Brownsville July 17th 1848-

Agreeably to previous notice given a meeting of the Presbyterian Congregation of Brownsville was held this afternoon in the Church. On motion the Revd. Mr. Martin was called to the Chair & J. N. Duncan appointed Secy.

The Object of this meeting was made known by the Revd. Mr. Martin, which was to dispose of the fund bequeathed by the late Mr. Thornton to the Presbyterian Congregation in Brownsville - Whereupon Mr. Wm. H. Copland offered the following Resolutions, which were Unanimously adopted -

Resolved; That the fund bequeathed by the late Joseph Thornton to the Presbyterian Congregation in Brownsville, be and the same is hereby appropriated to the building of a new Church in Brownsville.

Resolved: That the Trustees of the said Church be and they are hereby authorized & instructed to apply the said fund to that object.

Resolved; That the proceedings of this meeting be signed by the officers & that the same be regularly entered in the Minute Book of the Congregation.

Brownsville Oct 18th 1848.

Agreeably to your notice there was a Congregational meeting held this evening in the Church, J. N. Martin was call^d to the Chair & J. S. Miller appointed Secy. the Minutes of the last meeting were read. On motion it was resolved that the former Trustees be continued during the present year. Resolved that J. N. Martin Esq. be appointed Trustee instead of Thomas Shaw removed. Resolved; that J. S. Miller, A. M. Shaw, Henry Barkman & Dorsey Overleaf collect the Rev. Mr. Martin's salary for the present year ending Sept 1849. On motion J. N. Martin J. S. Miller J. S. Miller, Wm. Martin & D. Overleaf were appointed to solicit subscribers for the present year.
