THE ORDER FOR THE BAPTISM OF ADULTS

(The minister addresses the congregation after those to be baptized have come to the altar. He then gives a prayer, and reads a scripture.)

(The minister then addresses the persons to be baptized, saying:

Dearly beloved, who have come hither desiring to receive Holy Baptism, the congregation gives thanks to God for your coming, and prays that the Holy Spirit may dwell within you, and that your faith may not fail. In the hearing of this congregation you should now make known your purpose to accept the obligations of this holy Sacrament.

Do you truly repent of your sins and accept and confess Jesus Christ as your Savior and Lord?

"I DO"

Will you earnestly endeavor to keep God's holy will and commandments?

"I WILL"

Do you desire to be baptized in this faith?

"I DO"

(Here the people will kneel for baptism. The minister will ask for the first name of each person to be baptized; then repeating the name he will say:

I baptize thee in the mame of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. AMEN.

(After baptism these persons are received into the membership of the church).

THE ORDER FOR RECEIVING PERSONS INTO THE CHURCH

(After addressing those to be received the minister askes the following questions:

Do you here in the presence of God and this congregation renew the solemn promise and vow that was made at your baptism?

"I DO"

Do you confess Jesus Christ as your Savior and Lord and pledge your allegiance to his Kingdom?

"I DO"

Do you receive and profess the Christian faith as contained in the New Testament of our Lord Jesus Christ?

"I DO"

Will you be loyal to the Methodist Church, and uphold it by your prayers, your presence, your gifts, and your service?

"I WILL"

(Those being received will again kneel as the minister confirms them with these words:

The Lord defend thee with his heavenly grace and by his Spirit confirm thee in the faith and fellowship of all true disciples of Jesus Christ. AMEN.

((In cases where members are being received by transfer of membership from another church the pastor will read the names of those being transferred at which time they will join those who are already at the altar. The entire group will remain at the altar after the benediction to be welcomed by members of the congregation.)








































































H B is unknown but could be J.N. and Hattie's daughter, Hattie V. (9/15/1891-3/20/1977). Hattie married Sylvester V. (Dude) Maninger (12/16/1890-3/29/1970) on September 7, 1912. They later divorced.




