Letter from the same as to the seizing into the king's hands of the park of Ichulle for want of enclosure. Dated at Wocking, 26th May.

Fol. 311 (cccxii). Process between the Bishop of Worcester and his chapter in the 22nd year of the bishop's pontificate.

Bull from Pope Nicholas IV. to the abbots of Reading 1 and Wyggemore in the diocese of Salisbury and Hereford, and the preceptor of the church of Wells, commanding them to inquire as to the petition of the prior and chapter of Worcester, in which it is recited that from a time whereof memory is not the said prior and chapter have had the rights of instituting and destituting rectors, vicars, &c., during a vacancy in the see of Worcester, yet the bishop has constituted the churches of Kemes' [Kempsey], Bredon, Wychendon, Clyve [Cleeve Episcopi], and Weston upon Avon, which are immediately subject to the church of Worcester, prebendal to the church of Westbury, against their wishes, and assigned them for prebends to John de Ebroyc', Walter de Berton, Ralph de Vasto Prato, and John de Staneweye, his clerks and members of his household, whom he has made rectors of the same churches, and instituted as new canons in the same church of Westbury, by augmenting the number of canons of the same church so that the same churches are not immediately subject to the church of Worcester as they ought to be. Dated at Rome, at St. Mary Major's, the 15th of the Kalends of May, in the second year of the Pope's pontificate.
