Joseph and Mary Ann (Coburn) Spencer of Peacham, q. v. (POP p. 281). He m. 2nd March 8, 1863 Mary G. Craig (b. Glasgow, Scotland Oct. 19, 1835; d. Barnet Jan. 21, 1900) dau. Mathew M. and Mary (Gentiles) Craig of Scotland and Peacham. He d. Peacham Apr. 15, 1897. All three bur. Peacham [gs].

Farmer on homestead known as "Fairview" at the mouth of Joe's Brook in East Barnet where Stahler later lived q. v. (p. 534) and worked many years on the B.&M.R.R. as a bridge carpenter.
