ANSWERS TO CORRESPONDENTS.

G. C.—The quarter day in December is Christmas day, the 25th of the month. That is the day on which rent falls, and on which premises should be quit.

L. X. E.—Any intermeddling in the estate of a person deceased by one named by him as his executor is equivalent to an acceptance of the office, and the person who so intermeddles cannot afterwards renounce. Signing cheques would clearly have that effect.

G. B.—Foxhunters are clearly trespassers if they go over a farm without leave. Any farmer can stop them if he chooses, or he may sue them for any damages caused to his fences and fields. Generally farmers are compensated for such damages.

SUNSHINER'S CRANK.—If the sister who died before the testator left children, her share will go to her children. If she had no children, her share goes to the testator's brother (your father) and other sister. If your father is dead, his share does not go to his eldest son, but becomes divisible between your mother and you and your other brothers and sisters. Your mother would be entitled to a third of it, and the remaining two-thirds would be divided between you and your brothers and sisters in equal shares.

C. & SON.—A private arrangement with creditors only binds those who are parties to the arrangement, and in your case you would be able to sue your debtor for the value of the goods sold by you to him.

M. & W.—A person who libels another can be prosecuted; but if he can in his defence prove his statements to be true and in the public interest, he will be acquitted.

K. QUINLAN.—A landlord can distrain upon all goods upon the premises, even if they belong to a third party. Lodgers goods are protected by statute. But the owner of such goods should give notice that they belong to him, and after such notice the landlord will run some risk if he sells them.

A. B.—A husband is not liable for his wife's debts incurred before her marriage unless he received some property with her on the marriage. If he received any property with her, then the husband is liable to the amount of the value of such property.
