William Crouch's Declaration

For the purpose of obtaining the benefits of the act, entitled, "an act for the relief of certain deserving Officers and Soldiers of the army of the Revolution," approved the 15th of May 1828, I William Crouch of Goodland in the County of Goodland in the State of Virginia do hereby declare that I enlisted in the year 1780 or early in the year 1781 in the Revolutionary service of my country against Great Britain for and served to the end of the War and was commanded at the close thereof by Captain Thomas Parker of I believe the 2d Va Regt of Continental establishment and recd my discharge from him first ago about the last of the year 1782 or the beginning of the year 1783: which discharge is either lost or mislaid.
