 prayinge for grace in his behalfe that whatsoever he hath received he may  
 use and improve it as received of the Lord and may endeavour with all  
 his might to waite and advance in his owne spirit and in the hearts of all  
 the glory of god the fountain of grace and blessing and to promote the  
 uttall good of others especially of soules. And I doe make and ordaine my  
 said wife Marye Jozth and my said sonne Elisha Jozth joint exors and A letting  
 of this my last will and testament requiringe them to see the same duly  
 executed and performed and to see my daughter religiously educated  
 and trained to observe the charge of the Lord of the land god and his sonne  
 Jesus Christ in his holy word and my charge herein. And I doe desire my  
 lovinge friends M<sup>r</sup> Marmaduke Tenant M<sup>r</sup> William Frowler M<sup>r</sup>  
 Lawrence Drinley and M<sup>r</sup> Thomas Underhill to be helpinge and assisting  
 my said wife and sonne by their best advise and counsell in the execution  
 of this my last will. And I doe hereby revoke all former wills and testame  
 nts herebefore sealed or declared and my will is that these presents  
 shall stand for and be my last will and testament in witness whereof I  
 have severally subscribed my name and set my seal the day and yeere first  
 above written. Richard Jozth sealed subscribed and declared and  
 delivered by the said Richard Jozth as and for his last will and

 to whom was committed administration of all and singular the goods  
 chattels and debts of the said deceased they beinge first legally sworn

 and bequeth unto my daughter Mary sonne twenty poundes to be  
 paid at her marriage day if her mother and her brother doe thinke the

 paim Item I give to my daughter Ann sonne eight poundes to be paid  
 at her marriage day if her mother doe like of the matter Item I give and  
 bequeth to my daughter Joan sonne twenty shillings to be paid after

 unto my sonne in law Thomas Zeady twenty shillings Item I give and  
 bequeth to my sonne in law William Burour twenty shillings Item I give  
 and bequeth to Aldam the summe of William Burour twenty shillings to be  
 paid when he shall accomplish the age of one and twenty yeares Item I give  
 and bequeth to William the sonne of William Burour twenty shillings  
 to be paid when hee shall accomplish the age of one and twenty yeares And  
 my will is that after my wife's decease my sonne William and my sonne  
 Thomas should have the residue of all such goods and chattells which my wife  
 had, all legacies paid and managed, paid and disbursed I give and bequeth  
 the same wholly unto my wife whom I ordaine and make the whole only and  
 sole executrix of this my last will and testament And I intreate my trustie  
 and well beloved friends in Christ John Whitworth and Gabriel Lovell  
 to be and stand overseers of this my last will and testament and for their  
 care and paines herein I give unto each of them two shillings a pice in  
 money In witness et. Ceterum Aldam sonne this writing above said  
 was by the Testator Aldam sonne on the day and year above written  
 published to be his last will and testament and by him also sealed &  
 signed in the presence of John Whitworth & Gabriel Lovell.

The eight day of January in the year of our Lord god one thousand  
 six hundred fifty one English stile there issued forth a Commission to  
 Thomas sonne the naturall and lawfull sonne of Aldam sonne  
 late of Broad Bondyford in the County of Wiltshire deceased having good  
 the Jurisdiction of the Prerogative Court to administer the goods  
 and chattells and debts of the said deceased according to the tenor and effect of
