QUERIES: Members are also encouraged to send queries to the editor.

MEMBERS AND SUBSCRIPTIONS: HAWKINS HERITAGE was begun with the hope of identifying the parents of James and Margaret ? Hawkins, b. c1765 and 1768, probably in Virginia. Taxations records show that they lived in Stafford CO Virginia from 1793 until 1825, when they emigrated to Clark CO Kentucky. One son, John R., married into the Hawkins/Bourne line, which may be a connecting branch of the above James. Because of an apparent need for "group" research, our publication is now open to descendants of all Hawkins lines.

Individual membership and subscription is \$12 per year. Contributing Membership and subscription is \$20 per year (may vote).

Subscriptions begin with the April issue. Subscribers during the membership year may receive back issues of the current year or begin with the next year and pay for any single back issues, which are \$4 each. The 1st issue was December 1986; 2nd, April 1987; 3rd, 1988; continuing with August and December from then on.

BITS AND PIECES OF THE HAWKINS FAMILY PUZZLE

This is a continued article taken from the book by Millie Showalter Farmer
(3614 Harbel Drive, Bremerton, WA 98310)

John Hawkins sold to Thomas Lundy property known as "The Brick House" in Moratuck, NC on Jan. 17, 1711. The property (15 acres) adjoining the Brick House was sold to John Bailey.

John Hawkins, NC, sold to his brother Thomas the land on the south side of Chowan Sound in Washington, CO. on May 22, 1713. John attached the estate of Isaac Rowdon in Chowan on March, 1695.

John Hawkins was a member of the House of Burgesses in 1703 in NC. He was in the Upper House in 1708.

John Hawkins was the son of Thomas Hawkins Sr. who left will of April 28, 1791 in North Carolina.

John Hawkins Esquire was present at a Court at ye house of WM. Reed in January 1697/98 in North Carolina.

John Hawkins and his wife Mary sold the plantation inherited from his father to Henderson Walker. It was located in Chowan CO. NC. The date of the sale was Jan. 15, 1703. John and Mary had a son Thomas b. Aug. 10, 1704. It is thought that this John Hawkins was the son of Thomas and Frances---. He was b. Feb. 13, 1671/2 in North Carolina. His wife was Mary Bateman.

John Hawkins, (Col.) was b. in 1651 and d. in 1717. He married Frances Gross and had Ernault and John, b. 1681 d. 1745 in Queen Ann CO., Maryland. His son John mar. Elizabeth and they had a son Matthew who married Frances Gould in 1746.

John Hawkins of Hanover CO. VA was named in the will of Charles Smith of Louisa CO., VA. The Smith children were: Elizabeth Brown, Lucy Smith, Susannah Wild, William Smith, Ann Smith, Sarah Smith. Extrs. were John Lewis, Patrick Henry, John Hawkins and son William Smith. Dated Aug. 30, 1768. Cosby Duke, John Cosby and Thomas East were witnesses.

John Hawkins will of Feb. 9, 1686 in Lancaster CO., VA names Samuel Branch, Jno Wells' son, Thomas Chattwin, Nathaniel Brown, Thomas Goosley, Alex Atkins, Thomas Chowning. EXtr. Thom. Chowning. Witnesses Stephen Tomlin, Nathaniel Brown, and Thomas Chattwin.

John Hawkins owned land in Caroline CO., VA in 1686. He sold his property with all its apple, peach and cherry trees to John Askew in 1655 in Isle of Wight CO., VA.

John Hawkins left a will in Essex CO. VA in 1726. A John Sr. left a will in Lancaster CO in 1686. John Hawkins left a will in Northampton CO., VA in 1734 and John left a will in Northumberland CO. VA in 1652. John Hawkins left a will in Westmoreland CO., VA in 1718.

Capt. John Hawkins, 3rd VA Regiment, Continental Line 1777 to 1778, was killed at Charleston. He was a descendant of Ralph Hawkins of Charles CO.,MD. John had a daughter who married John Adams Washington Smith of Fauquier CO.,VA.

John Hawkins son of Willis Alston Hawkins Sr. and Elizabeth Boon was b. in 1820 and died in 185?. He lived in Georgia.

John R. Hawkins of Jessamine CO.,KY purchased from William Hopper of Fleming CO.,KY his plantation on Triplett Creek. John R. was mar. to Sarah Barnett.

John Hawkins Jr. of Lunenburg, CO,VA was listed in Claims of Buchannon Hostie & Company, Holloway Store as owing money from 1775 to 1823. John and his father moved to Kentucky together.

John Hawkins will in Garrard CO.,KY left his estate to son Philip and to four grandsons: Henry Bright, Philip Hawkins, Elijah Hawkins, son of Elijah. Aug. 20,1810.

John Hawkins of Bath CO.,KY mar. Jane Rogen on Nov. 21,1815.

John Hawkins of Scott CO.,KY was in charge of Masonic Lodges meeting in Georgetown on Sept. 8,1800.

John Hawkins of Georgetown, KY helped organize the first Baptist Church in that city. John and Sarah were original members. His mother Mary was the first County Clerk. She died in 1870 at age 92. John was appointed clerk of the court in 1793 and was paid 12 shillings. There were two men in Georgetown who were named John Hawkins at that time. John was appointed first clerk protem in the 14th Precinct of Elkhorn, KY. He was a road overseer and surveyor. From History Of Scott CO.KY.

John Hawkins mar. Cassarina Gallop Elkin on May 3, 1812 in Woodford CO.,KY. John mar. Malinda Armstrong in KY on Jan. 16,1843 in Kentucky.

John R. Hawkins, son of Robert Casiborne Hawkins and Mary Frances Walthall was b. Jan. -, 1858 in Campbell CO.,VA.

John Hawkins (Capt.) b. 1750 d. 1805, mar. Alice Carlen Thomas and lived and died in Virginia.

John K. Hawkins mar. Fannie Brizendine on Oct. 19,1824 in Franklin,CO.,KY.

Joseph Hawkins was killed in the Civil War at the age of 20. His parents were Reuben and Lydia who lived in Xenia, OH.

Joseph Hawkins witnessed a deed of Thomas Chew to Larkin Chew. He lived in St. Mark's Parish in SPotsylvania, CO,VA

Joseph Hawkins a planter paid to Edward Rouse of St. Margaret's Parish, Caroline CO.,VA, Planter, 4400 pounds of tobacco and 400 Acres in St. Mark's

Parish , Spottsylvania CO.VA. May 4,1731. Charles Goodall, John Johnson and John Waller were witnesses.

Joseph Hawkins and Jane his wife of Berkley Parish sold to George Blakey 100 acres in that county on May, 1,1771. In 1776, he sold Larkin Chew 120 acres on Plentiful Run in Spotsylvania CO. joining land of James Jones, Robert Bradley and Joseph Hawkins.

Joseph Hawkins, Lieutenant took the oath in Spottsylvania CO. on Sept. 2, 1729. He was in the Colonial Militia. His father was John of Hanover CO.,VA and Mary Langford was his mother. Joseph was living in Boone CO.,KY in 1810 with his wife Ann Parker Robinson whom he mar. on Feb. 27, 1801.

Joseph Hawkins was b. in Powhatan CO.VA and mar. a dau. of Col. George Nicholas of Kentucky. He was a lawyer in Lexington , KY and at an early age was elected to the legislature from Fayette, CO. in 1810. In 1813 he was elected Speaker of the House. In 1819, he moved to New Orleans where he died in Oct. 1823. One of his sons was Norborne B. Hawkins.

Joseph Hawkins mar. Margaret Conner in 1757 in Old Rappahannock or Essex Counties, VA. Margaret's father was Martin Conner. Joseph and Margaret sold on Oct. 18,1798, to Thomas King of Bottetourt, CO., 337 acres in Bottetourt CO. The property had been patented to Michael Bowyer on July 5, 1774. It was sold to Hawkins. The location was on a branch of the James River on the west side of Blue Ridge.

Joseph Hawkins released deed of land patented to Him mistakenly on July 14,1769. This property should have been deeded to Benjamin Hawkins dec'd, who willed it to his daughters Magdalen and Sarah. The 400 acres in Lunenburg CO.,VA was on the branch of Meherron and Blue Stone.

Joseph Hawkins was a lawyer and partner with Stephen Austin after he moved to New Orleans from Kentucky. He was the brother of Littleberry Hawkins. His wife and children went back to Kentucky after his death.

Joseph Hawkins served as a soldier in Capt. McNeel's Company in the 1st. Virginia Regiment until he was duly discharged by Col. Adams Stevens in 1762. His certificate was assigned by Joseph Hawkins before a Justice in Culpeper CO.,VA to Thomas Stuart. Order Book XVII , pg. 28.

Joseph Hawkins b. in Georgetown on July 20, 1829 died in Mississippi. He was a Confederate soldier.

Katherine Spencer Hawkins mar. John G. Farmer on Sept. 15, 1835 in Franklin CO.,KY. They were married by her brother in law, Rev. W.H. Blanton.

BOOKS

Wanita Lucas mentioned that *A History of Scott County, Kentucky, As Told By Selected Buildings*, is a very lovely book. Written by Ann Bolton Bevins, Georgetown, KY. 1989, the book shows photos of old historic homes and buildings of Scott CO, giving brief sketches of some of the prominent people and their homes in the area.

The above book reminds me of one that I purchased a few years ago, *A Pictorial History: Eastern Kentucky*, by Stuart Sprague. Dr. Sprague received his B.A. and M.A.T. degrees from Yale University and his Ph.D. from New York University. Aside from being author of several books, he has taught history at Morehead State University since 1968. Not only are the book's pictures superb, the many captions and paragraphs add to the history of Eastern Kentucky. The contents include from the settlement of 1750, lifestyles, county seats, river transport, coal, oil, the Great Depression, up to nearly present. For anyone with ancestry in Eastern Kentucky, *The Phelps Family*, by William Herald Swango and his wife Maxine May Swango, concerns several eastern counties, Fleming, Carter, Clark, Bath, Menifee, Rowan, Montgomery, and Morgan. I purchased the book because of a Hawkins/Phelps connection, but I didn't know how many other connections could come out of a book based on the families of an allied line. 1986 Copyright, published by Jalamap Publications, Inc., 601 D Street, South Charleston, WV 25303.

If anyone asked me fifteen years ago what my favorite books were, I'd have to go with mysteries, from an early interest in Nancy Drew and Agathie Christie. And yes, I've read *The Bridges of Clinton County* too, but the last years have found me intrigued by *Far From Home, O Pioneers!*, *The Westward Movement*, *Women's Diaries of a Westward Journey* - anything at all concerning frontier women. As I've mentioned before (let me count the times!) my great grandmother Permelia Nickell Hawkins saved her letters from the time she came to Texas from Kentucky in 1880 until her death. From these letters I learned many things about a late frontier woman and her husband, trying for a better life for their family. The '80's are one of my favorite time periods.

This brings me to the latest new book on my shelf, *True Women* by Texas author Janice Woods Windle. I am not a book reviewer but I will tell you how enthralled I was in reading this 450 page historical work published by G.P. Putnam's Sons in 1993. Mrs. Windle has unfolded the true story of her ancestors, embellishing this truth with carefully defined fiction, and to me, joined the facts together in a most exciting way. Genealogically speaking, I'm not sure that I have ever read about someone's ancestors in a book that I resented having to put down because the telephone rang!

Mrs. Windle's book concerns *strong* Texas women, with her great great grandmother, Euphemia Texas Ashby, standing up against Santa Anna and Tarantula, the feared Comanche. Mrs. Windle follows the lives of her great grandmother and grandmother with equal interest. Some of you will be especially interested in the author's paternal ancestry. Her great great grandmother, Cherokee Lawshe, was a daughter of Benjamin Hawkins.

Part 2 of *True Women* begins with "Georgia Virginia Lawshe saw the rock coming for what seemed hours before it actually hit her forehead and she had ample time to consider why a nine-year-girl would be stoned by a crowd. Georgia's grandfather, Benjamin Hawkins, had been Indian Agent to the Creek Nation." Mrs. Windle obviously has researched her Hawkins heritage and possibly clears up questions you may have concerning the marriage and non-marriage of Benjamin Hawkins. I rarely read books twice, but I just may read this one again, not for the Hawkins, but for the brilliant storytelling. Hmm, James Michener and Dan Rather liked it too. - Olyve

QUERIES

Can anyone provide information, either speculative or proof, regarding Joseph Hawkins who married Annetke Jane Edwards about 1739, and moved to North Carolina?

Background for this query: There are various reports that seem to connect a Joseph Hawkins who settled in the Shenandoah Valley as early as 1740, with a Quakeress, Annetke Jane Edwards, as wife. In the will of Joseph Hawkins, recorded in Frederick CO VA in 1770, his wife was clearly Sarah. We do not know any details of Joseph or Sarah's lives before they moved to this frontier area near Woodstock, VA.

There are good reasons why the family record of Joseph Hawkins and Annetke, as retold by Zella Armstrong in her writings is inaccurate. It may be that there are two Joseph Hawkins living in about the same time period who are confused.

It seems to me that it might be helpful to try to see if there was another Joseph who married Annetke in 1739, and what happened to him.

JOHN WESTLEY/WESLEY HAWKINS, also known as "J.W.", was born ca 1817/18 in Rowan CO NC. He married REBECCA A. BEST about 1827/28 East Tennessee. In 1850 John and Rebecca were in Andrew CO, MO (near St. Joseph), In 1857 they were in Chase CO KS (Clements). They moved to KS about 1857 with four children. They had two children while in Chase CO. (Parents and four children on 1857 KS Territorial Census). Their children were WILLIAM RILEY, b1849 MO; ISAAC RICHARD b1850 MO; SUSAN FRANCES (my gr grandmother) b1852 Andrew CO MO and married JOHN THOMAS PATTON in 1870 in Chase CO KS; REBECCA JANE b1854 MO; PRINCE LAFAYETTE "Fayette" b1857 Chase CO KS; JOHN HENRY b1860 KS.

JOHN WESTLEY HAWKINS served in Northern Army in Civil War. He d1864 of pneumonia at a regimental hospital in AR. I believe he was buried near Ft. Smith, AR. I have a burial for a John W. or J.W. but the company and regiment numbers and names do not match up. My Hawkins family were some of the first settlers in Chase CO KS. Some still remain there. Is anyone working on the same or related lines? The children of John W. and Rebecca Hawkins are in KS and OK and maybe TX and CA. I will share information. Margaret E. Haynes, P.O. QUERY

I have been working on the Quaker family called NORDYKE that started in NJ and either trekked through the Southern States or went directly to Southwest Ohio by 1825. Afterwards, the various Nordyke Groups not in Ohio went on the to plains states: Westward. They went in a round-about manner from VA to GA to the Carolinas to TN, KY, to OH. They would leave a daughter here or there, but by the Civil War, that name was gone from the South. Only a few served in the Union armies and none in the Southern forces. I am trying to find information on LUCY HAWKINS FREYSCHLAF, 1828-1922. I believe her to be the granddaughter of Benjamin Hawkins, the Indian Agent. Lucy is buried in the Evergreen Cemetery in Fayetteville. She is listed in *School Days, School Days, History of Education 1830-1950* (Mrs. Edward Freyschlaf). This was The Female Seminary which opened in 1839 with fourteen Cherokee girls of prominent Indian families of wealth. In the LDS computer, Lucy Freyschlaf, born 1827, Native American, born Cherokee Nation. In the 1850 Census of Washington CO AR:

Edward Freyschlaf, age 35, born Germany

Lucy, age 23, born KY

Sophia, age 5, AR

George, age 3, AR

Herman, age 2, AR

I have a few books on Benjamin Hawkins, *The Southern Indians and Benjamin Hawkins 1796-1816* by Florette Henri, 1986. On page 317. . . . "Hawkins died in the Creek Agency on June 16, 1816, leaving Lavinia, whom he married before he died, and seven children: Georgia, Muscogee, Cherokee, Carolina, Virginia, Jeffersonia, and son, Madison." Grant and Davis, "Wedding of Col. Benjamin Hawkins," 314-15. Jeffersonia, in a suit against Hawkins's other heirs in 1834, claimed as the only child born in wedlock, the right to a larger share or the whole of his estate (Georgia Department of Archives and History, Hawkins Papers, Will and Lawsuit); Muscogee may not have been Hawkins' daughter, although brought up with the Hawkins children (Grant, BH, xxi and n.41) C.M. Destler, "Correspondence of David Bridie Mitchell", 382.

Page 317: These were left to Lavinia and his children and to his nephew William Hawkins, governor of NC - as perhaps Benjamin might have been if he had stayed comfortably at home. 51

Page 358 footnote 51: Hawkins, Hawkins Papers, Estate of Benjamin Hawkins, Inventory and Sale, Georgia Dept. of Archives and History.

If B. Hawkins listed as a mixed blood descendant in one book, what happened to him in the other book? If Jeffersonia had a legal claim to the estate of Benjamin, why did she wait until 1834? Would that have been when Lavinia died? Was Lavinia Indian or white? If she was white, my Lucy Hawkins is supposed to be Native American!

QUERY

WILLIAM MORTON HAWKINS was born in Clark CO KY in 11-1-1832, the son of William R. and Judah HAWES Hawkins, daughter of Alexander Hawes and Lucy FOWKE. On 17-2-1853, he married Rose Anne CASSITY, b10-3-1833, and daughter of James A. Cassity and Mary Ann HEDGES. They had three children, Martin J., b1854, Irena, b1857, and Gessella/Grizella, b1866, all born in Kentucky. Sometime after 1866, this family moved to Buchanan CO Missouri. Later on they moved to Clinton CO, where William Morton remained a farmer (Plattsburg).

According to the *History of Clinton Co., Missouri*, William Morton Hawkins cultivated 72 acres of good farm land. They were members of the Christian Church. Regarding their three children, Martin J. married a young lady named Nancy C. about 1879. According to the 1880 census of Clinton CO, they had a daughter, Gertrude. In September of 1900, Gertrude married Jacob E. MATTHEWS. Another daughter, Bertha, married George R. HALL on 21-Feb-1912. These children are listed in the 1910 Soundex.

1968 records of the Pleasant Hill Cemetery show the death dates for Martin J. to be 1943 and for Nancy C., 1946. In this cemetery are also dates for Perry Hawkins, 1871-1948 and Elizabeth Hawkins 1873-1968.

At least two children of William A. HUNT and Arena HAWKINS were Rosella b. c1875 and Daisy O., b. ca1879. In the 1880 census, they are shown to be granddaughters. In 1986, a helpful deputy County Clerk suggested that Arena was divorced from Wm. Hunt and remarried him on 21-12-1880. The earlier 1880 census shows Arena and the two girls living with their parents.

Inasmuch as William Morton Hawkins was a brother of my great grandfather, Andrew Jackson Hawkins, I would like to locate other descendants. I also have information on CASSITY and HEDGES and will be glad to share. Please write to: Olyve H. Abbott, 3737 Summercrest Drive, Ft. Worth, TX 76109.

2. Try to leave a one inch margin on the top and sides and 1 1/2 inches on the bottom.
3. Type, print, or write legibly. Dark black ink copies the best.
4. Use one side of your paper only.
5. If an item is larger than 8 1/2 x 11, and you are unable to reduce it, then send it as is to the editor to reduce.
6. Your submission may be written as a letter to the members, the editor, an article with title and author, a question or an answer to the members, or copies of documents, maps, etc.
7. If you are sending copyrighted material, we cannot use it without the complete source. Please give the title, author, publisher, copyright date, and page. If it is not copyrighted, please cite the source so that credit may still be given.
8. If you want your submissions returned, please provide return postage.
9. If you send family group sheets, number each sheet in the order that it is to be interpreted. This is extremely important especially if it is used in our publication, but also for my indexed files.
10. Put your name or initials on *every* page you send.
11. Please put the date on your letters as well as on the material you submit. It is helpful if you use an inside address on your letters. I file your letters but not the envelopes in my notebooks.
12. If you are a new member, it is hoped that you will send a family group sheet or pedigree chart.
13. We urge our members to take advantage of submitting queries. You may do this once a year, and they can be in "standard" form or in letter form. Since we have new members all the time, your query will still be new to them.
14. Suggestions welcomed.

Dates of submission: The following dates are approximate. Sometimes I receive too much for the next issue, and at other times, I might need a little more.

By February 28 for the April issue.

By June 30 for the August issue.
