I, Brother L Gillands of the County of Greene and State of Missouri, do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following that is to say - First - I give my will that my funeral expenses, and all of my just debts be fully paid - Second - I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Mary Ann Gillands my servants Harry, Esther, and Joseph, during her life time, or their good behavior to work, or hired for her service, or to the educating our children otherwise she shall sell them, its private sale, or public sale, and the money immediately put to the uses of purchasing of other slaves - and, at her death the ready proceeds shall go to the use and benefit of our heirs - also my plantation she shall have during her natural life time, or widowhood - Also she is to keep up, and repair the fences, houses, stable &c. Also all the household & kitchen furniture Also I leave her three of my horses namely Frank, Blue Eagle, and Queen, and three choice Cows and Calves, Wagons & Oxen, and all of my flock, of Sheep, and One thousand pounds of pork - I want all of hogs fattened that I fit to fatten, and she is to have fifty barrels of corn at the day of sale - In such case must be last of February, or first of March - and she is to have all the farming utensils, and all the stock hogs - She is to have one hundred bushels of wheat if it is raised - She is to run a cross fence along the North side of James' Gillands farm across my field - Also another fence to be commenced on said cross fence, fifty yards below below the South corner of my Timothy lot, and run north to a lone Black Oak in John Griffins farm thence East to the Jonathan - and to commence another cross fence at the draw bar, and run west, across the field - and she is to break the underbrush ground as she can conveniently and now it is in Blue grass and birds grass or clover, and cheffered also all the balance of my property to be sold at the sale - and after allowing just debts in full, the first hundred Dollars that come to hand to be put to the use of entering this eighty acre of land my House & Spring is on. Third - Profoale made between parties - first if my estate is able, and may be procured, the second hundred Dollars is to be paid to Thomas A. Gillis for his debt in his Father's land - Also the third hundred dollars to Richard Alternathy for his clover in the same lands. Fourth - hundred dollars to be given to John S. Griffis for his debt in same lands - and they, all three, are to warrant and forever defend the right, and title, of said lands from all persons whatever and a word, not that can be done the lands must be sold, according to law, and one half of the money to go to the use of my wife, the other half to the benefit of my children. Fifth - All the ready and proceeds of the above to go to my children - and lastly I hereby constituted, appointed my wife Mary Ann Gillands, Joseph A. Branchaw to be my executors to this my last will and testament making, and amending all former wills by me made, and, ratifying, and confirming this no other to be my last will & testament.

Secondly I give, and bequeath hereunder each bequest, to the end thereof I do hereby make, ordain, and appoint my esteemed friends Jacob P. Denham and Spencer Clark - I bequeath all of my estate to my dear beloved wife Nancy - That my son James, and his wife, and all of my kitchen furniture, all the stock that I am possessed of, and, all of my farming tools, and, all of my goods whatever to hold the same during, of her widowhood - and, whenever my said wife does marry then my property must be sold, and, divided, among my children, equally.
