky. group, the only descent of immigrant Cornelius Kincheloe, K, pp. 2-7 found to date departing from a standard Americanized spelling their surname as "Kincheloe". As the founder of the Barren Co., Ky. branch, Conrad Kincheloe (Kinslow), had 2 married sister and 2 younger brother recorded in the family of their father, Peter Kincheloe, K-2-1, pp. 396 and 397, for whom some authentic descent to date has become available, it will be next listed, concluded by listing the miscellaneous "Kinslow" who are not yet found and identified as ever living in Barren Co., Ky.

Peter Kincheloe's son, Daniel Kincheloe, K-2-1-4, pp. 397 and 413, and descendants are recorded, wherever found, as "Kincheloe."

N O T E : (SEE Ambrose Kincheloe (Kinslow) pp. 397-402. The plan of this book has been to list every family in order of dates of births of parents and children, -or by generations.

After Ambrose Kincheloe was so set for printing as oldest child of Conrad and Rachel Kincheloe, K-2-1-1, pp. 396 and 397, it became apparent that Ambrose was Conrad's younger brother. This places Ambrose and descendants on pages ahead of planned position. The facts as to his true position are in two records in County Court House of Barren Co., Ky. as follows:

(a) In the deed signed May 20, 1822 by Adam, Joshua, Aaron, Ezekiel, Reuben and Andrew C. Kinslow (Kincheloe) as "part of the heirs and distributees of the estate of Conrad Kinslow, deceased" conveying lands in Barren Co., Ky. to Andrew Carpenter, husband of their sister, Elizabeth (KINCHLOE (Kinslow) Carpenter, K-2-1-1-2-, pp. 397-403, Ambrose did not join, although he lived in Barren Co., Ky. from as early as 1798 to past 1850 when he gave his age to the U.S. Census enumerator as 72 years old, or b. Va. 1777-78, and, therefore, older than the 3 younger known children of Peter and Margaret (WALLS) Kincheloe, K-2-1, pp. 4-6 and 396-397, namely, Margaret, Nancy and Daniel Kincheloe. (b) In the legal proceedings begun in Barren Co. Ky. court entitled: "Elizabeth Carpenter versus Kinslow heirs" filed there by Elizabeth June 17, 1829 to quiet or perfect title for a sale she was making of the same land her husband, Andrew Carpenter, since deceased, took from the 6 above named "heirs and distributees of Conrad Kincheloe (Kinslow) she needed only include in the petition and summons those not having so signed. She did not include Ambrose or any descendant, since he was still living in the same county and would be a necessary party, if any interest he ever had, "in the estate of Conrad (Kincheloe) Kinslow, deceased". Conrad's daughter, Nancy (Kincheloe) Coleman was dead and her "heirs" were named, made parties and summons was served in her stead in this suit. Conrad's daughter, Margaret (Kincheloe) ADAMS lived past 1850 as appears from U.S. Census record of her, husband and children in that U.S. Census of Barren Co., Ky. accounting for all the "heirs and distributees of the estate of Conrad Kinslow, deceased" without naming or including Ambrose. A son, who did not sign in the deed of May 20, 1822 as above, had estate administered in Barren Co., Ky. between 1815 and 1820 and in the suit above "versus Kinslow Heirs" was

NIMROD KINCHELOE (Kinslow). This administration proceeding showed "10 legatees", but no names appeared. In the suit to quiet title filed Jan. 17, 1827 "Elizabeth Carpenter versus Kinslow Heirs" 7 named surviving "heirs of Nimrod Kinslow" in the petition and served with summons therein. From the foregoing it seems that Ambrose Kincheloe (Kinslow) should be regarded as brother rather than son of Conrad Kincheloe (Kinslowe), K-2-1-1 and correction has been made throughout this book to so show and he will be labeled as "K-2-1-2" as 2nd known child of Peter and Margaret (WALLS) Kincheloe K-2-1, pp. 396-397 and his probable birth place as Harrison (formerly Monongalia) Co., Va. (now W. Va.)
