We are desirous as granddaughters of Benjamin Peachy, to have a transcript from your office showing that he was on the pension roll of the United States as a soldier of the Revolution, to file with the local Little Rock Chapter, D. A. R. (Daughters of American Revolution). with our membership application.

His first enlistment was in the spring of 1777 when he was assigned to the New Jersey regiment, commanded by Colonel Israel Shreve, later in the First Battalion of the Cumberland County, New Jersey Militia. Finally in the New Jersey Continental Line where he remained until the close of the war.

He was engaged in the battles of Elizabethtown, Monmouth, Yorktown and in numerous skirmishes. He was in the heroic band whose endurance and bravery during the terrible winter at Valley Forge were the preservation of the Continental Army.

Please give us the information or direct us to the proper channel to which we are to apply.



Madam:

I advise you from the papers in the Revolutionary War pension claim S. 35552, it appears that Benjamin Paechey or Peachy was born in December 1756 or 1757, place not stated.

He enlisted in the state of New Jersey in the spring of 1777 and served as a private at various times under Lieutenant David Moore, Captains Beast ley, Cum ings, Wooley in Cakonel Israel Shreve's Second New Jersey Regiment, he was in the battles of Monmouth, Elizabethtown, Bergen Point, and was at the execution of Major Andre, served in all about two years.

He was allowed pension on his application executed May 15, 1818, while a resident of Mason County, Kentucky.

In 1830 he was living in Fleming County, Ken-

tucky, and referred to his wife, her name and age not given, and to a granddaughter, Lydia Peachy, who was then elemen years old.

A son, Benjamin Peachy lived in Daviess County, Indiana in 1823, and the soldier was living there in 1826. Other sons are referred to, but their names are not mentioned.
