Brooks are held and firmly bound unto the State of Alabama in the penal sum of two hundred dollars, for payment of which, well and truly, to be made, we bind ourselves, and each and every of our Heirs, Executors and Administrators, jointly, and severally, firmly, by these presents.

That with due seal and date the 10th day of January, 1889 A. D. and of the 10th Independence of the Confederate States of America the 10th day of January, 1862 year.

The Condition of the above obligation is such, That if George T. Brooks and Melissa J. Brooks shall not be joined together in the Holy Sacrament of Matrimony, then this obligation to be void; otherwise, to remain in full force and virtue.
