

1291. Fol. 337 (cccxxxviii). Citation of the Bishop of Worcester to appear in the Court of Arches to answer to an appeal of the prior and convent of Worcester, upon the corrections made by the bishop at his visitation of their monastery¹. Dated the 4th of the Ides of April, 1291.

Fol. 337*d*. Agreement made between the Bishop of Worcester and his chapter, in the presence of Robert, bishop of Bath and Wells², Walter, abbot of Winchcomb, and William Pykerel. Witnesses:—William Burnel, John Rodeberewe, Nigel le Waleys, Peter de Puryton, Geoffrey de Northwyco, John de Berford, John de Bruges, Hugh, then chancellor of Bath, William de Sancto Michaele, John de Staneweys, William de Molend', Bartholomew de Devyses, Nicholas, rector of the church of Seggesberg [Sedgeberrow], Richard rector of the church of Iccumb, John de Bremesgrave, clerk, Robert de Barneby, and others. The 2nd of the Ides of May, 1291.

Fol. 338 (cccxxxix). Quitclaim by the bishop to the prior and convent of Worcester of all claim to the scutage with the homage and other things from the prior and convent and their men and tenants in Coteston [Cotheridge?] and Lawern Willi' [Lawern William]. Witnesses:—Sir William le Power, Sir Henry de Ribbesford, Sir John de Grafton, Sir Robert de Bracy, Sir Henry de Penedoc, knights, Thomas de Codeleg', Richard de Grynnehull, and others. Note that this charter was granted at the instance of the Bishop of Bath and the abbot of Wynch' [Wynchcomb], at Kemes' [Kempsey], the 11th of the Kalends of May, 1291.

Induction of William de Preston, chaplain, by Thomas de Preston, his proctor, at the presentation of the abbot and convent of Wynch'. The 5th of the Kalends of July, *anno* 23. And on the feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Mary he was instituted.

Memorandum, that on the 8th of the Ides of August, the bishop visited St. Augustine's of Bristol and preached there, whose text was *Exurge Jerosolymum et sta in excelso*³. And he received there his procuration in food and drink.
