Know all men by these that we Obadiah Meadow and Mary Meadow, his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and fifty one dollars and fifty cents to me in hand paid have granted, bargained, sold and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and convey unto Hiley Swain all of Lafayette County and State of Mississippi all that certain tract or parcel land lying and being in the county and state aforesaid to wit the east half of the north west quarter of section fourteen township ten range one west containing eighty acres more or less with all the appurtenances thereunto belonging and all the right, title, and interest that I have in said lands in the premises, to have and to hold the same with the appurtenances thereunto the said Hiley Swain, her heirs in fee simple forever and the said Obadiah Meadow and Mary Meadow, his wife, for myself and my heirs do hereby covenant and agree to and with the said Hiley Swain, her heirs and assigns, I do warrant and defend the title of any person whatsoever. In testimony whereof we affix our hands and seals 11th Novr 1850 (?).
