I give and bequeath to my dear friend Thomas Page my wife's father whom I ordaine and make the whole and sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament, and I intreat my dear friend Richard Page of White Parish Clerk, and Philip Page of Diphaven to be the Overseers of this my Will, and Testament appointing to each of them five shillings as a remembrance of my thanks for their pains, by virtue of these presents reciting, and making void all former Wills, and Testaments, bequests, and legacies, Executors, and Overseers whatsoever heretofore or before this time by mee ordained, and made, if any were. In witness whereof I have published this my last Will and Testament, and thereto sett mine hand, and seal, even the day, and year above written. The witness of Pet Seaman Clerk, in the presence of Thos Page, Philip Page, the mark of John Amour the elder, the mark of John Amour the younger.

This Will was proved at London the ninth day of October, one thousand six hundred fifty eight, before the Judges for Probate of Wills, by the oath of Thomas Page sole Executor, et. Thomas Seaman et. was Comitted, he being first sworn truly to do.

In the name of God Amen: - Anne Soper,

The fifteenth day of June in the year of the Incarnation of our Lord God, One thousand six hundred fifty eight. I Anne Soper of North Okeley in the parish of Kingsclere in the County of Southampton widow, being aged, but in good health, and of perfect memory, I give God thanks for it, do ordaine, and make this my present Will, and Testament in manner, and forme following. first, and spiritually I bequeath my soule unto the mercy of Almighty God my Maker trusting confidently to attain salvation by the merits, death, and passion of Jesus Christ my Redeemer, and my body to be buried in the Parish Church of Danington as neere as it may be conveniently done by my late husband's Item, I give, and bequeath unto the Parish Church of Danington twenty shillings to be paid immediately after my decease. Item, I give, and bequeath to the poore people of Danington ten shillings to be paid immediately after my decease. Item, I give, and bequeath unto William Soper my eldest Sonne the little table, and chair in the study with all the booke w^{ch} shall be here found at my decease. Item, I give, and bequeath to Richard Soper my youngest Sonne my brass talen and my brass pott next to the best. Item, I give, and bequeath unto Richard Soper and Robert Soper my grand children four of Robert Soper each of them five pounds to be paid immediately after my decease. Item, I give, and bequeath to, unto Richard Soper, and John Soper my grand children four of John Soper each of them five pounds to be paid immediately after my decease. Item, I give, and bequeath unto Anne Soper my grandchild daughter of John Soper all my wearing apparel, and my box in my chamber, and all that is in the 1st box at my decease. Item, I give, and bequeath unto Richard Soper my grandchild Sonne of Richard Soper my best brass pott. The remainder of my goods, Chattels, and tritles whatsoever I give, and bequeath unto John Soper, and Robert Soper my Sones to be equally part betweene them, the whole to John Soper, and Robert Soper I make the full, and whole Executors of this my Will and Testament. And I desire my kinsman Thomas Denham of Haslingstock, and Rowland Drowett of Danington to be my Overseers of this my Will, and Testament to see it performed, and for the better Testimony hereof, I declare this to be my Will, and do hereunto sett to my hand, and seal the day, and year first above written in the presence of Rowland Drowett, the mark of John Wiff, the mark, and seal Anne Soper.

John Stores,

In the name of God Amen, The

Six, and twentieth day of May in the year of our Lord One thousand five hundred fifty, and eight. I John Stores of Towce in the County of Southton yeoman being sick in body in body, but of good, and perfect mind, and memory (praised be God) doe make this my last Will, and Testament in manner, and forme following. First, and principally I commend my soule into the hands of Almighty God my heart trusting to have salvation for the only merits of Jesus Christ my alone Saviour. And my body I commend to the earth from whence it came, to be decently buried, and Christianly buried. And for that estate God hath lent me in this world by his goodness I dispose of as followeth. Item, I give, and bequeath to my souner John Stores all that my Tenement, and land lying, and being in Southton in the Parish of Wimmering in the County of Southton, and my free land lying, and being in the tything of See marches in the Parish of Cittyfeild in the County of Southton aforefit. To have, and to hold the same to my said souner John, and the heirs of his body lawfully begotten for ever. And for want of such issue then my freehold at Southton unto my souner James Stores, and his heirs for ever. And my freehold at Newtowne to my souner Charles, and his heirs for ever. Item, I give, and bequeath a Lease that I hold of Charles Draven for lives to my brother Nicholas Stores, my souner James Stores, and my souner Charles Stores to be equally divided amongst them, and the full benefit, and profit thereof according to the tenor, true intent, and meaning of the said Lease I hold of the said Charles Draven for lives, lying, and being in the Parish of Allverstone. And my further Will, intent, and true meaning in this my Will is that my said brother Nicholas Stores shall have, and enjoy ten pounds a yeare out of the rents, and profits of the said Lease during the continuance thereof. And my further intent, and true meaning in this my Will is, that if either of my said souners James, and Charles shall happen to decease before their severall ages of one, and twenty yeares without issue, that then the decaysd portion shall become due, and belonging to my souner John Stores, and William Stores, equally. Item, I give, and bequeath that Lease I hold of a Tenement, and land in Towce, and Allverstone of the said Charles Draven called Greaves unto my souner William Stores, to have, and to hold the same according to the tenor of the said Lease. And if my said souner William happen to decease without issue then the rents, and profits thereof to be, and remaine to the use of my said souners James, and Charles, and their issues. Item, I give, and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Stores, the summe of two hundred pounds of a lawfull money of England, to be paid to her when she shall accomplish her age of one, and twenty yeares. Item, I give, and bequeath to my souner John Stores the summe of two hundred pounds of lawfull money of England to be paid him when he shall accomplish his age of one, and twenty yeares. Item, I give, and bequeath to my souner William Stores the summe of two hundred pounds of lawfull money, to be paid him when he shall accomplish his age of one, and twenty yeares. Item, I give, and bequeath to my souner James Stores the summe of two hundred pounds of lawfull money to be paid him, when he shall accomplish his age of one, and twenty yeares. Item, I give, and bequeath to my souner Charles Stores the summe of two hundred
