

**Mrs. McCormick  
Called By Death**

**Funeral Services to Be  
Held Saturday.**

Mrs. Julia McCormick, wife of Charles J. McCormick, died at 7:40 o'clock Thursday night at St. Mary's hospital. She was fifty-four years old last February. Her death was caused by pneumonia and complications after an illness of one week.

Mrs. McCormick's maiden name was Julia Joubert. She was born in Craville, Ill., Feb. 8, 1875, and she and Charles J. McCormick were married there April 30, 1892. The home was in Springfield before they moved to Decatur in 1901. She was a member of the First Baptist church, Decatur chapter No. 111, O. E. S., the Royal Neighbors and the American Legion auxiliary.

She was a great lover of flowers and raised many fine specimens at her home. She had more than 100 kinds of flowers in her garden, mostly gladiolus. She was well known in the community.

She is survived by her husband and the following children: Mrs. Ethel Coard, Armarilla, Tex., Mrs. Stella Landholt and Charles F. McCormick of Decatur, and Mrs. Inez Carpenter of Ironwood, Mich. She also leaves two sisters, Mrs. Leonore Buckley of Watchee, Ia., and Mrs. Vittiline Costin of Omaha, Neb. There are six grandchildren. The body was taken to Dawson & Wikoff, funeral directors, and prepared for burial.
