Dated with us and dated the 8th day of August, A. D. One Thousand Eight Hundred and Sixty Six.

The condition of the above obligation is such, that if there be no lawful cause why the said William Price and Miss Martha Boardman should not be joined together in the Holy union of Matrimony, then this obligation to be void: otherwise to remain in full force and virtue.
