

INFORMATION AND INSTRUCTIONS

1. **APPLICATION -- FORM N-585.** Persons desiring a search of the records of this Service shall submit this application executed as fully as possible. The specific purpose for which information is desired must be set forth.

2. **CONSENT REQUIRED.** The subject of a Service record may consent in writing to another person's obtaining information to which the subject would be entitled. A block is provided in the application form where such consent is shown. Information from visa petitions may be furnished upon application of the petitioner or beneficiary but an application by a third person requires the petitioner's written consent.

3. **FEES. (a) Searches.** A single fee of \$3.00 shall be charged for a search of the records of the Immigration and Naturalization Service. The fee is required for the search and is not returnable. When the information requested relates to two or more persons, groups, or things, the search for each is a separate service and an additional fee or fees shall be submitted.

(b) **Copies and Certifications.** A fee of 25 cents per page, with a minimum fee of 50 cents, shall be paid for copies of Service records but no charge (other than the basic search fee of \$3.00) shall be required for the first page of a record. An additional fee of \$1.00 is required for a certification under seal.

(c) **Manner of Submission.** If this application is mailed DO NOT SEND CASH. Attach a check or a United States postal money order (or, if outside the United States, an international money order) made payable to "Immigration and Naturalization Service, Department of Justice." An applicant residing in the U.S. Virgin Islands shall make his remittance payable to "Commissioner of Finance of the Virgin Islands" and if residing in Guam to "Treasurer, Guam."

4. **CERTIFICATION OF NATURALIZATION RECORDS.** A certification of any part of a court naturalization record, or of any certificate of naturalization or citizenship, may be obtained if required for compliance with any law, or if needed in any judicial proceeding. Application for such certification should include a statement of the relevant statute, or the nature of the judicial proceedings and the court in which pending.

5. **NATURALIZATION RECORDS.** If naturalization occurred prior to September 27, 1906, the subject's place of residence at the time of naturalization must be furnished. Such records rarely contain information regarding members of the naturalized person's family.

6. **ARRIVAL RECORDS.** Records of arrival prior to July 1, 1924 do not contain birthdates but merely show age stated at time of entry.

7. **CERTIFICATE OF BIRTH DATA FROM IMMIGRATION AND NATURALIZATION RECORDS.** A certification of birth data from the records of this Service may be issued to foreign-born children under twenty-one years of age for a fee of \$3.00. The parent, guardian or other adult having a legitimate interest in a person who is under fourteen years of age may file an application on such person's behalf.

However, you will be required to present these cards when you appear to file your petition for naturalization and to surrender them at the time you are admitted to citizenship. You should therefore carefully save your Immigrant Identification Card and your Alien Registration Receipt Card.

Photographs.—You are required to send with this application three photographs of yourself taken within 30 days of the date of this application. These photographs must be 2 by 2 inches in size, and the distance from top of head to point of chin should be approximately 1 1/4 inches. They must *not* be pasted on the cards or mounted in any other way, must be on thin paper, have a light background, and clearly show a front view of your face without hat. Snapshots, group or full-length portraits will not be accepted. Both of these photographs must be signed by you on the margin and not on the face or the clothing.

Date of Your Arrival.—If you do not know the exact date of your arrival in the United States, or the name of the vessel or port, and you cannot obtain this information by consulting your family or friends who came over with you, give the facts of your arrival as you remember them in the appropriate blank spaces on the first page of this form. Your Immigrant Identification Card or your passport, ship's card, or baggage labels, if you have them, may help you to answer these questions.

If the date of your arrival in the United States was on or before June 29, 1906, you should submit with this application documentary evidence of your residence in the United States prior to that date. Such documents may be family Bible entries, deeds of record, wills or other authentic legal documents, life insurance policies, bank books and records, employment records or other documents showing that you entered the United States on or before June 29, 1906. Do not submit such documents if your arrival in the United States was after June 29, 1906.

Absence from the United States.—In statement No. 5 on page 1 of this form, show *ALL* of your absences from the United States, regardless of how long you were away. In statement No. 12 on page 3, show only your absences which were for 6 or more months. Absence from the United States for more than 6 months but less than 1 year during the periods of continuous residence required in the United States may break the continuity of your residence for naturalization purposes. An absence from the United States of 1 year or more during such periods will break the continuity of your residence for naturalization purposes, except that after you have resided in the United States for at least 1 year and have filed a declaration of intention, if your absence abroad is made necessary because you are an employee of the United States Government, an American institution of research, or an American firm or corporation engaged in foreign trade and commerce of the United States, you may prevent a break in the continuity of your residence for naturalization purposes by making an application on Form N-470. For complete information you should address the office of this Service nearest to you, or the "Commissioner of Immigration and Naturalization, Philadelphia, Pa."

Nationality and Race.—Nationality in statement No. 6, page 3, refers to the country of which you are a citizen or subject. As to "race" in the same statement, Section 303 of the Nationality Act of 1940 provides that only white persons, persons of African nativity or descent, and descendants of races indigenous to the Western Hemisphere are eligible for naturalization. There are certain exceptions, in the case of native-born Filipinos who have served honorably in the United States Army, Navy, Marine Corps, or Coast Guard for a period of at least 3 years, and in the cases of women who have lost citizenship through marriage.

That, except as hereafter noted, I am not a member of any one of the following classes of individuals excluded from admission to the United States under the immigration laws: (1) Idiots; (2) imbeciles; (3) feeble-minded; (4) epileptics; (5) insane persons; (6) persons having had previous attacks of insanity; (7) persons with constitutional psychopathic inferiority; (8) persons with chronic alcoholism; (9) paupers; (10) professional beggars; (11) vagrants; (12) persons afflicted with tuberculosis; (13) persons afflicted with a loathsome or dangerous contagious disease; (14) criminals; (15) polygamists; (16) anarchists; (17) persons who believe in or advocate the overthrow by force or violence of the Government of the United States; (18) persons inadmissible under the provisions of section 3 of the act of February 5, 1917; (19) persons inadmissible under the provisions of the act entitled "An Act to Exclude and Expel from the United States Aliens who are Members of the Anarchistic and Similar Classes"; approved October 16, 1918, as amended by the act approved June 5, 1920; (20) prostitutes; (21) procurers; (22) contract laborers; (23) persons likely to become public charges; (24) persons previously deported or ordered deported and permitted to leave the United States voluntarily in lieu of deportation; (25) persons previously excluded from admission to the United States at a port of entry; (26) persons whose passage paid by another; (27) unaccompanied children; (28) natives of Asiatic barred zone; (29) illiterates; (30) aliens ineligible to citizenship; or (31) persons repatriated at the expense of the U. S. Government

That I claim to be exempt from exclusion on account of the class or classes noted above, for the reasons following, to wit: no. 26 That ~~xxxxxxx~~ my passage is being paid for by my uncle, Mr. Alfred Wurzburger, and I am not otherwise excludable.

That I am the father, mother, or husband by marriage occurring after July 1, 1927, of _____ years of age, and who is an alien resident, lawfully admitted for permanent residence, of the United States, _____ resides at _____ (City, State, street, and number)

That because of the relationship aforesaid I am entitled to and claim the preference provided for in paragraph 2 of Subdivision (a) of Section 6 of the Immigration Act of 1924, as amended.

That I am the wife of _____ a skilled agriculturalist and entitled to and claim preference provided for in paragraph (1) of Subdivision (a) of Section 6 of the Immigration Act of 1924, as amended.

That I am aware that the Deportation Act of March 4, 1929, provides in part that an alien who enters the United States in an illegal manner, or who eludes examination or inspection by immigration officials, or who obtains entry to the United States by a willfully false or misleading representation or willful concealment of a material fact shall be punishable by fine or imprisonment, or both; and that the Immigration Act of 1924 provides in part that a person who knowingly makes under each any false statement in any application, affidavit, or other document required by the immigration laws or regulations issued thereunder shall be punishable by fine or imprisonment, or both.

Available documents required by the Immigration Act of 1924, as amended, are filed herewith and made part hereof, as follows:

WHEREFORE, I apply for an Immigration Visa as a quota immigrant, pursuant to the provisions of the Immigration Act of 1924, as amended.
