I John Keller of Hellam Township York County & State of Pennsylvania being in a weak state of health but of sound mind and memory -- do make this my last will and testament I give and bequeath unto my Wife Mary Keller all the plantation whereon I now live during her Natural life together with all my personal property she paying all my just debts, after my Wifes decease it is my will that the place be sold and the money arising therefrom to be ~~Equally~~ divided in the manner following. My Son John Keller to Receive one fifth part. My Daughter Mary Keller to Receive one fifth part My Daughter Margaret Keller to Receive one fifth part My Son Samuel Keller to Receive one fifth part & My Son Christian Keller Children to Receive one fifth part ~~to~~ to be paid to them as soon as they are of age ~~except~~

twenty pounds which is to be paid to the said  
Christian Keller as soon as the place is sold—  
I give and bequeath all the remaining  
part of my Real Estate Equally amongst my

three Sons John, Christian & Samuel Keller  
and further I do appoint My Wife Mary Keller  
and John Ruby Executor of this my last will  
and Testament Witness my hand & this  
Sixth day of January 1802—
