

Using Accents to Highlight Tags

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The ability to highlight tags is one of the features I use frequently in my own TMG databases. It allows me to easily view data that would otherwise be buried within the documentation. Several times, it's prevented me from searching for material that I've already attempted to find and in my opinion that alone is worth the effort to set up the highlighting! Hopefully you will find it useful in your own work.

TMG easily allows us to accent individuals based on a variety of conditions. One of the recent additions to my own database is a flag for those who died under the age of 16. The following screen shows an example of a rather unlucky family who had several children die at a young age (highlighted in black). It's also interesting to note that the father of this family had several siblings who also died very young.

This highlighting was easily achieved by adding the new flag to the settings on the accent definition screen as shown below.

However, TMG does not provide a method for highlighting a **Tag**. Fortunately, there's a relatively easy way to make the Tags stand out through the use of accents.

The first thing you need to do is set up a new Flag for each “highlight” you want to use. I have one called Problem and one called Search Unsuccessful. Both have a default value of “?” and potential values of “N” and “Y” (although you really only need the default and Y).

The next thing you need to do is set up a new “person” for each of the “highlights” you want to use. My two current favorites are PRBLM and SRCH (each entered as the surname). It’s best to choose short meaningful names for the new “people” – we’ll see why a little later. You don’t need to add any tags for these “people”. But you do need to set the associated flag to “Y” for each of them. For example, the person named PRBLM will have the Problem Flag set to Y and the person named SRCH will have the Search Unsuccessful Flag set to Y. It’s important to note that **these are the only “people” who will actually use the new flags.**

The last thing to do is to adjust the accent scheme to add colors for the new situations which are based on Flag settings: Problem = Y and Search Unsuccessful = Y. I chose bright colors for both of my situations.

Now comes the best part. Say I have an individual whose research has some problems. I definitely don't want to be reporting this information as factual to someone else and I really should work to try to resolve the problems. What I need is a good way to highlight the fact that some of the data is questionable or is known to be in error.

An example in my files is Frederick J. Philipps (1880-1889). I have a birth record stating that he was born 4 Oct 1880 and I have a death record stating that he died 13 Nov 1889 (age 9). However, another researcher shows him as a member of the Tiffin Fire Department and it is very likely that he's the informant listed on the death certificate for his father in 1926. Either there were two sons named Frederick Philipps in this family, or the death certificate I found for Frederick really belongs to someone else. Obviously this issue needs to be resolved.

This is a good place to use my Problem Accent. I attached Mr. PRBLM as the 2nd principal on the Verify tag which explained the problem (and has associated research tasks set up) and now that Tag (Verify) show up in bright red so I can't miss it.

Memo: Did he really die as a 9 year old in 1889? Vincent E. Falter notes that Frederick was a member of the Tiffin Fire Department in *The Falter-Scharf Family History*. And I have him listed as an informant on his father's death cert in 1926.

This is a good time to point out the reason for choosing a short name for the highlight "people". Whenever you add a person as a 2nd principal, their name shows up within the text of the tag, taking up space on the screen. By choosing a shortened name, there is more room to view the memo field which I use to explain the actual problem with this particular person.

An added benefit of this method is that I can easily switch the focus to Mr. PRBLM where I can view all of the Tags which are being flagged as problems and the individuals associated with them. As you can see, I have a lot of work to do. Note that any tag can be highlighted as a problem. I generally use the Verify tag (a custom tag that I've set up) for these particular situations, but there's also one in my list which is a Research Note (also a custom tag).

My other frequently used highlighting “person” is Mr. SRCH. I use him to highlight notes on records I’ve already searched for but haven’t been able to locate. In this situation I tend to use the Research Note Tag, but you could use a Tag which is more closely related to the type of record you were originally looking for (Birth, Census, Land, etc.). In this case, Mr. SRCH is always entered as the 2nd principal. A few examples are shown below.

This particular Philipps branch ended up in Seneca County Ohio and I’ve found biographies for several of the men in the book *Seneca County, Ohio history & families*, but unfortunately there was none for Jean/John Philipps. This note, which is highlighted, will hopefully keep me from searching for a biography a second time.

Another example is Edward George. His family ended up in Marilla, Erie Co., NY, but I haven’t been able to locate church records for them. I’ve added a note to indicate that I already searched the Methodist Episcopal Church records which have been filmed. The full text of the Research Note memo reads as “searched Marilla Methodist Episcopal

Church (LDS Film #1381677) - not included in member list” so now I have all the details about the film I looked at.

The next example is for Rosine Philipps Philipps who is buried in Calvary Cemetery in Milwaukee. I would like to find her death record, but none was found in the records at the FHL. The full text of this Research Note reads as follows and gives me a possible explanation for why the record wasn’t found.

“Searched Milwaukee WI Deaths, v. 1-2 1852-1876 (bulk 1872-1876) FHL US/CAN Film 1013455 - NOTE THAT THERE APPEAR TO BE VERY FEW PRE-1872 RECORDS. None found for this individual.”

Note that in this case I sorted the highlighted tag so it follows the burial tag so I see the two pieces of information at the same time.

One last example shows how kind some friends can be. In this case Martha searched unsuccessfully for an obit for William Dendinger while she was in California visiting her mother. Hopefully this note will keep me from foolishly asking her to look for the obit again.

I've found that I use Mr. SRCH often enough that he now resides on the top of my bookmark list (which is in my custom toolbar) so that I can easily see his ID# when I want to add him to a tag.

Needless to say, these types of highlights don't have to be limited to negative results or errors. It would be just as easy to set them up to highlight particular events such as participation in a specific war, land claims in a particular state, known number of children exceeds the number of currently identified children. The only limitation is your imagination and the fact that the tag you want to highlight can't already be using both principals. You should also keep in mind that you can easily adjust the highlighting by changing the settings on the accent definitions, which would allow you to use a particular highlight while researching a specific area or time-period and then turn it off when you have finished that research.
