(1) You are to correspond with the collectors and officers of the revenue and to that purpose to reside at Belfast till further order. (2) To receive monthly accounts from each collector and thereupon instantly to give a constant account thereof to the Vice-Treasurer or Receiver General of Ireland, so that he may issue his orders for drawing the balances out of the said collectors' hands.
