Dear Alex Calzareth:

This is in response to your Freedom of Information Act/Privacy Act (FOIA/PA) request received in this office August 4, 2006, regarding the subject: Ylse Brieger.

We have completed the review of all documents responsive to your request and have identified 27 pages which are responsive to your request. Enclosed are 26 pages released in their entirety, and 1 page released in part. We have reviewed and have determined to release all information except those portions that are exempt pursuant to 5 U.S.C. § 552 (b)(2) and (b)(6) of the FOIA.

The following exemptions are applicable:

Exemption (b)(2) provides protection for records that are related solely to the internal personnel rules and practices of an agency. The types of documents and/or information we have withheld under this exemption may relate to internal matters of a relatively trivial nature, such as internal personnel rules and practices which could consist of employee identification codes, computer login codes, policies regarding the use of parking facilities and breakrooms, employee leave policies and dress codes or internal matters of a more substantial nature, the disclosure of which would risk circumvention of a legal requirement, such as operating rules, guidelines and manuals of procedures for examiners or adjudicators.

Exemption (b)(6) permits the government to withhold all information about individuals in personnel, medical and similar files where the disclosure of such information would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy. The types of documents and/or information withheld may consist of birth certificates, naturalization certificates, drivers license, social security numbers, home addresses, dates of birth, or various other documents and/or information belonging to a third party that are considered personal.

The enclosed record consists of the best reproducible copies available.

In the event you wish to appeal this determination, you may write to the USCIS FOIA/PA Appeals Office, 150 Space Center Loop, Suite 500, Lee's Summit, MO 64064-2139, within 60 days of the date of this letter. Both the letter and the envelope should be clearly marked "Freedom of Information Act Appeal."

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Please be advised that the National Records Center does not process petitions, applications or any other type of benefit under the Immigration and Nationality Act. If you have questions or wish to submit documentation relating to a matter pending with the bureau, you must address these issues with your nearest District Office.

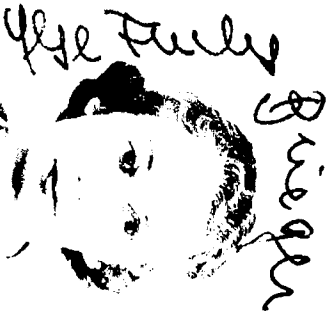

1. **Execution of this application, if applicant 18 years of age or over.**—If you are 18 years of age or over, you must sign your full name in the space provided on page 3 of the application but do not execute the affidavit on page 4. This affidavit will be executed for you when you appear before an officer of the Immigration and Naturalization Service at the hearing on the application.

2. **Execution of this application, if applicant under 18 years of age.**—If you are under 18 years of age, do not sign the application on page 3 or the affidavit on page 4. Your parent or guardian must sign his or her name in the space provided on page 3 and must later appear before an officer of the Immigration and Naturalization Service at the hearing on the application to execute the affidavit on page 4.

3. **Fee.**—A fee in the amount of \$5 must accompany this application. The remittance should be drawn in favor of the "Commissioner of Immigration and Naturalization," unless you are residing in the Virgin Islands of the United States. In the latter case, the remittance should be drawn in favor of the "Commissioner of Finance of the Virgin Islands." If the remittance is made in the form of a money order, have the money order drawn to the order of the Commissioner of Immigration and Naturalization on the postmaster in the city where the application is to be filed. 

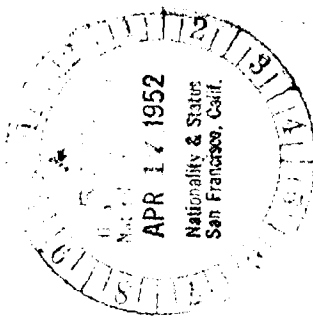
