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KLINGER, PHILIP, (Preble Co.)

On pens roll 1832 of Preble Co, O. Service 1775 in Capt Griffin's Company, also 1776 in Capt Jacob Hetterling's Company. Was in battle of Princeton. Was wounded. Br 1754 in Chester Co, Pa. Mar Barbara (br 1759) 1779. D in Ohio. Ref: Natl No 73377, Vol 74, p 142, D. A. R. Lin.

KLIPPINGER, ANTONY, or (ANTHONY CLIPPINGER) (Columbiana Co.)

Pvt in Capt Paul Knauses' Company, Northampton Co Mil, for Spring of 1782. Br about 1765. Parents: Anthony Clippinger, Sr. Mar Margaret A. Miller about 1800. Children: Catherine, Mary, Daniel, Christina, Hannah, Emanuel, John, Susan. D North Georgetown, O, Nov 1846. Bur North Georgetown, Knox Twp, Columbiana Co, O. MI "Anthony Clippinger, 1765, 1846." KNOWLTON, STEPHEN, JR., (Ashtabula Co.)

Turned out at the Lexington Alarm, and enl at the first call for tr in Capt Thomas Knowlton's Company of Conn Tr. Stationed at Cambridge during the siege. Was a prisoner fr Morgan, Ashtabula Co. Br 1753, Ashford, Conn. Mar Diodema Chubb. Children: Laura, Calvin. D 1830, Morgan, Ashtabula Co, O, Bur Rock Creek. KOCH, ADAM, (Stark Co.)

Contl N J Indian Wars and 1812. Capt in 3rd Regt fr Jan 5 1792 to Mar 1792; Maj fr Mar 20 1800 trnsfrd to 5th regt Apr 5 1802 Lt Col to 1812 in Pa Line. Was b 1751; chldr: James B Pike wf Elizabeth; Maria Gage. Chldr of James & Elizabeth were Wm; George; Montgomery; Catharine; Joseph. Chldr of Marie Gage were Zebulon; Sarah, Clarisa; and an infant 9 mos. Soldr d abt Aug 1834 æ 83 in O. Cop fr Western Reserve Chronicle Sept 4 1834 "Col Zebulon Pike æ 83 d at Zebulon O July 27. He had srvd in many of the Rev battles" by Mary Chesney chpt. Research by State D A R finds him a pensr 1826-28 in Dearborn co Ind. Ref S 36737 Contl N J. Black Swamp chpt reports same death date but he d at Lawrenceburg Ind whr he is bur.

PILES, JEREMIAH, Preble co

Pvt Va Milit. Enl 1780 or 81 Bedford co Va. Srvd 8 mos. Was b Mar 1762 London co Va. Came to Preble co abt 1818. Appl for pens Preble co O Sept 21 1832. Ref S 5155 Va Rept by State D A R.

PIPER, FREDERICK, Wayne co

Pvt Pa Milit. Enl Oct 1 1776 Lancaster co Pa. Srvd 6 mos. Was b 1748. Mvd to Hagerstown Md before war ended. Aft a yr mvd to Shenendoah co Va. Aft 2 yrs mvd to Green co Va. Stayed 3 yrs thence to Wayne co O. Appl for pens Wayne co O Oct 4 1832 Res of Green twp. Ref S 8958 Pa. Rept by State D A R.

PIPER, JAMES, Warren co

Pvt Conn Contl. Enl Apr 1775 Capt Griswolds Co. Srvd 7 mo 28 das. Was b 9-19-1754 New Hartford Conn. Mvd fr there to Portage co O in 1822. Old Northwest chpt repts soldr bur at Rootstown O old cem. Pens appl 10-19-1832 while liv in Rootstown twp Portage co. Ref Conn S 3675. Rept by State D A R.

PIXLEY (Picksley), ELIJAH, Shelby co

Musician Conn Contl. Enl Dec 1777 into Conn Contl under Capt Smith. Was b 1763; mar Elenor; chldr: Thomas æ 14 in 1821; Plummer 11; Hezekiah 9; Phebe 7; Rachel 5; Mary 3; William 1. Was pens in Adams co but appl for trnsfr to Shelby co 9-5-1821. Ref Conn S 40265. Rept by State D A R.

PLACE, PELEG, Delaware co
