CRADOCK SENIORS TO PRESENT ANNUAL PLAY FRIDAY NIGHT ENGINEER FORCE PREPARES FIGURES ON BRIDGE WORK

"Kicked Out of College" Will Be Offered in School Auditorium

Makes Estimates for City Manager On City Park and Leckie Street Structures

"Kicked Out of College," annual senior class play of Cradock High School, will be presented in the high school auditorium Friday, May 2.

The city engineering force is busily engaged preparing plans and specifications for redecking the City Park bridge and constructing a bridge to extend Leckie street into Shea terrace over an arm of Scotts Creek. City Manager Hanrahan announced yesterday.

The story revolves about the escapades of a young college fellow, Bootsie Benson, who is so busy with his inventions and other activities that he attends class only twice during the year. Consequently he is expelled, and his irate father demands that he settle down and get married immediately. He promises his son \$200 a month if his wishes are granted. In attempting to pacify his father Bootsie converts his roommate, Tad Cheselaine, into a charming bride. Then the deception and the fun begins, and at times it is not clear whether he has three wives or one.

Mr. Hanrahan was authorized by the City Council last Tuesday night to solicit bids on these projects so that the council will have something definite to proceed upon in regards to appropriations.

Emma Haines and Ed Harmon play the leading roles. They are supported by the following cast: Virginia Hurdle of Estle Ruth Rollins, Isabelle Weston, Priscilla Hines, Madeline Creamer, Alice Howard, Shirley Still, Lloyd Jordan, Marvin Grimes, Percy Blackwell, Harry Weaver, Henry Jacobs, James Turner, Robinson Staples, Elmer Litchfield and Bill Pringle.

While the two projects will be advertised coincidentally, Mr. Hanrahan said they will be separate and distinct and contractors will be asked to submit individual bids.

A matinee production for children will be given in the afternoon. The play provides excellent comedy parts in the Irish Negro and jealous wife roles. These and the songs are sufficient to make this three-act comedy a success. A full evening of entertainment will be provided and a large crowd is anticipated. Tickets may be obtained from members of the class.

The council has ascertained that sufficient funds are available in the cemetery funds for repaving the City Park bridge, which affords the only approach to Olive Branch Cemetery. In respect to the Leckie street bridge, the council some time ago took the attitude that the bridge was "cut for in annexation proceedings and that while little money was available for such work at the present time, property values in Shea terrace and vicinity would be so improved as to justify the expenditure.
