The question presented is whether the petitioner has established good moral character during the period required by law, that is, since December 3, 1940, as contemplated by Section 307(a) of the Nationality Act of 1940.

The evidence of record discloses that from December, 1938, until March 20, 1946, the petitioner lived with his present wife while they were unmarried, and indulged in sexual relations. The facts, findings, and conclusions contained in the field office report are hereby adopted.

It is the recommendation of this Service that the petition of Felix Rafael be denied on the ground that he has failed to establish good moral character during the period required by law. All of the foregoing facts, findings, and conclusions are to be called to the attention of the court.

Temporary absence from the place of your permanent residence need not be reported as a change of address. A change of permanent dwelling place must be reported by non-citizens, who have been admitted to the United States for permanent residence, within five days after such change takes place.

Aliens who have not been admitted to the United States for permanent residence (including visitors for pleasure or business, students admitted temporarily and aliens whose residence in this country is unlawful) are required to report their addresses to this office every three months, regardless of whether there has been a change of residence.

In the case of an alien under 14 years of age, his parent or guardian is responsible for the submission of required address reports in behalf of such a child.

Whenever an alien has occasion to submit an address report, it should be done on Form AR-11, available at any United States post office.
