That my purpose in going to the United States is **residence**, and I intend to remain **indefinitely** (Permanently or length of time)

That, except as hereafter noted, I am not a member of any one of the following classes of individuals excluded from admission to the United States under the immigration laws: (1) Idiots; (2) Imbeciles; (3) Feeble-minded; (4) Epileptics;

(5) Insane persons; (6) Persons having had previous attacks of insanity; (7) Persons with constitutional psychopathic inferiority; (8) Persons with chronic alcoholism; (9) Paupers; (10) Professional beggars; (11) Vagrants; (12) Persons afflicted with tuberculosis; (13) Persons afflicted with a loathsome or dangerous contagious disease; (14) Criminals; (15) Polygamists; (16) Anarchists; (17) Members of unlawful organizations; (18) Prostitutes; (19) Procurers; (20) Contract laborers; (21) Persons likely to become public charges; (22) Persons previously deported or ordered deported and permitted to leave the United States voluntarily in lieu of deportation; (23) Persons previously excluded from admission to the United States at a port of entry; (24) Persons whose passage paid by another; (25) Unaccompanied children; (26) Natives of Asiatic barred zone; (27) Illiterates; or (28) Aliens ineligible to citizenship.

That I claim to be exempt from exclusion on account of the class numbered (---), noted above, for the reasons following, to wit:

That I claim to be a Nonquota Immigrant, as defined by Section 4 of the Immigration Act of 1924, as amended, and the facts on which such claim is based are as follows, to wit: **Non-Quota status authorized by the Department of Labor according telegram from Department of State of February 16, 1940.**

That I am aware that Section 1 (a) of the Deportation Act of March 4, 1929, provides in part that the entry or attempted entry to the United States of an alien who has been arrested and deported from the United States in pursuance of law shall be a felony punishable by imprisonment for not more than two years or by fine of not more than \$1,000, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

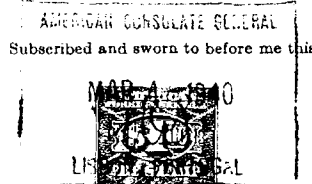
That I am also aware that Section 2 of the Act just cited provides that any alien who enters the United States at any time or place other than as designated by immigration officials or eludes examination or inspection by immigration officials, or obtains entry to the United States by a willfully false or misleading representation or the willful concealment of a material fact, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction, shall be punished by imprisonment for not more than one year or by a fine of not more than \$1,000, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Available documents required by the Immigration Act of 1924, as amended, are filed herewith and made part hereof, as follows: **Birth certificate, police record, marriage certificate and medical certificate.**

WHEREFORE, I apply for an Immigration Visa as a Nonquota Immigrant pursuant to the provisions of the Immigration Act of 1924, as amended.

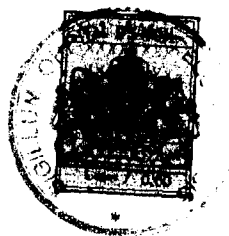
