This is the last Will and Testament

of me Richard Webb of Tockstone in the Parish of Whitestone in the County of Cornwall Yeoman I give and bequeath unto my dear Wife Elizabeth Webb an Annuity of Twenty five pounds during her life to commence from my death and to be paid quarterly without any deduction and a proportionate part thereof for the quarter of a year current at my Wifes decease to be paid to her executors administrators or assigns and such Annuity shall be in satisfaction of all Dower and thirds which at Common Law or by Custom Statute or otherwise my said Wife might claim or demand in or out of the real and personal estate to which I may be entitled at the time of my death And I charge the said Annuity of Twenty five pounds on my Estate of Tockstone otherwise Tockstone aforesaid And I declare that in case the said Annuity of Twenty five pounds or any part thereof shall be unpaid for Twenty one days after any of the days of payment it shall be lawful for my said Wife or her assigns to enter and distrain upon the hereditaments charged therewith as heretofore mentioned or any part thereof and the distress or distresses there found to dispose of according to Law to the intent that thereby or otherwise the said Annuity and all expenses incurred by the nonpayment thereof may be fully paid And that in case the said Annuity of Twenty five pounds or any part thereof shall be unpaid for Forty days next after any of the said days of payment it shall be lawful for my said Wife and her assigns to enter upon and hold the said hereditaments or any part thereof and to receive the Rents and profits thereof until the same Annuity and the arrears thereof up to the time of entry and to become due during such possession and all expenses to be sustained by the non-payment thereof shall be fully paid such possession to be without impeachment of waste And I further give and bequeath unto my said Wife the sum of Fifty pounds to be paid to her within one month after my decease And I also give and bequeath to her for her own use and benefit All the Linnen China Household Furniture Articles and things whatsoever that shall be in or about the Parlour and the Best Bed Chamber in my

time of my decease AND I give and bequeath the following Legacies
that is to say unto my Daughter Elizabeth Webb the sum of Two
hundred and fifty pounds unto my Son Henry Webb the
sum of Two hundred pounds unto my Daughter Mary Ann
Webb the sum of Two hundred and fifty pounds and unto
John Coles my old Servant who lives at Tankins Cottage the sum
of Five pounds I give and bequeath unto my Son William
Marslyn Webb his executors or administrators the sum of Two
hundred pounds Upon Trust to invest the same on any
Security real or personal as he or they may think fit and to pay and
apply the same and the income thereof from time to time in such
manner as he or they in his or their irrevocable discretion may
deem advisable or think best for the maintenance support education
and advancement of the Children of my late Son John Webb
deceased and if there shall be any part of the said principal sum
of Two hundred pounds or any accumulation of Interest thereof
remaining unapplied when the youngest Child of my said Son the
said John Webb shall attain the age of Twenty one years the same
shall be then divided between such Children or Child (if only one)
of my said Son John Webb as shall then be living in equal shares
as tenants in common and the receipt of my said Trustee shall
at all times be a good discharge and he shall only be answerable
for such monies as shall actually come to his hands AND I charge
the said Legacies which shall be payable Twelve Calendar months
after my decease carrying Interest in the meantime at the rate
of Four pounds per cent per annum on my said Estate of
Hockstone AND subject to the payment of my just debts funeral
and testamentary expenses I give devise and bequeath all the
rest residue and remainder of my estate and effects whatsoever
and wheresoever both real and personal whether in possession
reversion remainder or expectancy unto and to the use of my
Sons the said William Marslyn Webb and Richard Webb
their heirs executors administrators and assigns according to

the nature and quality thereof to and for their use and benefit equally as tenants in common and not as joint tenants - And I nominate constitute and appoint my said Sons William Martyn Webb and Richard Webb to be Executors of this my Will and hereby revoking all former and other Wills by me at any time heretofore made I declare this to be my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand this 17th day of July in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy four.
