Ancestry.com has recently added new databases regarding Jewish servicemen. The originals of the records are kept at the American Jewish Historical Society.

One database, WWII Jewish Servicemen cards, covers the years 1942-1947. There are over 100,000 records and it is searchable by name only.

Another database, WWI Jewish Servicemen Questionnaires, cover the years 1918-1921. Records are searchable by name, residence, birth year and birth place.
