

The Last Will and Testament of  
J<sup>m</sup> Gagg.

A last will and Testament in the  
name of God Amen.

I William Gagg, Senor, of Jones County  
& State of North Carolina being in perfect  
mind and memory, altho near in  
Boddy and calling to mind the uncertainty  
of this life and knowing that my worldly  
effects might go to them who are  
undeserving it I do hereby make  
this my last will and Testament in  
manner & Form following (To wit)  
In the first place I give & bequeath my  
soul to God who gave it Hoping  
through the merits of Jesus Christ  
my Redeemer that He will finally  
raise both soul and Boddy unto  
the ransoms of Glory 2<sup>d</sup> Item at my  
death I give and bequeath unto my  
wife one bed & furniture and one  
bay mare & one fided cow & calf.  
This to be her own right and property.  
3<sup>d</sup> Item I give and bequeath to my  
daughter Indeanna one bed & furniture  
4<sup>th</sup> Item my tract of land containing  
75 acres where I formerly lived on I  
leave to be sold & the money equally divid

Between my two children Indiana and  
Nylon Gragg 5<sup>th</sup> I leave all my  
large to my wife to help raise my children  
and also I leave all my household and kitchen  
furniture to the use of my family.

6<sup>th</sup> I leave all the balance of my  
property to be sold and the money  
equally divided between my two children  
also leave one dollar a piece for  
each of my older set of sons and  
daughters. Some debts due me I  
leave to be collected and the money  
put to the use of my children.

I want my debts paid off and all  
the balance of the money put out  
in interest until the children get  
old enough to receive it. Lastly I  
do hereby nominate and appoint John King  
of the Appraised County Executor of  
my last will and testament. Reserving  
all other will or wills made by me  
in any wise in witness whereof  
I have in the presence of Alfred  
Richard and Mayne Gragg Hereto set  
my hand and affixed my seal this  
the sixteenth day of October One thousand  
Eight hundred and Forty seven  
Signed sealed and acknowledged to be  
his last will and testament.
