God. Therefore and calling unto mind the mortality of my body and that it  
is appointed for all men once to die. do make and ordain this my last will and  
testament. That is to say Principally and first of all I give and bequeath  
my Soul to God that gave it and my Body I recommend to the earth  
to be buried in a decent manner at the Direction of my Executors nothing  
doubting but at the General Resurrection I shall receive the same again  
by the Almighty power of God. And as touching my worldly Estate  
wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life I give and  
Devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form as  
Impoverish; I order that my just debts be paid of the whole or any  
General Charges I am I give and bequeath to my dearly Beloved wife Elizabeth  
the third part of all my estate Real & Personal and after her decease  
that the tract of Land I now possess be equally divided quantity & Quality  
between my two Daughters (viz) Sarah Skye & Elizabeth Gregg to them &  
their heirs of their bodies for ever which said tract contains one hundred  
& Ninety seven Acres of Land and also my daughter Sarah One half Acre  
of meadow (viz) one year old Red Cow for all to my daughter Elizabeth one Grey Mare  
of her Cattle and one Cow and her Calf and her mothers Bed and her  
Mothers Dresser Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Hannah  
Gregg my Loom and all her trappings and one Bed and furniture of  
one Bed Room named Story, Item I bequeath to my Son William  
Gregg five Shillings. Item I bequeath to my Son Beniah five Shillings  
viz. Item I bequeath to my Son Robert Gregg five Shillings  
Item I bequeath to my daughter Mary Campbell five Shillings Item I  
bequeath to my Daughter Mary Briant five Shillings Item I order  
that my wife Elizabeth shall have the benefit of the whole of the Land

in full time and at her decease to be divided as above mentioned

Item I know that my Dearly Belov'd wife Elizabeth the John Denton & Charles Spontak as my Executors and I do hereby testify Disallow Newke and Dismall all my other Will and Testament Legacies and bequeaths & Executors in any wise before Deceased and Bequeathed Testifying and confirming this and no other to be my last Will & Testament in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & did the Day & year above written.
