Thank you for your December 2015 submission to the Daughters of the American Revolution's Corrections Team concerning patriot Nathaniel Parker A087729. We have reviewed the documentation you submitted calling into question the identity of Nathaniel's first wife and the lineage of his established children John and Susan.

First, you will be pleased to know that we have determined conclusively that John Parker A087617, the husband of Mary Rogers, is not the son of Nathaniel Parker. As Nathaniel's son John was alive when Nathaniel wrote his will in 1811, he could not be the man who died in 1801! We also found the transcript you submitted of Thomas Scott's 1851 family account very useful, and we have retained it for our records. Thank you for bringing this valuable document to our attention.

As for Nathaniel's first wife and Susan, we have also determined that the documents you submitted, especially the Scott account, call into serious question Ann Clayton as Nathaniel's first wife and mother of his children, as well as the identification of Nathaniel's daughter Susan/Susannah with the wife of John Daughetee. Future applicants will have to prove that this information is correct before new papers through this line can be accepted.

Once again, thank you for your assistance in bringing these discrepancies to our attention. Your efforts have helped increase the accuracy of our database, and given us access to an interesting and valuable resource.
