Dear Alex Calzareth:

This is in response to your Freedom of Information Act/Privacy Act (FOIA/PA) request received in this office February 2, 2007, regarding the subject: Herbert Baer.

We have completed the review of all documents responsive to your request and have identified 8 pages which are responsive to your request. Enclosed are 7 pages released in their entirety, and 1 page released in part. We have reviewed and have determined to release all information except those portions, which are exempt pursuant to 5 U.S.C. § 552 (b)(2) and (b)(7)(C) of the FOIA.

The following exemptions are applicable:

Exemption (b)(2) provides protection for records that are related solely to the internal personnel rules and practices of an agency. The types of documents and/or information that we have withheld under this exemption may relate to internal matters of a relatively trivial nature, such as internal personnel rules and practices which could consist of employee identification codes, computer login codes, policies regarding the use of parking facilities and break rooms, employee leave policies and dress codes or internal matters of a more substantial nature, the disclosure of which would risk circumvention of a legal requirement, such as operating rules, guidelines and manuals of procedures for examiners or adjudicators.

Exemption (b)(7)(C) provides protection for personal information in law enforcement records, which could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy. We have withheld various information relating to third-party individuals. The types of documents and/or information that we have withheld could consist of names, addresses, identification numbers, telephone numbers, fax numbers, or various other documents that are considered personal.

The enclosed copies provided are the best reproducible copies available. Old documents/records such as these are maintained on microfilm and the quality of the image is dependent on the condition of the original document when it was filmed.

In the event you wish to appeal this determination, you may write to the USCIS FOIA/PA Appeals Office, 111 Massachusetts Ave., NW, 2nd Floor, Washington, DC 20529, within 60 days of receipt of this letter. Both the letter and the envelope should be clearly marked "Freedom of Information Act Appeal."

Please be advised that the National Records Center does not process petitions, applications or any other type of benefit under the Immigration and Nationality Act. If you have any questions or wish to submit documentation relating to a matter pending with the agency, you must address these issues with your nearest District Office.

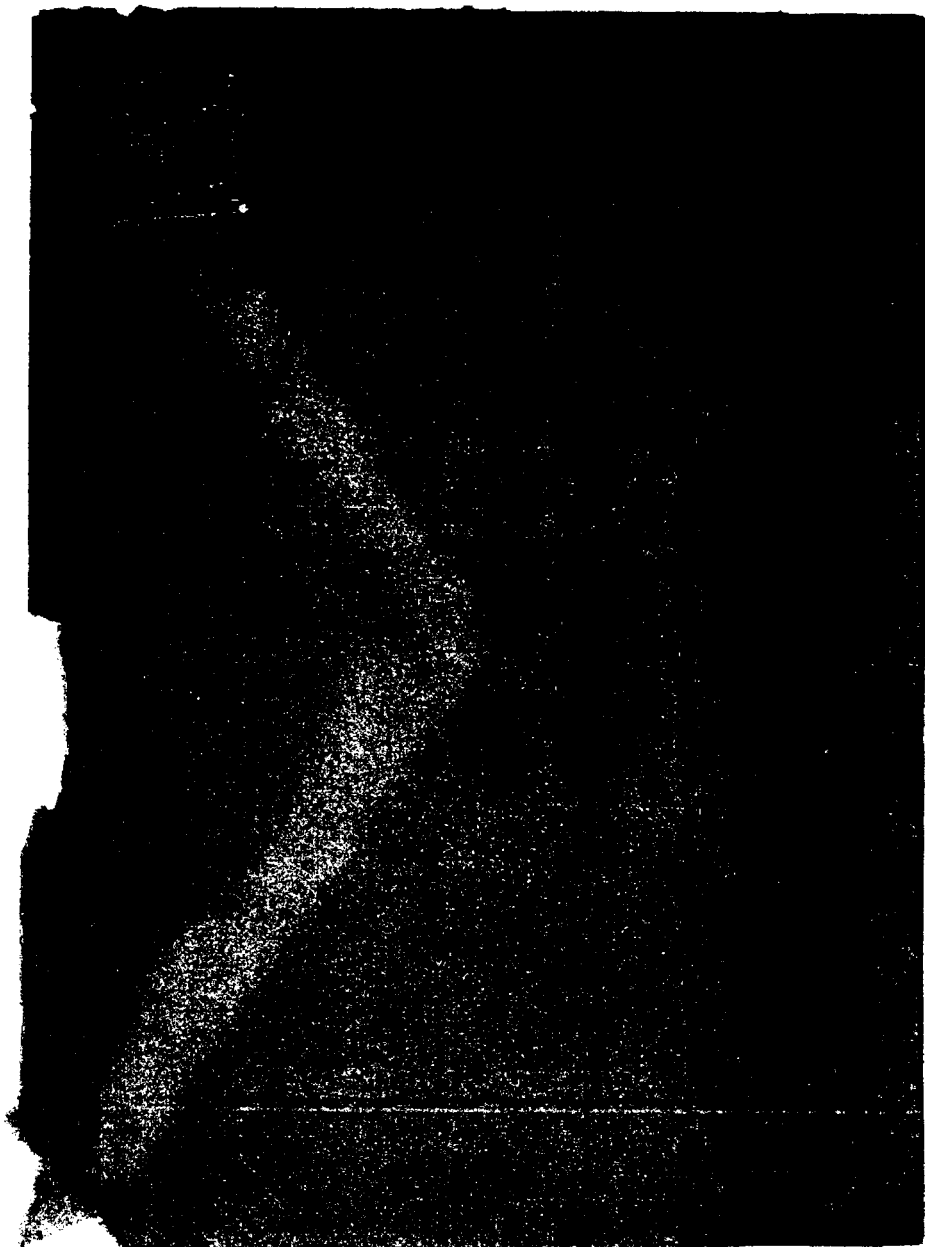

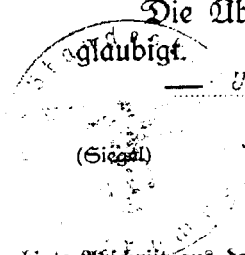

I, the undersigned APPLICANT FOR AN IMMIGRATION VISA, being duly sworn, state that my full and true name is
Herbert Julius BAER ; that I am 37 years of age, of the male sex and
Hebrew race; that I was born on the 28 day of July 1903
at Untergrombach, Baden, Germany. ; that since reaching the age of 14 years I have resided at the following
places, during the periods stated, to wit:
Germany from birth to June 1939.
England from 1939 to date.

That I am (married) and the name of my (wife) is Hedwig Baer nee Behr , who was born
at Leimersheim, Peltinate, Germany ; and resides at 4 St. John's Street, Oxford.
That the names, dates of birth, and places of residence of my minor children are:
Leonora Baer b. September 30, 1935.

That my calling or occupation is Lawyer/Gardener ; that my height is 5 feet and 4 inches; my complexion
medium ; color of hair, black ; color of eyes, grey ; and that I bear the following marks of identification:

English and German ; and (able) to write the English & German lang.

That my port of embarkation is uncertain ; that I shall enter the United States at the port
of New York ; that my final destination beyond such port is New York ; and
that I do have a ticket through to such destination; that my passage was paid for by myself

That my purpose in going to the United States is residence , and I intend to remain permanently
that I have not been in prison or almshouse; that I have not been in an institution or hospital for the care and treatment
of the insane; that my (father) (has) not been in an institution or hospital for the care and treatment of the insane; that I have not
applied for an immigration or passport visa at any American consulate, either formally or informally.

That, except as hereafter noted, I am not a member of any one of the following classes of individuals excluded from admission to the United States under the Immigration laws: (1) Idiots; (2) imbeciles; (3) feeble-minded; (4) epileptics; (5) insane persons; (6) persons having had previous attacks of insanity; (7) persons with constitutional psychopathic inferiority; (8) persons with chronic alcoholism; (9) paupers; (10) professional beggars; (11) vagrants; (12) persons afflicted with tuberculosis; (13) persons afflicted with a loathsome or dangerous contagious disease; (14) criminals; (15) polygamists; (16) anarchists; (17) persons who believe in or advocate the overthrow by force or violence of the Government of the United States; (18) persons inadmissible under the provisions of section 2 of the act of February 5, 1917; (19) persons inadmissible under the provisions of the act entitled "An Act to Exclude and Expel from the United States Aliens who are Members of the Anarchistic and Similar Classes", approved October 16, 1918, as amended by the act approved June 5, 1920; (20) prostitutes; (21) procurers; (22) contract laborers; (23) persons likely to become public charges; (24) persons previously deported or ordered deported and permitted to leave the United States voluntarily in lieu of deportation; (25) persons previously excluded from admission to the United States at a port of entry; (26) persons whose passage paid by another; (27) unaccompanied children; (28) natives of Asiatic barred zone; (29) illiterates; (30) aliens ineligible to citizenship; or (31) persons repatriated at the expense of the U. S. Government.

That I claim to be exempt from exclusion on account of the class or classes noted above, for the reasons following, to wit:

That I am the father, mother, or husband by marriage occurring after July 1, 1922, of
unmarried child under 21 years of age
who is a citizen
as an alien resident, lawfully admitted for permanent residence, of the United States,
resides at

That because of the relationship aforesaid I am entitled to and claim the preference provided for in paragraph (2) of Subdivision (a) of Section 6 of the Immigration Act of 1924, as amended.

That I am the wife of
the dependent child under 18 years of a skilled agriculturalist and entitled to and claim preference provided for in paragraph (1) of Sub-division (a) of Section 6 of the Immigration Act of 1924, as amended.

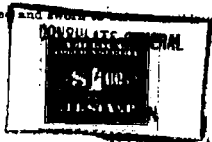
That I am aware that the Deportation Act of March 4, 1929, provides in part that an alien who enters the United States in an illegal manner, or who studies examination or inspection by immigration officials, or who obtains entry to the United States by a willfully false or misleading representation or willful concealment of a material fact shall be punishable by fine or imprisonment, or both; and that the Immigration Act of 1924 provides in part that a person who knowingly makes under oath any false statement in any application, affidavit, or other document required by the immigration laws or regulations issued thereunder shall be punishable by fine or imprisonment, or both.
