Dear Alex Calzareth:

This is in response to your Freedom of Information Act/Privacy Act (FOIA/PA) request received in this office August 4, 2006, regarding the subject: Betty Maier.

We regret to inform you that we were unable to locate the Alien file. Although lost/missing files constitute a small percentage of our statistics, unfortunately, it does occur. We have located two (2) index cards consisting of two (2) pages and have processed that record. Enclosed are two (2) pages released in part. We have reviewed and have determined to release all information except those portions that are exempt pursuant to 5 U.S.C. § 552 (b)(2) of the FOIA.

The following exemptions are applicable:

Exemption (b)(2) provides protection for records that are related solely to the internal personnel rules and practices of an agency. The types of documents and/or information we have withheld under this exemption may relate to internal matters of a relatively trivial nature, such as internal personnel rules and practices which could consist of employee identification codes, computer login codes, policies regarding the use of parking facilities and break rooms, employee leave policies and dress codes or internal matters of a more substantial nature, the disclosure of which would risk circumvention of a legal requirement, such as operating rules, guidelines and manuals of procedures for examiners or adjudicators.

The enclosed record consists of the best reproducible copies available. Old documents/records such as these are maintained on microfilm and the quality of the image is dependent on the condition of the original document when it was filmed.

In the event you wish to appeal this determination, you may write to the USCIS FOIA/PA Appeals Office, 150 Space Center Loop, Suite 500, Lee's Summit, MO 64064-2139, within 60 days of the date of this letter. Both the letter and the envelope should be clearly marked "Freedom of Information Act Appeal."

Please be advised that the National Records Center does not process petitions, applications or any other type of benefit under the Immigration and Nationality Act. If you have questions or wish to submit documentation relating to a matter pending with the bureau, you must address these issues with your nearest District Office.
