

HONORS 33 ARMEN.

Aero Club of America Awards Medals to Entente Fliers.

PARIS, July 1, (Correspondence of The Associated Press.)—The Aero Club of America, through its foreign service committee, has awarded the medal of the organization to thirty-three aviators, representing the United States, France, Great Britain, Italy, and Belgium. The medal is of gold elaborately engraved, and almost three inches wide.
