Dear Alex Calzareth:

This is in response to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request received in this office April 18, 2006, regarding the subject: Karl Herbst.

We have completed the review of all documents and have identified 19 pages responsive to your request. Enclosed are 15 pages in their entirety, and 4 pages in part pursuant to 5 U.S.C. 552 (b)(6) and (b)(7)(C) of the FOIA. Please note that you are receiving the best reproducible copies available. The basis for the deletions in part is as follows:

Freedom of Information Act 5 U.S.C. 552 (b)(6)

Exemption (b)(6) permits the government to withhold all information about individuals in personnel, medical and similar files where the disclosure of such information would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy. The types of documents and/or information withheld may consist of birth certificates, naturalization certificates, drivers license, social security numbers, home addresses, dates of birth, or various other documents and/or information belonging to a third party that are considered personal.

Freedom of Information Act 5 U.S.C. 552(b)(7)(C)

Exemption (b)(7)(C) provides protection for personal information in law enforcement records, which could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy. The types of documents and/or information that we have withheld could consist of names, addresses, identification numbers, telephone numbers, fax numbers, or various other documents that are considered personal.

In the event you wish to appeal this determination, you may write to the USCIS FOIA/PA Appeals Office, 111 Massachusetts Ave., NW, 2nd Floor, Washington, DC 20529, within 60 days of receipt of this letter. Both the letter and the envelope should be clearly marked "Freedom of Information Act Appeal." Please be advised that the National Records Center does not process any type of petition/application or any other benefit under the Immigration and Nationality Act. 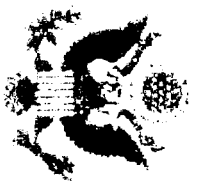

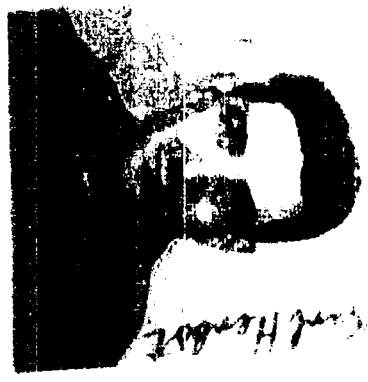

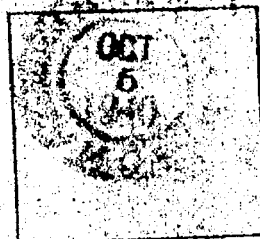
