

ST. SITHNEY [Sancti Sidnini, MS.], Vicars of—

Henry occurs as V., 6 July, 1310; L 192^b.
Sir Ralph de Trezouweyns, priest, was collated, 26 Aug., 1316; 114^b.
Sir Vincent de Wynter, priest, was collated, 16 May, 1318; 127.

ST. STEPHEN'S-IN-BRANNEL [Sancti Stephani de Branel, MS.],

Rectors of—

Thomas de Branel ("primam habens tonsuram,"—accolite, 22 Feb., 1308-9; 220: subdeacon, 15 March, 1308-9; 221^b), was inst., 24 Oct., 1308; Patron, *Sir Walter*, called "de Cornubia"; 36. A Commission was directed, 6 March, 1316-17, to Precentor Wele and Richard de Coltone, for the settlement of a dispute touching this Church, then vacant, and for the Induction of

William de Scothowe, clerk, presented by *William de Cornubia*; 117^b.

ST. STEPHEN'S-IN-BRANNEL [Sancti Stephani in Poudreschyre, MS.], Vicar of—

Baldwin, "capellanus de Branel," was inst., 13 July, 1309; Patron, *Sir Walter de Cornubia*, Knt.; 42.

ST. STEPHEN'S-BY-SALTASH [Ecclesia de Esse in Cornubia, also Sancti Stephani de Esse, MS.], Rectors of—

Master *Peter de Skeltone* occurs as R., 12 Oct., 1315; 110^b.—Vacant "a die Lune proxima ante Festum Nativ. Beate Virginis" (6 Sept.), 1316; and *Roger de Audede*, clerk, was inst., 31 Dec. (by proxy—*John de Westone*); Patron, the King; 116^b.

ST. STYTHIAN'S [Sancte Stediane, MS.], Rectors of—

[*Ralph* (son of *Thomas de la Hyde*), instituted by Bp. Bytton. His successor, *Roger* (son of *Roger de Carmynou*),¹ was inst., 18 July, 1309; Patron, King Edward II., "ut heres Edmundi, quondam Comitum Cornubie"; 42^b.

ST. TUDY [Sancti Tudii, MS.], Rectors of—

William de Kelligryn; on whose death was inst., 28 Feb., 1308-9, *Benedict Bloyhou*; Patron, *Henry de Kelligryn*; 38^b.

ST. VEEP [Sancti Vepi, MS.], Vicars of—

Thomas de Euty occurs as V., 10 Aug., 1308; 35. He was (apparently) deprived, and *John le Vauntou*, priest, was inst., 8 June, 1309; Patrons, the Prior and Convent of Montacute; 41^b.—"Johannes, dictus le Vauntour" resigned, 6 Aug., 1309; 43; and *Pagan* (son of *Nicholas de Arcubus*) was inst., 17 Oct.; Patrons, the same; 44^b. He resigned, 9 Oct., 1318; and *Sir Richard de Smalchulle*, priest, was inst., 21 Dec.; Patrons, the same; 139.

ST. VERYAN ["Ecclesia de Elerky," MS.], Vicar of—

William de Ywefforde (subdeacon, 22 Feb., 1308-9; 220: deacon, 15 March, 1308-9; 221^b), was inst., 13 June, 1309; Patrons, the D. and C. of Exeter; 41^b. Ordained priest, 20 Sept., 1309; 223^b.

ST. WENDRON [Sancte Wendrone, MS.], Vicar of—

Master *Ralph de Kaerlunyech*, deacon, was collated (by lapse), 14 March, 1309-10; Patrons, the Abbat and Convent of Rewley, near Oxford—"Regalis Loci, juxta Oxoniam; . . . cujus Collatio ad Dominum extitit illa vice

[ST. WENN, Rector of—

"Die Sanctorum Quatuor Coronatorum [8 Nov., 1238] data est Ecclesie Sancte Wenne Magistro *Willelmo de Staneweys* . . . per Abbatem et Conventum Theokesberie."—*Annals of Tewkesbury Abbey* (Ed. Luard), p. 111].

ST. WINNOW [Sancti Wynnoci, MS.], Rector of—

Sir Hugh de Wellia, priest, was inst., 4 May, 1313; Patrons, the D. and C. of Exeter; 70.

SAMPFORD-COURTENAY, Rector of—

Sir Reymund de Sully, priest, was inst., 29 Aug., 1310; Patron, *Sir Hugh de Courtenay*, Knt. The Church had been vacant "a die Jovis proximo post Festum Sancti Jacobi, Apostoli" (30 July); 54^b.

SAMPFORD-PEVERELL [Saunforde Peverel, MS.], Rector of—

—Vacant, "a xvij^o Kalendas Aprilis" (16 March), 1323-4; and *Nicholas de Esse*,² was inst., 8 July, 1324; Patron, *Sir Elias Cotel*, Knt., "ratione hereditatis Margerie, uxoris sue"; 180^b.

SATTERLEIGH [Saterleghe, MS.], Rectors—

Sir Simon de Ralegh; he resigned, "die Veneris in Festo Beati Michaelis Archangeli" (29 Sept.), 1318; and was succeeded by *William atte Stone*, clerk,³ inst., 16 Sept., 1320; Patron, *Sir Wm. Martyn*, Knt.; 151^b.—The Benefice was vacant for nearly two years; and, that there might be no mistake, both dates are carefully recorded: yet nothing is said of a "lapse" or of its having been held in commendam.

SEATON [Setone, MS.], Vicars of—

Sir Roger occurs as V., 17 April, 1309; 40^b.
Sir William occurs as V., 24 Oct., 1309; 44^b. His surname was *Gladewyne*; 161^b. And on his death, "die Sabbati proxima ante Festum [Translacionis] Beati Thome, Martiris" (4 July), 1321,
Sir Walter Byne, priest, was inst., 15 Oct.; Patrons, the Abbat and Convent of Sherborne; 161^b.

SHEBBEAR [Scheffbiare and Scheffbeare,—margin, Seftbeare, MS.], Vicars of—

Martin de Salteumbe, priest, was inst., 29 May, 1309; Patrons, the Abbat and Convent of Torre; 41.—Vacant "a die Sabbati proxima post Festum Decollacionis Sancti Johannis Baptiste" (4 Sept.), 1311; and *Jordan de Walcedoune* was inst., 24 Sept.; Patrons, not mentioned; 64.—Vacant "a die Mercurii in Festo Sancti Stephani, Prothomartiris (26 Dec.), 1313; and, 27 Jan., 1313-14,
Sir Robert de Pyworthi, priest, was inst.; Patrons, the same; 82.

SHELDON [Schildene, MS.], Vicars of—

Sir John de Aylesbeare exchanged, for Farringdon, with *Sir Richard de Schillond*, inst., 1 Oct., 1318; Patrons, the Abbat and Convent of Dunkswell; 131. He resigned by letter, dated Exeter—"die Martis proxima post Festum Sancti Martini, Episcopi" (13 Nov.), 1319; and
