

Claim of Officer or Soldier for Invalid Pension.

The State of Ohio, County of Clarke, DEP
1865.

On this 24 day of November, A.D. 1865, personally appeared before (1) Wm. H. Clapp, Clerk of the Court of Common Pleas, a Court of Record within and for said county, John W. Piles, aged 32 years, a resident of Greencastle, in the county of Clarke, and State of Ohio, who, being first duly sworn according to law, declares that he is the identical John W. Piles who enlisted in the service of the United States, at Perryman, in the County of Monroe, and State of Ohio, on the first day of October, in the year 1861, as a private in Company C, commanded by Captain J. H. Callander, in the 41st Regiment of Ohio Vol. Inf., commanded by Col. R. Mason, in the war of 1861, and was honorably discharged on the thirtieth day of November A. D. 1865 as will appear by his certificate of discharge herewith presented. (2)

That while in the service aforesaid, and in the line of his duty, (3) ~~while being transported with his company and Regt. from Kentucky to Tennessee~~ ^{near Mattox's Gap}, enroute for Virginia, on the 14 day of March 1865, his train was thrown from the track by a rail having been removed by rebel cavalry, that the car in which he was riding was wrecked and in the crash the small bone of his left leg was broken just above the ankle and the upper portion thereof driven past the end of the lower piece and the ankle dislocated, that the limb and ankle joint are on account thereof deformed and to a great extent disabled, that these causes continue to give much constant pain and that the limb is thereby so disabled that he cannot perform the manual labor of his usual occupation of farriery and that he has been compelled thereby to abandon the said occupation.

That he has not been in any military service of the U.S. since his discharge, and that he has resided at Greencastle, in the State of Ohio, and his occupation has been Horse Shoeing.

He makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the Invalid Pension Roll of the United States, on account of the disability above stated.

Also, on the same day, personally appeared N. J. Horner and Frederick H. Judge, residents of said County of Clarke, persons whom I certify to be respectable and entitled to credit, and who, being by me duly

sworn, say that they were present and saw John W. Rice sign his name
(4) to the foregoing declaration: and they further swear that they have every reason to believe, from the appearance of the applicant, and their acquaintance with him; that he is the identical person he represents himself to be, and who served as stated in his declaration; that his habits since he left the service have been good, and his occupation has been that of House Practicing; and that they have no interest in the prosecution of this claim.
