Most of the EVILSIZER/OR families in America today descend from 2 men, one known as Jakob Uebelschaeuser and the other from probably a brother, name not known.

Many folks have been researching this line for many years and have been unable to establish the identity of Ol' Jakob.

I addressed many of the issues concerning Ol' Jakob in my published book entitled "Evil In The Barn" in 2000. However, my research over the internet continues to disclose many errors in our heritage. This new format of the newsletter is intended to report only the facts and to dispel all of the rumors surrounding our heritage.

It was thought at one time (and the rumor is alive and well today), that Jacob was a Hessian Soldier. There is plenty of evidence to establish that, but herein lies the problem. Evidence also supports that he was , captured, and returned to Germany where he married and had children.

"Regarding the origin of the Evilsizer name, all Evilsizers seem to feel the name came from Germany or Holland. Germans I have talked to do not think it is German in its present form. Assuming it is an Anglicized German name, I checked names beginning with Ebel...or Abel... for a while, but found nothing that accounted for the last two syllables, until I ran into a family called Ebelsheiser. their forebears came to America only two generations ago and it might be possible that the American Evilsizers share a common ancestor with this German family. I had an uncle who claimed that Evilsizer, in German, meant "noble house", and that would be the literal translation of Ebelsheiser. the latter name does not have the "s" and "h" together in a "sh" sound, but instead, a syllable divides between those two letters, so that is pronounced "e-bels-hi-ser", which would easily Anglicize to Evilsizer. The member of the **Ebelsheiser** family I talked to said their family had originally come from Bavaria."***

Evilsizor History by George Weldon Evilsizor

It has been said by an Evilsizor living in Wood County, Ohio that during the Revolutionary War with Great Britton, the British hired German Hessians to come to America and help subdue the colonists. Receiving no pay as promised, they deserted; the British called them "Evil Traitors". Our original name was Sizer, later called Evilsizor. That was his story.

Dwight Veihland (Descendant of Samuel Blake and Elizabeth Ann Evilsizer) 8-19-1997

I did some thinking on the information you sent. I see actually three Uebelschauser men 1) Johann Jacob 2) Johannes 3) Nikolas.Johann Jacob was born 12-27-1752 has a record for enlisting into the Hessian Army, was taken as a POW, was made an invalid, returned home, separated from the Army, was married in Germany, and had a daughter there. Johannes was born 3-30-1751, has a record for enlisting into the Hessian Army, has no record of discharge from the Army, was married in Germany, and had a son named Johannes Jacob. Nikolas was born on an unknown date in an unknown place in Germany, does not have a record of enlisting in the Hessian Army, has a record of de-

section from the Hessian Army presumably between 1778-1780) and has no records after that (ie he disappears)

I think there is a very simple solution to this three body problem. First, all three men only speak German. Consequently they would have had a hard time surviving in Early America, in particular during the Revolutionary War. Probably all three men came from the same area in Germany and were a combination of cousins and/or brothers.

Now when Johann Jacob was taken POW and later wounded, from a German perspective he sort of became a hero, and from a US perspective it was sort of a tragedy. So, his reputation is not so bad. However, when Nikolas deserted from the Hessian Army, his reputation was not so good. After deserting from the Hessian Army, Nikolas probably found life in Colonial America quite tough. He could not speak English very well. In addition to being significantly cultural different than WASP America. So the only way he could survive was to locate himself in the Pennsylvania German community. He could then communicate well, he knew the culture, and he was more probable to find employment, etc. However Nikolas had a problem with his reputation as he was one of the "evil deserters". Even in America, the PA Germans were still Germans. As we all know, Germans value discipline and military service; so if the PA German community found out about his desertion, he would be in deep trouble. If the War was not over, they might have turned him over to the Hessian Army, at which time he would have been executed. If they did not do that, they would have probably tarred and feathered him. Then where does he go? How does he survive? He can't go home because if found he will die.

Nikolas was left with one option open to him in which he could completely cover his tracks. He would become Johann Jacob (his brother or cousin). He would become a "**hero**" rather than an "**evil one**". He could find employment within the PA German community, and he could begin to build a new life. He could later move out of the community and be forgotten. I do not think it necessary that Johannes or Johan to have had children in the US before they returned. The children born in Berks Co, all probably belonged to Nikolas/Jacob.

So in conclusion, I think there maybe IS something to the Legend of Ol Jakob and a high probability that he is actually Nikolas Uebelschauser.

I have several comments and/or ideas on who Jacob really was. I will summarize.

To me, the structure of the name suggests that Jacob is from Westfallen. This is interesting from the point of the dead end trail. Only part of Westfallen was under Hessian control at the time of the US Revolution. I would guess this to be Kreiss Mindenstadt and Kreiss Luebke (my father comes from this area so I know it quite well)

In spite of the excellent church records in this area, family research in Westfallen can be extremely difficult because of cultural differences with the rest of the western world. In particular, a man's family name may change from generation to generation. The surname does not always follow the male lineage. rather, the surname is dictated by property inheritance. For example, my name Vieland has experienced many dislocations in the last 300 years. The direct male lineage goes from being Vieland to Vierman to Lohmeier to Spectmeyer to Detering between 1729 and 1850. Who ever got the family homeward/business/etc, had by law to carry the family name. So if a man married into a family and the daughter received the inheritance, the children bore the mother's family Names. In addition, the husband had to change his surname. For another Example, when Henrich Spectmeyer married Wilhelminia Lohmeier, he became Henrich Lohmeier. All subsequent legal and church records only mention him by that name. In addition, when the next generation is born, there is generally no mention of the father's maiden name..

The point I am trying to make is that in Westfallen one never knows which direction you are tracing. Evilsizer could be the mother's or father's family. At first thought you might see this as a problem is he was born Jacob Uebelscheuser, then this is the way the records would read in Westfallen. A problem is that many men from Westfallen who immigrated to America took the father's correct surname on immigration. For example, in my family, the Vieland's who came earlier are Vierman's whereas those who came 20 years later are Vieland, even though they had the same mother and father.

So this is what you may be faced with. Jacob Uebelscheuser's real surname is lost to us. We need to know the first name of the father, then look for the first name in conjunction with the last name. Then find who he married. Find the children for this couple and if Jacob appears, well you have your man. Difficult? Westfallen is complicated.

I would also like to point out that Evilsizer is a good Angelization of Uebelscheuser. Slightly off, but not much. The best would be Ebelsizer. So the phonetics of the name supports that this Jacob belongs to the Uebelschauser family. In my opinion, the name has been conjugated, ie, Uebels-Heuser. This also occurs in Westfallen and Oldenburg when families of similar middle to upper social levels marry. In this case, the newly married couple want both families inheritances, so the only solution was to make everybody somewhat happy.

2) Are we absolutely positive that Jacob was from Germany? Another possibility is the family is English. The name Evilsizer is most certainly from Germany, but it might have evolved. Might be Elsevier. Just a thought.

3) Know, interestingly enough, I have heard legends similar to the one of "Ol Jakob" in our family in Missouri, but is told with a much different twist. My grandfather told me when I was a child, a similar family legend. The story has some very sad bends and repeats- First, my grandfather Blake's grandfather (John Wesley Blake, son of Elizabeth Evilsizer) had served in the Civil War for several months. He was married and had about five small children. Something happened in the War. Nobody knows for sure what it was, other than he just could not take it and had some form of stress syndrome. After about five months, he deserted the union Army. His family never heard from him again. We know he remarried, changed his name, and just vanished off the face of Mother Earth. Now here is where the story takes an interesting twist with respect to Jakob. After John Wesley Blake deserted his old life, the family never spoke of him. All information passed down about him was through his mother, Elizabeth Evilsizer. One of the comments that was subsequently passed on to me was that this was not the first time that such a thing happened in this family. In a previous War, (1776 or 1812) another one of our ancestors also had served, deserted his forces, abandoned his family, changed his name, and began a new life. Maybe she was making excuses for her son, or maybe some truth has trickled down through the years.

Letter from Johannes Schwalm Historical Association, November 1997

I personally have already spent many hours on trying to solve the Uebeldhauser riddle. However, I have not been able to get anybody to document for me how, where, and when the story of "Hessian Jakob" developed. It might just contain a clue that would be valuable in the final solution. Unfortunately, all I get is a broad general statement without any source.

In my files I have a letter from the Evangelische-Lutherisches Pfarramt at Loehlbach in Germany in which the pastor offers proof that both the Hessian Jakob and Johannes Uebelshauser did return home, got married in their home parish on dates that would make it impossible for either to have been in Berks Co. in 1779. So they are out of the picture no matter how you slice it.

There is however a possible "sleeper" (Nikolaus) in the military records which appears to have been neglected by the descendants of JAKOB. It will require time, no doubt some money and a lot of patience on the part of the inquirer to "prove him in" or eliminate him from further consideration. And yes, it may turn out to be a "blind alley." JSHA is in no position to do that kind of follow up. I will be willing to guide the person under either of the above options in the event you are seriously interested in working on it. For openers I would want to see a straight line genealogy beginning with yourself and going back to the Jakob of Berks Co PA together with dates and places of birth. I would also want to see some proof that the Jakob of Berks Co did indeed move to Rockingham Co., VA.

The Winchester Hessian Barracks-by Lion G Miles

During the American Revolution, Winchester, Virginia, and the surrounding countryside became a detention center for thousands of British and German prisoners of war. It served as a prison camp from 1776-1783.....In September of 1777 twenty Pennsylvania Quakers arrived at Winchester, arrested in Philadelphia as "prisoners of war", but the prisoners most remembered were the so-called "Hessians" captured at the battles of Trenton, Saratoga and Yorktown....Nearly 30,000 Germans came across the Atlantic during the war years, 17,000 of whom were from the Landgraviate of Hessen-Kassel and 2,400 from the territory of Hessen-Hanau. The first group of German Prisoners to arrive in Winchester were some of the 1,000 Hessians captured at Trenton, New Jersey on December 26, 1776. They had spent the following winter and spring at Lancaster, PA. On August 15, 1777 the Hessians marched to Lebanon and Carlisle where conditions became so crowded, they ordered about 300 to proceed to Winchester. On September 30, in Winchester they were drawn up and parceled out to the country people to work. In the Spring of 1778 local farmers hired many of the Germans to work on their farms. Almost every Hessian captured at Trenton and sent to Virginia returned to his regiment when exchanged in 1778. We will note here that the Hessian Jacob was taken prisoner of war in October 1777 and ransomed in May of 1778. Nikolas deserted to the enemy ALSO in October of 1777.



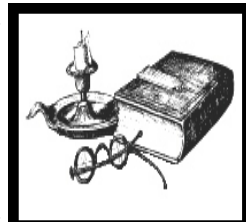
Letter from the Editor

Sinclair Evilsizer and Perlina Walters

After the birth of his first son, Sinclair and Perlina moved from Indiana to Montevallo, Missouri along with her parents, where Sinclair set out the first orchard in the small trading post. Soon after, they moved north east of Richmond in Ray County where he took out a land grant of four sections between Millville and Tinney's Grove. Sinclair was a Judge of the Ray County Court several terms during the 1860's and 70's. Many times he would take his granddaughters, Lucy Burress and Cora Evilsizer with him to Richmond when he was attending court for the day.

Perlina always described Sinclair as a "southern gentleman" which I presume meant he did not do menial work or labor with his hands (farm work with out getting dirty!). One example- Perlina had had a baby a day or two before and since there was no one else around to milk the cows, Sinclair, who did not know how to milk (so the story goes), carried her to the barn where she could do the milking! I guess there were several "southern gentlemen" in the family as there are similar stories about Sinclair's brother Levy and his son, Joshua.

Sinclair's two sons, Joshua and Thomas Jefferson, served with the Union Army during the Civil War. Sentiments for pro or anti slavery had a long history in Missouri. Loyalty ran deep from southern supporters and produced many guerrilla forces true to Dixie. Throughout 1861 and much of 1863, local government broke down over much of Missouri, with local civil wars and guerrilla raids and much destruction of public and private property. It was during this time that Sinclair had rode over to a neighbor's house, Mr. Schooler, who lived west of his place. While visiting together, they heard horses approaching and realizing they were Quantrill's Raiders, Mr Schooler said "Evilsizer, you'd better get out of here." While Sinclair hid, Mr. Schooler went out to see what they wanted. They said they were on their way to Evilsizer's house to kill him. They wanted to water their horses and go on, but to give Sinclair more time for his get-a-way, Mrs. Schooler talked them into staying for lunch. When they came inside, Sinclair sneaked out, mounted his horse, went home and packed a few things and rode to Chillicothe to wait out the war. (Source of story was Joe Amery, Sinclair's grandson, who passed it on to Marion Kelliher, great granddaughter of Sinclair.

After the war, Sinclair and Perlina continued to live on their farm for a number of years, which he had named "Millstead" with many tragedies striking Their family. Joe Amery said that many of the Evilsizers died of Ty-

phoid. First their son Levi, died at the age of 7, Sara age 17 died in 1875, William age 27 died in 1876, Mary , who had married Tom Burress, died at the age of 26 in 1878; Malinda in 1882, and Jeff who was killed in 1883.

In 1961 Myron Gaffin Reynolds, daughter of Lucy Burress Gaffin and granddaughter of Mary Evilsizer Burress, related some of her memories to Marion Kelliher, great-granddaughter of Sinclair and Perlina: "Mama used to tell us for weeks after her mother (Mary Burress) died, she would run off from the farm and Sinclair and Perlina would find her lying across her mother's grave crying and grieving for her. Grandmother had a very hard time with her (Lucy)."

In 1883 when Sinclair's son Jeff, was killed, Joe Amery tells this story: "Thomas Miller, who married Sinclair's daughter, Malinda, had borrowed a horse from his father-in-law, Sinclair. Later, the horse was seen in someone else's possession. The man said he bough the horse from Thom as Miller. The Evilsizer's eventually were involved in a lawsuit with Thomas Miller. While the lawsuit was pending, Jeff was called to his door one rainy night and, when he opened it, was shot. He lived long enough to swear he saw Billy Miller (Melinda's son) at the door. However, Billy was acquitted when his sister, Eliza, swore he was at home that night. Malinda had died in 1882 and Perlina always said she was so glad that Malinda never knew of this tragedy" At the time Jeff owned a large farm consisting of 400 acres near Cowgill in what is now Caldwell County, not too far from his father's place. His widow, Eliza, lived on the farm alone for a number of years, where she, too was killed in 1891.

After the death of Jeff, Perlina and Sinclair were so devastated by these events, that they sold their farm in 1884 (\$35 an acre) after having lived in Ray County approximately 40 years and moved to Kansas.

Their destination was Severy in Greenwood County, Kansas, where their daughter, Mariah Jane (Jennie) and her husband Henry Turner were living. They took their daughter, Dell Oro and their grandchildren, Cora Evilsizer, Lucy and Albert Burress along. Cora's father William died in 1876 and her mother remarried and more or less gave Cora to Sinclair and Perlina to raise; Lucy and Albert Burress' mother, Mary, had died in 1878.

Sinclair bought land in Severy and farmed and was also engaged in the hard ware business with the Turners until his death.

Joe Amery said he remembered writing letters for his grandmother, Perlina, and his mother would explain to him that Perlina had not had the chance for schooling that he had. Joe also passed this story on to Marion Kelliher: "Grandma Evilsizer used to tell about living in her fathers' home in Indiana. She said her father ran a distillery and in the fall he always threw the "pummies" out so that the wild hogs would come and eat them. Some would eat enough to get drunk and then her father would kill enough for the family's meat. (Pummies were some sort of residue, I suppose, from the distilling process.) "Perlina also said the Indians would come quite often and ask for milk, but they would never bring a container. Perlina's mother would say "You won't bring back the bucket." The Indian would then take his rifle and place it above the door for her to keep until he brought back the bucket."

Lavonne Schulze, 2x great-granddaughter of Sinclair and Perlina and who owns the family Bible, has written: "There are odd scraps of beautiful dress material in the Bible along with pressed flowers, a long braid of dark brown hair, little paper hearts and a slip of paper which reads " Hay from woods to Mrs. Evilsizer - gross 2840, tare 1140, net 1700 - amount \$1. 70."

Obituary, August 15, 1891-Severy, KS Sinclair Evilsizer was born June 19, 1819 in Rockingham Co, Virginia and emigrated in an early day with his parents to Morgan County, Indiana. In the year of 1838 he was married to Perlina Walters; by this union there were twelve children, of which only five remain to mourn the death of their father, three girls and two boys. In the year 1840 he moved to Ray County, Missouri and settled on a farm proving a successful farmer. April 1st, 1884 he came to Greenwood County, Kansas with his family and settled at Severy, where he resided until his death, which occurred at 6:10 P. M. August 18, 1891, after an

illness of eleven days, at the advanced age of 72 years, 3 months and 1 day. The funeral services were held at the Congregational church at 4 P.M., last Friday after which the body was interred in Twin Groves Cemetery. He professed religion in 1867 but never united with any church, but being a strict Baptist in belief. He was a loving husband, a kind and affectionate father and a friend to all in need; respected by all who knew him. During his illness he was a patient sufferer, never complaining, and his death is a quiet sleep. When his wife would tell him she could not give him up, he would say "It won't be long ". We shall miss him for he is gone. "Tell me not in mournful numbers, Life is but an empty dream, For the soul is not dead that slumbers And things are not what they seem"

In 1983 I received a letter from a Greenwood County, KS Historical Society volunteer in response to a letter I had written. She stated: "There is a probate record for Sinclair Evilsizer, but for some reason, the file is missing. However, I was able to go to a ledger entry and get the following information.....". She goes on to list his death date at Severy, KS & lists his heirs. She also stated that he left no will & that his estate was mostly personal property. S Durels

Letter written to Edwin Jean Evilsizer from her sister "I am sure I've told you before, but you may have forgotten, that Grandfather and John Evilsizer's father Sinclair hurried off the farm and spent so me time in Chillicothe until Quantrell's raiders were out of the territory. They had gone to Sinclair's southern-sympathizing neighbor's farm and mentioned that they were going to kill "Old Man Evilsizer" because his oldest son Joshua was in the Union Army. The neighbor sent warning to Sinclair .

During the Civil War, Quantrell and his raiders wreaked much havoc in Missouri, attacking Union army groups and civilians who would not support the raiders. During 1860-61, many west Missouri homes and farms were destroyed by the guerrillas and Union troops - mostly by Quantrell's men. In an effort to capture the guerrilla group and discourage local assistance to them, a force of Union soldiers arrested all residents of Independence during the spring of 1862 and destroyed much property. On August 25, 1863, Brigadier General Thomas Ewing issued General Order No. 11, which ordered the evacuation of much of Jackson and other counties within 15 days. Residents who could not prove their loyalty to the Union were to be completely removed from the military district (which encompassed Kansas and Missouri). Grains and hay were to be turned over to the military and any not surrendered was to be burned. Large numbers of people lost their homes and properties.

The problem did not end with the war, however. Several bandit gangs which arose from the Quantrell raiders (e.g., the James and Dalton brother s) and plagued much of Missouri, including Jackson County.

Before my summer, 1962 trip to Kansas City, to visit my mother, I wrote to my father's cousin, Joe Amery, who lived in Excelsior Springs, Missouri. My father had died when I was 12, and I wanted to visit Mr. Amery to learn more about my father's family. Mr. Amery was the son of Sinclair's daughter Nancy Ann "Annie" Evilsizer and John Amery, of Braymer, Missouri.

Joe Amery not only invited me to visit, but when I arrived he drove me to visit the graveyard at Tinney's Grove, where Perlina's mother Perlina Walters and some of Sinclair's children are buried. He also took me to Millville, where Sinclair and Perlina had a farm, which they called "Millstead". The house was gone, but I took a picture of Sinclair's barn, which was still standing.

I also took a picture of the remains of the home of Sinclair's neighbor, Mr. Schooler, who had the adjoining farm. Joe Amery wanted me to see Mr. Schooler's home, because, although he was a southern sympathizer, he may have saved Sinclair's life. The occasion was when four of Quantrell's men--bushwackers--came on horses and dropped in at Schooler's home. They said t hey were looking for Old Man Evilsizer and planned to hang him because his son (Joshua) was in the northern army.

Mr. Schooler invited the men in to have some food and he sent someone to warn Sinclair that he was in danger. Sinclair immediately went to Chillicothe, Missouri and stayed there a few weeks until the bushwackers were out of his neighborhood.

And endnote to this story is that some years later, when John, 83, was told that his brother Joe, 80, had died, he went to his niece's (or daughter -in-law's?) home to tell her the news. He died, crying on her shoulder.

In September, 1990, Jim and I were planning a trip from New Jersey to Wyoming with a pop-up trailer, and I got in touch with Hoy to see if I could meet him. He invited me to come to his ranch home and when I knocked on the door, he opened it and opened his arms to greet me. It was very touching. Another fine fried chicken dinner--I think what I call dinner was often served at lunch time in these country places. Hoy and his wife were delightful and it was a wonderful visit. He took me to the ranch house where my parents had lived, for he knew about it, even though he never knew them. They had moved back to Missouri in about 1921.

I exchanged Christmas cards with Hoy and Willamae for a few years, but in 1993, she said Hoy was ailing, and I imagine he has passed on by now .

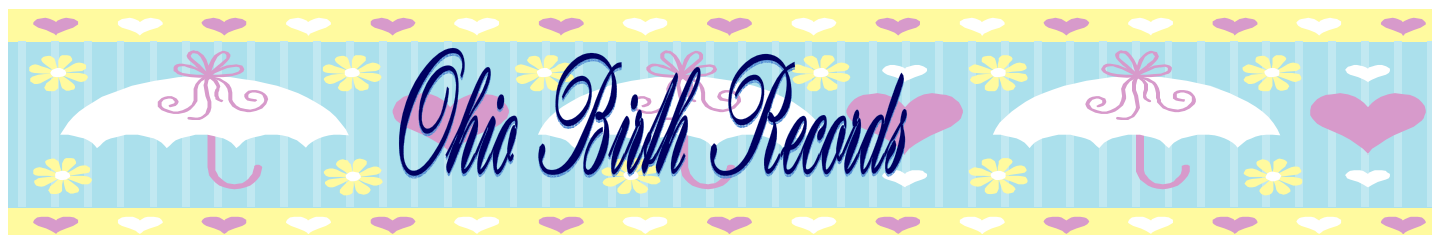

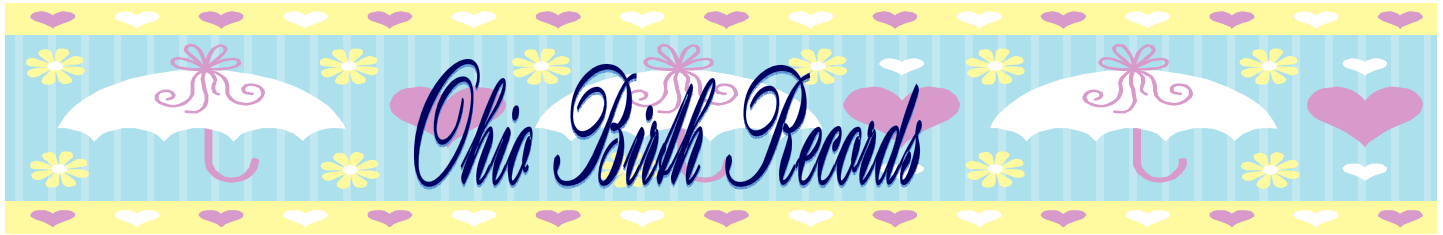
