Whereas the Court of Pleas & Quarter Sessions for Orange County at its November Term 1865 did authorize the undersigned as administrators of John M.  Consideration of the premises the undersigned as administrators  
 of John W. Craig deceased do hereby bargain and sell the lot  
 described as aforesaid to the said Clayton P. Morris, Anthony  
 M. Hinkle and Richard Carberry and their heirs upon the  
 terms above specified and so far as they may as administrators  
 they will warrant and defend the same to such buyers and  
 their heirs forever and also do covenant that since they have  
 been administrators they have neither done nor suffered  
 anything whereby the title to said lot hath been encumbered  
 or impaired.
