Carolina Quakers Tercentenary 1672-1972 states that Deep River Meeting House was built in 1758 and replaced in 1875 by the brick building still in use.

Still in use in 1972.

Hinshaw's Vol. I states that Deep River Meeting is in the western part of Guilford County, about 12 miles from Greensboro. The Deep River community shows on the NC Gazetteer south of I-40 on NC 68. It's too small to show on my US Atlas of NC, but Mapquest will find it.

Preparative meetings under Deep River Monthly Meeting included Deep River, Springfield, Muddy Creek, Deep Creek, Belews Creek, Gum Swamp and Hitchcock.

According to Hughes' Guilford Co map, Deep River MM (1753) was just northwest of Jamestown and a little west of Robert Lamb's (1756) and southeast of John Harry's (1753.)

I purchased my Hughes Maps a few years ago while visiting Guilford Co (at the Jamestown Library.) The last I heard, the library no longer has them, but they can be purchased through the Guilford Co Geneal. Society.

There are still many active Quakers in the Jamestown area. I don't know if they are still at the old Deep River MM area or not. Someone on this list probably would know, but if you don't get an answer you might try posting a query on the Quaker-List.

Deep River as a river, however, runs across Randolph county.
