<u>PURPOSE</u>: The Hawkins Family Organization began in 1985. It is conducted by mail and has no scheduled meetings. The purposes are: To promote genealogical research on Hawkins families and related lines; to promote and share family history; and to strengthen extended family ties.

NEWSLETTERS: HAWKINS HERITAGE is published three times a year in April, August, and December. All members are encouraged to contribute letters and material to the editor. It is preferable if you type your material, but if not convenient, please share it anyway.

OUERIES: Members are also encouraged to send queries to the editor.

MEMBERS AND SUBSCRIPTIONS: HAWKINS HERITAGE was begun with the hope of identifying the parents of James and Margaret? Hawkins, b. c1765 and 1768, probably in Virginia. Taxations records show that they lived in Stafford CO Virginia from 1793 until 1825, when they emigrated to Clark CO Kentucky. One son, John R., married into the Hawkins/Bourne line, which may be a connecting branch of the above James. Because of an apparent need for "group" research, our publication is now open to descendants of all Hawkins lines.

Individual membership and subscription is \$12 per year. Contributing Membership and subscription is \$20 per year (may vote).

Subscriptions begin with the <u>April</u> issue. Subscribers during the membership year may receive back issues of the <u>current</u> year or begin with the next year and pay for any single back issues, which are \$4 each. The 1st issue was December 1986; 2nd, April 1987; 3rd, 1988; continuing with August and December from then on.

PEDIGREE SERVICE: You are welcome to send your Hawkins pedigree chart to be checked with our collection. You will be given any additional information that we might have on file, that would match up with your own. Your chart will be filed for possible future contact. Our Hawkins ancestor files deal mostly with Hawkins of the south and southwest, although not entirely. Cost of this service is \$1 to cover search and photocopies, plus an SASE.

BITS AND PIECES OF THE HAWKINS FAMILY PUZZLE

This is a continued article taken from the book by Millie Showalter Farmer. (3614 Harbel Drive, Bremerton, WA 98310)

Mary Elizabeth Hawkins mar. Asa Jeffress or Jeffries ca 1824-25 in Charlotte CO., VA where she resided. He was from Lunenburg CO., VA.

Mary Hawkins was listed in the will of Richard Hawkins in Elizabeth City CO.,VA in 1737. Her mother Hannah was married to Charles Jennings in 1747 gave Mary and her sister Phebe each 100 acres of land

Mary Hawkins dau. of Jehu and Mary Grundy George Hawkins mar. S.S.Graham. She was b. in Culpeper or Madison CO in Virginia. The family moved to Barren CO., KY. She may have remained in Virginia.

Mary Hawkins dau. of Thomas Hawkins Sr. d. in 1791 in Bertie CO. NC, Mary Hawkins b. Jan. 13,1764 was the dau. of Thomas and Frances Hawkins. From North Carolina History and Genealogy Register Vol. III pg. 29.

Maxilda Hawkins dau. of Thomas Ross Hawkins and Matilda Pinkard was b. in Orange 10. VA. She mar. David Smith on Oct. 6,1842 in Kentucky.

Matthew Hawkins witness a Power of Attorney on Apr. 15,1645 in York, CO., VA

Matthew Hawkins Jr. in 1645/46 York CO., VA Records Bk. 2 pg. 80"confessed a judgement to Thomas Harwood. Matthew Hawkins Jr. for two thousand sic---." A Court "February the secound Day."

Matthew Hawkins b. Mar. 10,1717 in Charles Parish Register in Youk CO., VA. In the same records "William, son of Matthew d. Mar. 12,1730."

Matthew Hawkins who died in 1805 was the grandson of Col. John Hawkins (1650-1717) and Frances Gross who lived in Queen Anne CO. in Maryland. His father was John Hawkins and his mother was Elizabeth --. Matthew mar. Frances Gould in 1746 and their son was Matthew II.

Gen. Micajah Hawkins b. 1786 d. 1855 was the son of John Hawkins and Sally Macon.

Michael Hawkins came to Virginia in 1654 brought by Col. Argoll Yardley to Northampton Beach.

Michael Hawkins was the son of Edward Hawkins.

Mildred June Hawkins was the dau. of Virgil Stephens Hawkins and Nettie Mae Eaves was b. Dec. 16,1923 in Poteau Oklahoma. She mar. Harvey Wade Glenn on Sept. 24, 1944.

Miller Hawkins was the son of Alexander T.H. Hawkins of KY. He was an infant in 1812 and had John Hawkins appointed for his guardian after his father's death.

Miliner Hawkins mar. Richard Burke in Amelia CO., VA on Jan. 26, 1749 Benjamin Hawkins was security.

Morgan Hawkins mar. Sally Holmes on Mar. 27,1819 in Davies CO., KY.

Morton W. Hawkins b. 1887 d. Aug. 28, 1935 is buried in the Hillsboro Cemetery in Fleming CO., KY.

Mourning Hawkins lived in Orange CO. Va ca 1779. She may have been Mourning Pigg before her marriage to ----Hawkins.

Moses Hawkins Jr. had a mill on Glens Creek in Woodford CO., KY. After his death on Oct. 10,1817, his wife Sarah Castleman Hawkins went to Missouri with her children.

Moses Hawkins Received a pension in 1810 in Woodford CO.KY for his father Capt. Moses Hawkins who was killed in the American Revolution at Germantown. He was listed as Head of Family in Versailles, KY (Woodford CO) census of 1810

Moses Hawkins arrived in Virginia on the ship Kent in June 1677. Other men named Hawkins with him were: Jessee, John, James, William and Isaac.

N. Hawkins mar. William Black in Halifax CO. on Sept. 12, 1788.

Nancy Hawkins mar. Thomas Jones whose grandfather was Wm. G. Jones. They came to KY in 1780 and settled in Bourbon CO.

Mancy Hawkins mar. John Gregg on Oct. 17,1812 in Fleming CO., KY.

Nancy Hawkins was the dau of Hohn Hawkins of BA. She was b. ca 1787 and was listed in the Nelson CO., KY census .

Plancy Hawkins mar. James Davis in Lincoln CO., KY in March 1796.

Nancy J. Hawkins was b. in 1839 in Owen CO., KY.

Nathan Hawkins mar. Margaret Burne in Mercer CO., KY on Dec. 7, 1824.

Nathan Hawkins, son of Nicholas and Elizabeth mar. Catherine Anne Haydon.

Nelly b. May 4, 1873 in Yreka Suskiyou CO. CA was the postmistress for 25 years at Yreka. She died there on July 28,1973. Her parents were Augustine Hawkins of Morgan CO., Ohio and Bridget McDonald of Ireland.

Nelly Hawkins dau. of Alexander T.H. Hawkins was an "infant orphan" in 1812. Her Guardian was John Hawkins.

Nina Hawkins was b. in 1892 in Jones CO.,NC died on Jan. 11,1929. She married Clem Foy. Her father was John Littleton Hawkins and her mother was Laura Virginia Tilghman.

Obediah E. Hawkins mar. Sally Hudgins on Apr. 7, 1797 in Prince William CO., VA.

Parry Hawkins son of Martin Hawkins and Elizabeth Thompson lived in Kentucky. His grandparents were John and Mary Langford Hawkins of Hanover County, VA.

Parthenia Hawkins mar. Green. She was the sister of Gen. John Hawkins.

Peggy Cave Hawkins was the dau. of John Hawkins of Scott CO., KY and his wife Sarah Hohnston.

Peter Hawkins resided in 1764 in Lunenburg CO., VA where he owned 200 acres. He was the son of John Hawkins d. 1804 in Lunenberg Col and Jane---.

Phebe Hawkins b. 1863, in Dayton Rhea CO, TN was the dau of Henry Hezekiah Hawkins and Gunising or wife # 2 Darkie.

Phebe Hawkins mar. WM. Boling in VA.

Phebe Hawkins dau. of Ri har? Hawkins (d. Sept. 1757) and Hanna Chandler. Her uncle was John Hawking. Pichard died at Elizabeth Cittee CO., VA. Phebe had sisters Mary and Elizabeth and her brother was Anthony.

Phebe Hawkins mar. Oct. 1789 in Orange County, VA. Phoebe Hawkins Poindexter sighed permission.

Phebe Hawkins mar. William Bolling in Orange CO., VA in 1788.

Philip Hawkins was listed in 1800 in the Kentucky tax list in Madison CO. In the 1800 census a Philip Hawkins was listed in Scott CO. and in Madison CO.

Philomon Hawkins had over 16 horses in Dirwiddie CO., VA. 1800 tax list.

Phinneas Hawkins, it has been said in a publication was the ancestor of Reuben Hawkins who mar. Elizabeth Edwards in Orange CO.,VA and that Phinneas was from Staunton, Wales. There is no Staunton, Wales but there was a Staunton River in early Virginia and a community called Wales. It is located near where the North Anna and South Anna Rivers met. Also, the Edwards family came to America from Wales. Reuben did not marry Elizabeth. His brother married Elizabeth and Reuben married Rebecca Edwards, her sister. Elisha Hawkins and Elizabeth were married before Reuben and Rebecca. Uriah Edwards was the Edward girls' father.

John Hawkins of early King William Co. came to Virginia from England. He was the great grandfather of Reuben and Elisha. Their father and grandfather were both named William and lived in Orange CO., Va.

After much searching, no records of any kind have shown up for Phinneas.

Pierce B. Hawkins was a Col. in the 1st Capital Guards (Infantry) which was a force raised for the defense of the State of Ky.

P.B. Hawkins (Col) was in the 1861 Company K, 11th Kentucky Volunteer Infantry. (Federal)

Polly Hawkins mar. Abraham McGeehee.

Polly mar. --Dunbar. She was the dau. of Moses Hawkins and Georgia Quisenberry. Her grandparents were William Hawkins and Elizabeth Bourne.

Polly Hawkins mar. Thomas Jordan on Mar. 4, 1822.

Polly Hawkins mar. Caleb Lilton on July 14,1812 in Hopkins CO., KY.

Polly Hawkins married Philip Dedman.

Price Hawkins and wife Betty acknowlege execution of deed in Anderson CO., KY in Feb. 1867. In 1855 they sold land in the area to Benjamin L. Hawkins and purchased land from Benjamin L. and Elizabeth Hawkins in 1853. This is not the Benjamin Hawkins who mar. Elizabeth Church and lived in Franklin CO., KY. He is a distant cousin. Both descend from William of Orange, CO., VA who made a will in 1799.

Pricilla Hawkins was the dau. of Philomon Hawkins IV and the sister of Gen. John Hawkins.

"Professor" Hawkins taught at the Georgetown College in the 1800s.

There are no names beginning with Q in these Hawkins "Bits".

R.G. Hawkins was Grand High Priest in Masonic Lodge in Kentucky.

Rachel Hawkins was the dau. of Benjamin Hawkins and Anne Bourne.

Rachel Hawkins b. ca 1797 mar. James Woods after 1870. She lived in Larens co.SC from about 1850 to 1870.

Rache J. Hawkins dau. of Pvt. Robert Hawkins and Mary Ann Jones was b. Mar. 4,1843 in Franklin CO., IN. The family later moved to Ohio.

Rachel Hawkins mar. Jacob Cox on May 16,1820 in Mercer CO., KY.

Rachel Hawkins mar. Thomas Garnett in Orange CO., VA on Oct. 3,1760.

Rebecca Hawkins was listed as 1 person living alone in Culpeper, CO., VA. 1800 tax list.

Rebecca Hawkins mar. Edmund A. Bacon on Jan. 5,1826 in Kentucky.

Rebecca Hawkins mar. Edmund Harrison on Nov. 10,1828 in Wilson CO., TN. She was b. in Amherst CO., VA in 1805. She was the dau. of John Hawkins and Martha (Patsy) Martin. Rebecca d. in Wilson CO., TN. in 1890.

Rhoda Hawkins was listed in the 1850 Madison CO.KY census as 70 years old and was b. in N.C. She was living in the household of Robert French. He had another Rhoda aged 34 in the household. In Squire Hawkins' housefold there was a child 10 years old named Rhoda.

Richard Hawkins son of Thomas Hawkins of NC who made a will dated Apr. 28,1791 - prov. 1793. His brothers were John, Frederick, Thomas and Richard. His sisters were: Elizabeth, Ann, Joice and Mary.

OUERIES

James Hawkins - Mary Ann Young

James Hawkins was born ca 3-6-1818 and Mary Ann Young is believed to have been born 2-3-1822. Census records indicate they were born in Kentucky.

Their son, Charles Quincy Hawkins, was born 2-Nov-1864, in Cumberland CO KY. (Charles was sometimes listed with "O" as the middle initial, but his middle name was *Quincy*.) He was probably the youngest child and his mother was about 41 when he was born. John R. and James A. were siblings close to his age.

According to the 1860 census of Warrick CO IN (the family moved between 1850 and 1860), other siblings listed were: Martin J., Louisa E., Mary Frances, Julia Ann, John R., Caroline, and James A. I believe all were children of James and Mary. "Grandpa" came to Indian Territory in the 1880's. He married Adah Knight in Warrick CO IN on 13-Oct-1886 before they came to Indian Territory.

THE JOHN R. HAWKINS FAMILY

(Submitted by Joan George)

The following information will correct and add to, information printed in *Hawkins Heritage*, August 1990, #10, pp. 4-7.

Another Moses Hawkins possibly related closely to these two men named Moses was a blacksmith named Moses R. Hawkins who lived in Fleming CO KY.

Moses R. Hawkins was the son of James Hawkins and Margaret, the parents whose family group sheet appears in our publication. It has never been conclusively proved that James and Margaret are his parents, but many of us in this organization firmly believe it. We do know John R. Hawkins, whose information follows, is a brother of this Moses R. Hawkins.

Moses R. was born 16 June 1812 in Virginia (We do not know exactly where.) He died on 4 June 1874 in Fleming CO KY. He is buried in New Hope Cemetery near Hillsboro, KY.

Moses R. married sisters. His first wife was Melvina Nickell b. 6 Mar 1815. She was the daughter of Robert Nickell and Eleanor Nickell Perry. She died on 3 Aug 1843 and is buried in Lee Cemetery in Morehead, Rowan CO KY. They had two children: James R., b. 1840 ad 17-9-1838 William Morton Hawkins, b. 1841. Both were born in Hillsboro, Fleming CO. James R. served in the Civil War in the 24th KY Regiment, and William M. served in a Missouri Regiment.

Moses R, (Wish we knew what that "R." stands for!) married wife #2 on 12 Nov 1843 in Fleming CO KY. She was Martha Jane Nickell, the sister of his first wife. Martha Jane was born 22 Jan 1826 in KY. She died on 6 Mar 1895. She is buried in the New Hope Cemetery near Hillsboro, KY. Their children, who were all born in Hillsboro, were: Martha E., b. 1844; Mary Jane, b. 1846; John H. (Jack Harvey), b. 27 Aug 1848, d. 19 Jul 1915; Roland, b. 1850; d. 9 Mar 1852 in Hillsboro; a son, Robin, b. 1851, d. 1853 in Hillsboro; Giavina, b. 1854; Mahalia, b. Jan 1856, d. 1936 in Hillsboro; a daughter named Joe (Yes), b. abt. 1860, and George Ann, b. 15 Feb 1864. She married William Henry George on 8 Sep 1880 in Hillsboro. She d 26 Dec 1907 in Salt Lake City, Utah. Mahalia Hawkins, dau/of Moses R. and Martha Jane, married William F. Shields on 3 Sep 1872 in Fleming CO KY. John H. (Jack Harvey) son of Moses R. and Martha Jane, married Patsy Jane "Jennie" Crain. He served in the Union Army for KY in the Civil War.

From a Hawkins Family Bible copied by Len George, we find John R. Hawkins, brother of the above Moses R., was b. 12 Mar 1792 (In VA); Sarah Barnett, his wife, born 10 Aug 1804. Their children were: Mary A., b. 23 Jan 1823 d. July 1823; Robert S., b. 27 Aug 1825, d. 16 Aug 1845; Richard, b. 27 Aug 1827; Farmer D., b. 30 Jul 1831; Marquis N., b. 20 Feb 1833; James M., b. 31 Jan 1835; John B. (Barnett), b. 10 Dec 1836; Acles C., b. 19 Jan 1839; Lewis P., b. 14 Mar 1841; American Howe, b. 25 Oct 1842; and Virginia Morton, b. 29 Jan 1846.

John R. Hawkins and Sarah Barnett were married 2 Oct 1822 (in Jessamine CO KY.) Their first daughter, Mary A., died in infancy. Their first son, Robert S., died just short of his twentieth birthday and never married. Their son, Richard, married Sarah America Gray on 25 Nov 1847. Sarah America was the daughter of John M. Gray and Elizabeth Seamonds. Farmer D. Hawkins, son of John R. and Sarah, married Hannah H. Lewis on 15 Mar 1854 (in Triplett, Rowan CO KY.) Hannah was the dau/of Thomas Lewis and Elizabeth Brooks. Marquis Hawkins, son of John R. and Sarah, married Mary Jane Dillon, whose mother was named Elizabeth, on 6 Jan 1853 (in Fleming CO KY.) James M. Hawkins, son of John R. and Sarah, married Sarah A Pound (About 1873.) John Barnett Hawkins, son of John R. and Sarah, married George Ann Hedrick, dau/of M.B. and Annie G. Hedrick, on 22 Mar 1874 in Fleming CO KY. Acles C. Hawkins, son of John R. and Sarah, married Sarah Dorothy Mavity on 23 Feb 1862 (in Lewis CO KY.) She was the dau/of Henry R. Mavity and Susannah Penn. (She and Acles later divorced, and he had two other marriages.)

In the same Bible are listed Births: Lillie May Hawkins, b. 16 Sep 1875; John William Gray, b. 6 Nov 1873; Clara Virginia Gray, b. 23 Dec 1861; Edward Lew Gray, b. 31 Oct 1867; and Jessa Monroe Gray, b. 6 May 1869.

Marriages also listed are: America Hawkins married M.H. Gray on 7 Oct 1858 (Fleming CO KY.); Virginia Morton Hawkins married W.H. George on 15 Feb 1866 (Hillsboro, Fleming CO KY.); and J.B. Hawkins and George Hedrick were married on 22 Mar 1827 (Fleming CO KY.)

Deaths listed in the Bible include: Richard Hawkins, d. 11 Apr 1900; Mary A., d. July 1823; Robert S., d. 16 Aug 1845; Farmer D., d 31 Oct 1854; Marquis, d. 20 Dec 1869; Lewis P., d. 6 Jun 1876; Sarah Barnett, wife of John R., d. 13 Apr 1878; Virginia Morton George, d. 11 May 1879; and John R. Hawkins, d. 13 Oct 1881.

William Henry George, b. 26 Feb 1841 on the family farm in Bath CO KY; was the husband of two Hawkins cousins, Virginia Morton ("Motie") Hawkins, dau/of John R. Hawkins and Sarah Barnett, and George Ann Hawkins, dau/of Moses R. Hawkins and Martha Jane Nickell. William Henry married Virginia M. Hawkins 15 Feb 1866 in Hillsboro, Fleming CO KY. He died 17 May 1933 at Retsil, Kilsap, WA. Virginia was born 19 Jan 1846 at Hillsboro, KY. She died 11 May 1879, not many months after giving birth to twins at Tollesboro, Lewis CO KY. Their son A. Lennie George, who was the surviving twin, was born 4 Jun 1878 in Tollesboro, Lewis CO KY, and married Harriet Edith Theobald 8 Oct 1903 in Salt Lake City, UT. He died in Salt Lake City 16 Feb 1945.

A. Lennie George and Harriet's first son, William Lennie George was born 23 July 1904 in Salt Lake City, UT. He married Janice Holmes Snow, b. 5 Apr 1905 at Salt Lake City. She died 11 Mar 1984 in Santa Ana, Orange CO CA. William Lennie George, her husband, died on 24 Jan 1973 at Palo Alto, Santa Clara CO CA. They had a son, Willard Lennie George, b. 9 Feb 1934 at Salt Lake City. He was married to Barbara Joan Worthen who was b. 15 Jan 1939, also at Salt Lake City, Salt Lake CO UT. Her parents were Frank Waldo Worthen and Esther Maude Butterwood. Barbara Joan and Willard Lennie were married 9 Sep 1966 in Salt Lake City. They live in Irvine, CA, where both are interested in genealogy.

John R. Hawkins (father of Virginia Morton Hawkins), and his wife, Sarah Barnett, also had a son named Acles Calemise Hawkins, who was b. 19 Jan 1839 in Hillsboro, KY. Acles was a farmer, laborer, and a Civil War private on the side of the Union. Along with his brothers, Richard, James M., and John Barnett, he served in the 10th Kentucky Cavalry. Acles married 1. Sarah Dorothy Mavity, dau/of Henry R. Mavity and Susannah Penn, on 23 Feb 1862 in Lewis CO KY. They were later divorced. Acles married, #2. in 1881 to Eliza M. and #3. Elizabeth E. Christy on 24 Aug 1885 in Fleming CO KY. She was dau/of William E. Christy and Olivia Estes Gray.

The children of Acles' first marriage to Sarah Dorothy Mavity, were: 1. Laura Ione ("Orrie") b 15 Nov 1864 in Mason CO KY, d 1888 in Fleming CO KY. She married Charles Graham in 1884; 2. Ollie May b 25 Sep 1867 in Lewis CO KY, d. abt. 1903 in Fleming CO KY. She was married to Allen Taylor Emmons in 1885; 3. John Henry, a horse trainer, was b 11 Feb 1870 and d. abt. 1950 in Springfield, IL. He mar. #1. in 1897 in Macon CO IL, Rebecca____ and 2. Jennie____; 4. Winston or Winsom Wilman Hawkins was b 22 Jan 1875 in Lewis CO KY and d. 23 Feb 1845 in Hillsboro, KY. He mar. #1. Mae Myer 28 Oct 1907 in Fleming CO KY and #2. Martha Pearce or Crawford Emmons on 28 Mar 1923; 6. Jesse Othel, b 16 Mar 1877 in Mason CO KY, and d. 7 Mar 1963 in Decatur, Macon, IL. He married Louise Hannah "Lula" Jordan in 1902 in Decatur, IL.

Two children were born to Acles C. Hawkins and his second wife, Eliza M. They were: 1. Clara Virginia, b 1 Mar 1882 in Fleming CO KY. d 28 Feb 1974 in Los Angeles, CA. She married Lewis B. Markwell in Fleming CO KY on 14 Mar 1900; 1. Guy Claude, b 15 June 1883 in Hillsboro, KY and d 18 July 1959 in Decatur, IL. He married Mabel Pearl Kemp in Springfield, IL 14 Mar 1907.

Acles' third marriage to Elizabeth E. Christy produced only one child, Joseph J. ("Jodie"), b 20 Dec 1889 in Hillsboro, KY and d 30 July 1959 in Macon CO IL. "J.J.", as he was known, married Ida Mae Tincher 19 Dec 1909 in Hillsboro, KY. Information on Acles Hawkins from Kathleen Hawkins Briglio, Norma Markwell, and Joan and Willard George.

Acles C. Hawkins' daughter, Clara Virginia Hawkins, married Lewis B. Markwell who was b 25 Mar 1876 in Fleming CO KY. He d 8 June 1948. Their son, Lewis Burman Markwell, was b 26 June 1923 in Flemingsburg, KY and mar. 23 Aug 1952 Norma Marie Harmon who was b 20 Mar 1926 in Ironton, OH. They live in Las Vegas, NV.

Acles C. Hawkins' son, Guy Claude, mar. Mabel Pearl Kemp who was b 12 July 1886 in Macon CO IL:, and d 12 Oct 1937 in Decatur, IL. Guy Claude Hawkins and Mabel Pearl Kemp had a son, Guy Curtis Hawkins, b. 16 June 1922 in Decatur, IL. He married Frances Ellen McCarthy 13 May 1943. Frances Ellen is the dau/of James Howard McCarthy and Helen Louise Maxon of Decatur, IL.

Mary Kathleen Hawkins, dau/of Guy Curtis Hawkins and Frances Ellen McCarthy was b 23 Mar 1945 in Kingman, AZ. She was a home economics major in college and taught school for many years in Canada. She married Tano Briglio 1 Aug 1980 in Victorio, British Columbia, Canada, where she lives. She is active in genealogical research and teaches classes on the subject. "Kathleen" has a rare combination of beauty and brains and best of all, she is a cat lover. She has contributed many bits and pieces of information on her line of the Hawkins puzzle.

Richard Hawkins, son of John R. Hawkins and Sarah Barnett, was living in Rowan CO KY in 1860. He was b 27 Aug 1827 on the family farm near Hillsboro, KY, as were all John R.'s children; d 11 Apr 1900 in Hillsboro and is buried in Hillsboro Cemetery. His wife, Sarah American Gray, dau/of John M. Gray and Elizabeth Seamonds, was b 3 Apr 1828 in KY, d 12 Oct 1901, and is also buried in Hillsboro Cemetery.

Their children were: 1. Elizabeth C. Hawkins, b 1850 in KY; 2. John M., b 25 June 1852 in Triplett, Fleming CO KY, d 21 July 1854, and is buried in Eden's Chapel Cemetery, Fleming CO KY; 3. Isadora, b 1857 in KY; 4. George B., b 1863 in Fleming CO KY. He married Ivettie___; 5. Reuben Samuel, b 1866 in Fleming CO KY; 6. Robert M., b 1870 in Fleming CO KY; 7. America, b 24 Oct 1876 in KY, d 22 Oct 1878, buried in New Hope Cemetery near Hillsboro KY. Their father, Richard, is listed in the census as a Civil War Veteran.

Farmer D. Hawkins, son of John R. and Sarah Barnett, b 30 July 1831, d 31 Oct 1854 in Bath Co KY, married Hannah H. Lewis, daw/of Thomas Lewis and Elizabeth Brooks, on 15 Mar 1854 in Triplett, Rowan CO KY. She was b 1833 in Morgan CO KY. To this union was born only one child, Farmer Hawkins, who was born after his father passed away, on 31 May 1855 in Bath CO KY.

The fifth child of John R. Hawkins and Sarah Barnett was Marquis N. Hawkins, b 20 Feb 1833, d 20 Dec 1869 in Hillsboro, KY. He is buried in New Hope Cemetery near Hillsboro. He married Mary Jane Dillon on 6 Jan 1853 in Fleming CO KY. Her mother was named Elizabeth. she was b 1834 in KY. Marquis N. and Mary Jane Dillon had the following children:

1. Melvania, b 1863 in KY; 2. Mary Ellen b 3 Sep 1856 at Triplett, Rowan CO KY; 3. Hester A., b 1859 in KY; Luther M. b 1862 in KY d 1938, buried Hillsboro Cemetery, as are all three of his wives. He married first in 1884 Nannie Myers, who was b 17 Jan 1867 and d 25 May 1909; second, Nannie; and third, Ella Mae Vice. After Luther's death, Ella Mae married Isaac Conway; 5. Laura B. Hawkins, b 2 May 1867 in KY, d 25 Dec 1893, buried New Hope (1893) Cemetery near Hillsboro, KY. After Marquis' death, his wife, Mary Jane, married Daniel Lyons in 1872, who had 6 children from a previous marriage to his first wife, Julia Ann. Mary Jane and Daniel also had 3 more children, Sarah, Charles, and Mary Lyons.

James M. Hawkins, son of John R. and Sarah Barnett, married Sarah A. Pound about 1873 in Bath CO KY. Sarah A. was born in 1847 in KY. James was b 31 Jan 1835 on the Hawkins family farm. The children of James M. and Sarah A. Pound were: 1. Presley P., b 1874 in KY; 2. Nancy C., b 1877 in KY; and 3. Virginia K., b 1879 in KY, d 1880 in KY. James M., their father, was a Civil War veteran.

John Barnett Hawkins, son of John R. Hawkins and Sarah Barnett, was b 10 Dec 1836, d. 27 Oct 1897 in Fleming CO KY, buried Hillsboro Cemetery. He married George Ann Hedrick, dau/of M.B. and Annie G. Hedrick, on 22 Mar 1874 in Fleming CO KY. John B. and George Ann's only child was a daughter, Lillie May Hawkins, b 16 Sep 1875 in Fleming CO KY.

The next child of John R. Hawkins and Sarah Barnett was Lewis P. Hawkins, b 14 Mar 1841. d 6 Jun 1876, buried in Muses Hill Cemetery, Fleming CO KY. His death was a suicide. He married Matilda Turner on 5 Jan 1871 in Fleming CO KY. Matilda was b in 1831 in KY. Matilda was a school teacher who was previously married and had the following children: George, b 1858; Louis, b 1860; Charles, b 1862; and Louise, b 1856. Lewis P. and Matilda had a daughter, name unknown, who later married a Mr. Moody. Their second child was Robert L. Hawkins, b. in 1872 in KY.

Tenth child of John R. Hawkins and Sarah Barnett was America Howe Hawkins, b 25 Oct 1842. She married Madison Harrison Gray on 7 Oct 1858 in Fleming CO KY. He was the son of John M. Gray and Elazabeth Seamonds, and a brother of Sarah America Gray who married America Howe Hawkins' brother, Richard. America's father, John R. Hawkins, apparently bore no good will to her husband and specified in his will that M.H. was to receive no part of America's inheritance.

Madison Harrison Gray and America Howe Hawkins were the parents of 5 children:

Lulie Barksdale George, b 7 Nov 1875 in Hillsboro KY, d 2 Jan 1967 in Spokane WA. She married William Harrison Rush on 1 May 1900. Then come the twins. Number 6 child was A. Lennis George, b 4 June 1878 in Tollesboro, Lewis CO KY, where his father W.H. George was County Superintendent of Schools. A. Lennie died 16 Feb 1945 in Salt Lake City, UT. He married Harriet Edith Theobald in S.L.C. on 8 Oct 1903. There is some confusion about the sex of the other twin. Family tradition says the child was a male named Leonard, but KY Vital Records show this sibling as a female named Lenna. I suppose the vital records would be more accurate. John Barnett Hawkins, son of John R. Hawkins and Sarah Barnett, was b 10 Dec 1836, d. 27 Oct 1897 in Fleming CO KY, buried Hillsboro Cemetery. He married George Ann Hedrick, dau/of M.B. and Annie G. Hedrick, on 22 Mar 1874 in Fleming CO KY. John B. and George Ann's only child was a daughter, Lillie May Hawkins, b 16 Sep 1875 in Fleming CO KY.

Lennis George, b 4 June 1878 in Tollesboro, Lewis CO KY, where his father W.H. George was County Superintendent of Schools. A. Lennie died 16 Feb 1945 in Salt Lake City, UT. He married Harriet Edith Theobald in S.L.C. on 8 Oct 1903. There is some confusion about the sex of the other twin. Family tradition says the child was a male named Leonard, but KY Vital Records show this sibling as a female named Lenna. I suppose the vital records would be more accurate. Lenna, a temale, is recorded in two different

KY sources. In any event, this child was also born on 4 June 1878 in Tollesboro, but died shortly thereafter in June of 1878. The child is buried in New Hope Cemetery near Hillsboro, KY.

William Henry George also married a second Hawkins bride after his first wife's passing. She was George Ann Hawkins, dau/of Moses R. Hawkins and Martha Jane Nickell. W. H. and George Ann were married on 8 Sept 1880 in Hillsboro, Fleming CO KY. They had 3 children: 1. Harvey Walker George, b 12 Sep 1884 in Tollesboro, Lewis CO KY, d 22 Feb 1956. He married Minerva P. Monroe; 2. Everett Decha George, b 15 Sep 1886 also in Tollesboro, d 20 May 1968. He married #1. Mary Hamlin, #2. Wilma Jory; #3 Nettie May George, b 18 May 1890 in Tollesboro, d 24 Nov 1954. She had 3 husbands: Samuel Sandusky, Theodore Stephen Jory, and Mr. Chapman.

In researching my ggg gf, William R. Hawkins, I contacted researchers of allied lines, even those remotely connected. I wrote to a Mavity descendant. He sent me the information on Sarah Dorothy Mavity (and family), who married Acles C. Hawkins, son of John R. and Sarah Barnett Hawkins.

I would like to share further information, hoping to locate a descendant of William Morton Hawkins, son/of Moses R. and Martha J. Nickell Hawkins, as mentioned in Joan's above article.

William Morton Hawkins was born 17 Sept 1838 in a log cabin nearly Licking Stream in Fleming CO KY. In 1856, feeling the urge to roam, he and his Uncle Perry Nickell left their homes in a prairie schooner with a yoke of oxen and went west. Perry Nickell was an older brother of Martha Jane Nickell Hawkins. Six weeks later they arrived in Missouri.

William Morton served in the Civil War--Co. F 23rd MO Volunteers. He was wounded at Shiloh in 1881. He died the 14th of May or July, 1918. His wife was Minerva Cassity, whom he married on 20 March 1865. She was dau/of Armstrong Cassity and Ruth Ann Trumbo. Minerva was born 13 March 1842 in Bath CO KY and d. 29 Oct 1924 in Sullivan CO MO. Both were buried in Mt. Zion Cemetery. They had four children: Two died in infancy and one son, Albert Alva Hawkins, b 11 Sept 1873 in Linn CO., MO, d. 5 April, 1941. Married Marry Newton in 1895. One daughter, Amoto was born 1875 and died 1880. She was wife of George Walker. Albert Alva Hawkins m. 2nd wife, Mattie Moore on 27 Nov 1924. -- Olyve

Other sons of James and Margaret Hawkins

William R. Hawkins was the first known son of James and Margaret ? Hawkins. William R., b 1791, married 2 Sept 1821 to Judah Hawes, b 2 Aug 1799, dau/of Alexander Hawes and Lucy Fowke. They were buried in Siloam Cemetery in Farmers, Rowan CO KY, just outside of Morehead. Zachariah Phelps gave the land on which this cemetery is situated. The Hawkins "area" of Siloam is in a upper corner of a ledge, overlooking a little valley. There is a white cement bench placed here. Perhaps it was put here by a Hawkins, Lame, or Moody descendant since it is the only bench I remember seeing in the entire cemetery.

When my husband, Tom, and I visited the area on two occasions, the small church was having its Sunday morning services. We were tempted to visit their services, but instead, listened to their singing from afar. The sound of the voices carried to the upper corner of the cemetery. I wondered if this was the same little church in which my great great Uncle Robert Isaac Nickell, taught Sunday School. No, I guess not, it was a small frame church, and was newer than 1890.

First child of William R. and Judah was James A., b 17 June 1822. He married 7 June 1841. They had eleven children, born from 1841 to 1860. They were James. W., Richard F., Edward F., Lucy J., Elizabeth C., Frances M., Henry S., Elizabeth J., Margaret, Lucinda, and Moses R. Descendant of James A. and Susanna, LARRY HARTSOG of Coulterville, CA, sent the information that James A.'s daughter, Margaret Ann, b 1856, married Timothy Collins, and moved to IL, Iowa, and then to Missouri. Their daughter, Luella Collins, married William Compton. They had a daughter, Gladys Compton (Larry's grandmother), who married Larry Gillen in California; and they were parents of Larry's mother Shirley Gillen Hartsog.

Second child of William R. and Judah was, Lucy Anne, b 20 Sep 1824. She married Isaac E. Phelps, son of Zacharia Phelps and Martha Kissick. Zacharia gave the land on which Siloam Cemetery is situated. Phelps Family by William Harold Swango, gives information concerning the PHELPS LODGE NO. 482, Farmers, Kentucky. Isaac E. and Zacharia Richard organized a new Masonic unit in Rowan CO, near Farmers. Their charter for the new lodge was 21 Oct 1869. Isaac E. was the first Master. He and Lucy Ann Hawkins Phelps held the first meetings in their home. When the meetings grew too large for their home, they were held in the Court House, until it was burned by marauders in 1880.

Isaac E. Phelps and Lucy Ann's children were: Manerva Jane, b 1824; Harriett, b 1848; Mary E. b 1850; Orpha A., b 1 Sept 1856; Isaac W. b 20 May 1861; and John L. b 1867. Isaac was buried in Siloam Cemetery (d 8 Feb 1889). Lucy outlived him by several years. There is a footstone in the Hawkins area, with "L.A.P" engraved. Any headstone has apparently been destroyed. At the upper ledge, there are several broken pieces of stone leaning against a tree. It is possible that some pieces could have slid down the ledge in past years.

NOTE: David L. Phelps, brother of Isaac E., was married twice. His first wife was Martha Jane HAWKINS, b 1845 and d 1879. This suggests she was daughter of Moses R. Hawkins, whose daughter, Martha Jane, was b ca1844.

Third child of William R. and Judah was Joyce, b 21 Sept 1826. Died young.

Fourth child of William R. and Judah was Andrew Jackson, b 2 Feb 1829, and married on 18 Sep 1859 to Permelia Nickell Hawkins, b 4 July 1843, d 31-July-1899. Andrew died 22-7-1909 in Galveston CO TX.; buried in Evergreen Cemetery.

One of my Hawkins cousins, Lois White Brumley (gr gr granddaughter of Andrew and Permelia), former resident of this Galveston CO area, sent me a picture of the Cemetery. She and other concerned citizens have helped in the beautification program of Evergreen. It was not abandoned, but many of us have seen abandoned graveyards, no longer used for current interments. I wish it was possible for them all to have such interest.

Fifth child of William R. and Judah was a baby son, b 8 Jan 1831. Died the same day.

Sixth child of William R. and Judah was William Morton Hawkins who is sometimes confused with William Morton, son of Moses R. and Martha Jane Nickell Hawkins. Son of Wm. R. was born 11 Jan 1832 in Clark CO KY. He married Rose Anne Cassity, dau/o James A. Cassity and Mary Ann Hedges. They married 17 Feb 1853, and lived in Clinton CO MO.

The children of William M. and Rose Anne were Martin J. b 1854. On 17 Feb 1853, he married Nancy C. _____, b 10 Mar 1833. Martin J. Hawkins d 1943 in Clinton CO MO and was buried in Pleasant Hill Cemetery, with his wife, Nancy, who died in 1946. (Also buried there were Perry HAWKINS 22 Dec 1871 - 1 Jan 1948, and Elizabeth Hawkins, 12 July 1873 - 1968.) At the time this cemetery was recorded, 26 Oct 1968, Elizabeth Hawkins' grave was new.

Children of Martin J. Hawkins and Nancy C. were: 1. Gertrude b ca1879, who married Jacob E. MATHEWS 2 Sept 1900. 2. Bertha, who married George R. Hall on 21 Feb 1912. 3. Arena Hawkins, dau/of Martin J. and Nancy C. married William Hunt 21 Dec 1880. They had two daughters, Rosella b ca1875, and Daisy O., b ca1879.

The 1880 census shows Daisy O. to be a step granddaughter. On 1986, the Deputy Clerk of Clinton CO MO, suggested to me that Arena Hawkins was divorced from William A. Hunt and remarried him 21 Dec 1880.

Seventh child of William R. and Judah was Margaret Jane, b 24 Aug 1834 and died 6 Feb 1894 in Rowan CO KY. She married first Matthias Lee, s/o Joseph Lee and Abigail Moppin, on 8 Nov 1851. They had: 1. Joyce Abigail, b 1852 Bath CO KY; 2. John T.W. b 1856, and married Laura Douglass 18 Aug 1881; 3. William Riley b 1859 in Fleming CO, d 21 Dec 1927, and married Hattie Douglass in 1889; 4. Matthias Barber Hurt b 1861 in Fleming CO, married Lizzie E. Douglass on 16 Aug 1881... Matthias B. Hurt died 20 Feb 1899 in Kansas City, MO.; and Ann Eliza b ca1855. NOTE: Deaths and marriage information on John T. W., Wm. Riley, and Matthias B. H., provided by Jim and Shirley Ervin. If anyone has a current address for the Ervins, please let me know. - OHA.

Matthias, husband of Margaret Jane Hawkins, was killed during the Civil War. She married next Henry Clay Powers, ca1871. Henry Clay Powers was b 1834. Henry Clay's first wife was

Malinda Edwards. He and Margaret Jane Hawkins Lee had Margaret H. Powers, b. 26 Sept 1874 in Rowan CO KY. Henry Clay Powers was active in the Tolliver-Martin Feud of Rowan CO KY, 1884-1887. He owned the hotel in Morehead and added the Morehead Opera House. During the Feud, he removed his family from Morehead because of the danger there--returned at a "safer" date. <u>Days of Anger, Days of Tears</u>, by Fred Brown, Jr. and Juanita Blair, is an excellent account of the Tolliver-Martin Feud. I believe this book is now out of print. If anyone wishes to inquire further, write to Juanita Blair in care of the Pioneer Press in Morehead, KY.

After Margaret Hawkins Lee Powers' death 6 Feb 1894, in Morehead (buried Lee Cemetery), Henry Clay Powers married. Fedelia H. Prather (pronounced "Prater"). Henry d 30 Dec 1896.

<u>Eighth child</u> of William R. and Judah Hawes Hawkins was Jo Anne, b 4 April 1838. She married Lewis R. Lame on 23 Sept 1858. My Hawkins Bible records the date of Jo Anne's birth, but not death; nor is there a stone in Siloam Cemetery. It is posibly one of those broken. They lived in Rowan CO. Lewis and Millford were buried in Siloam Cemetery near Farmers. Lewis R. was a member of the Masons and a Baptist preacher.

Their children were: #1 Millford William, b 20 Jan 1860, d 26 Jan 1863. Buried Siloam Cemetery, near Farmers and Morehead KY, Rowan CO; #2. Emma, b 28 Mar 1863, married Absolom Perry, s/o Cyrus Perry, b 5 Oct 1882, and died Feb 1956. Buried in Caudill Cemetery, Rowan CO KY. Absolom Perry was also involved in the Tolliver-Martin Feud of Rowan CO. (Considering the fact there were around 400 families there at the time, almost everyone was touched by this war in some way); #3. John Morton Hawkins b 1866, married #1 Anna Collins, #2 Arthia Evans, and #3 Cordie Collins. John Morton Lame was buried in Clearfield Cemetery, Morehead, Rowan CO KY; #4 Addie, b 1874, married Overton A. Maxey 29-9-1891, d. 1936. Both are buried in Clearfield Cemetery. There were several letters written in the 1890's, from Addie to Permelia during her teen-aged years, through her marriage.

William R. Hawkins, father of the above eight children, served in the War of 1812.

James R. Hawkins, b 1794, was son/of James and Margaret? Hawkins, was born in VA. Census records of Stafford CO VA 1791-1825, indicate he lived in Stafford CO. From information I retrieved from that county's Court House, and from the VSL, there was one James Hawkins on taxation records. Taxation on the children at corresponding ages, helped in his identification. James disappeared from Stafford's records in 1825; there was no widow Hawkins the following year. James Hawkins appeared for the first time in 1826 in Clark CO KY.

James R. Hawkins married 12 May 1822 to Cuziah Wilcoxin. At this time, I have not researched possible children. James R. died in Bourbon CO KY on 23 Dec 1834, five months after his father, James Hawkins. James R. served during the War of 1812, under Captain Elijah Harding, 45th Regiment, Virginia Militia, Stafford County. In James R.'s widow's deposition for a widow's pension, she stated he had made up the middle initial "R" so as not to be confused with all the other James Hawkins. Inasmuch as all his brothers also had the middle initial "R", one wonders what their middle names might have been.

Walter R. Hawkins, apparent last son of James and Margaret ? Hawkins, was b ca1817 in VA. His first wife was Angeline Snedegar, according to KY Vital Stats Records. The Fleming CO KY census of 1850, showed him to be a blacksmith. 1860 - 1880 lists him as a farmer.

1850 Fleming CO census lists their children were listed as William R. 9; James R. 7; John R. 5; Thomas R. 3; Lucy J, 1.

1860 Rowan CO census lists James 18; John 16; Thomas 13; Lucy 11; Lewis 11; Moses 6;

Sarah E. 4; Alonzo 8/12.

1870 Rowan CO census lists Thomas 22; Lucy 20; Sarah 18; Lewis 14; Alonzo 11; George

9; Walter 7; and Mary 5.

1880 Rowan CO census lists for the first time, Mary, age 44; Thomas J (Note: This should be an "R" - OHA.); George 18; ? Presly 18 step-son; Peter 14 step-son; Robert Land son-in-law and Lucy, 29, daughter. The stepson's last name would indicate that the married name of Wat's present wife was Presly/Presy.

1. William R. b 1841 KY; 2. James R. b 1843 KY; 3. John R. b 1845 in KY; 4. Robert b ca1846 in KY; 5. Thomas R. b 1847 in KY, d 12 Mar 1896 in Flemingsburg, Fleming CO KY; 6. Lucy J. b 1849 in KY. She married Robert Land; 7. Sarah E. b 1852 KY; 8. Lewis b 1856 in KY; 9. Moses b 1 Sep 1854 in KY; 10. Alonzo, b 6 Oct 1859 in Rowan CO KY; 11: George, b 10 Sep in Rowan CO KY, d ca1888 in Rowan CO KY. He married Mary "Polly" Ann Cooper on 1 Apr 1884 in Rowan CO; 12. Walter, b 1863 in KY; and 13. Mary. b 1865 in KY.

Andrew Jackson Hawkins - Permelia Nickell

Andrew Jackson Hawkins, son of William R. Hawkins and Judah Hawes, was born 2-Feb-1929 in Kentucky. Judah was daughter of Alexander Hawes and Lucy Fowke. Alexander died in the Fleming CO KY cholera epidemic of 1833.

Lucy's father, Richard, was killed in the Revolution. She was the gr gr granddaughter of Gerard Fowke and Ann Thoroughgood (Her father was Adam Thoroughgood.) Colonel Fowke served in the army of King Charles I. As the king was about to be beheaded, the colonel came with George Mason to Virginia. He named Stafford County after Staffordshire, England, where his home, "Gunston Hall", was located. George Mason patterned his Virginia "Gunston Hall" after the Fowke home. The latter is a museum open to the public. The large entry was used for dancing lessons for the Mason children as well as for family parties. The Mason's private school for the children stands just outside the main house. Their tutor's quarters were in a loft up a narrow stairway inside the school.

Andrew Hawkins married Permelia Nickell, daughter of William C. Nickell and Lucinda W. Pearce. William C.'s parents were Robert and Eleanor Perry Nickell, from Greenbrier County, WV. They came to Kentucky with three of Robert's five brothers, all of whom served in the Revolution. Andrew and Permelia married in Greenup County KY 18-Sept-1859.

In 1880, as a result of the unrest of rebuilding after the Civil War in Rowan County, KY, Andrew and Permelia said goodbye to friends and family. Permelia's brother, Jim, was nearly murdered during the time prior to the Tolliver-Martin Feud. This Feud, or the Rowan County War, as it was sometimes called, broke out full force in 1884, with bloodshed not to end until 1887. It was considered by some people to be bloodier than the Hatfields and McCoy Feud.

Andrew and Permelia joined another family, and with six of the seven Hawkins children, they boarded a steamboat on the Ohio River. Going down the Mississippi, they finally took shore in Memphis. They reassembled their wagons and journeyed through Arkansas to Somervell County, Texas. They settled in the community of George's Creek, which was founded by George Barnard in 1840.

The eldest Hawkins son, Daniel Boone, was born 16-Aug-1860, and remained for a time in KY. He had just married Millicent Amelia Gilkison in 1879, and they were expecting their first child. They moved to Texas, where Daniel died as a young man in 1888.

Two baby sons died before James William "Willie", was born in 1865. Willie died of tuberculosis, unmarried, at the age of 24. Their next son, John Robert, was born 23-Feb-1868, and married Maggie Scarbro in 1891. They joined in the Land Rush of Oklahoma. Four daughters were then born to the Hawkins. Anna Pruden Kate, born 6-Oct-1870, married 17-Dec-1891 to James William Shults, born 18-Feb-1866 in Missouri. Anna died on 21-Oct-1903. My grandfather, James Shults, took their small children, Survella and Loyd, to Galveston County to

join the family of Anna's sister, Lizzie. James, a deputy sheriff, was pushed off a train and killed in 1911, while transferring a prisoner to another car.

The second daughter, Eva Cora was born 22-Feb-1873. She married George Franklin Shults, bro/of James, on 8-Dec-1892. At the turn of the century, they moved to Indian Territory. Eva Cora died 2-Nov-1933, soon after suffering a broken hip.

Then Elizabeth Frances, "Lizzie", born 28-Dec-1874, and married Robert Henry Romine on 20-Dec-1894. Lizzie died in Galveston County, Texas in October of 1811. The youngest daughter was Louisa Ellen McKissick Hawkins, born 18-Feb-1878. Louisa was first married to her cousin, Thomas Clark Page, from Kentucky. He visited Texas after being honorably discharged from the U.S. Army. He had served in the Philippine War. Clark died in 1917 and Louisa married Oliver Clyde Blanton. Louisa died in 1955, a few years after having been seriously injured in an automobile accident.

Permelia Nickell Hawkins died suddenly on 4-July-1899, and is buried in George's Creek, next to her son "Willie". Andrew died 22-July-1909, while visiting daughter, Lizzie, in Galveston County. The same night, a storm in the town of Alvin, washed out 200 feet of bridge, making it impossible for Andrew to be taken for burial by Permelia's side. He was interred in Evergreen Cemetery in Alta Loma. After many years, gravestones were broken or stolen. There were no stones for Andrew Jackson Hawkins nor for James William Shults. Nineteenth-Century letters from the collection of Permelia Hawkins, gave proof of the burial sites for both Andrew and Jim. The Historical Society in Galveston County, with financial help from descendants, has provided a large granite stone with names of those whose burial sites have now been proven. The Cemetery has recently received a Historical Marker of The State of Texas.

The winding creek of the George's Creek community empties into the Brazos River. When the rains were heavy, water flowed over the banks, and part of the little town was flooded. The enterprising citizens simply moved the town to the other side of the creek!

Each year on the first Saturday in May, people come from far-away places, to share a reunion with long-time friends. Perhaps there is no family remaining there for some, but the warmth of memories prevails. There is a tabernacle built with "real" shingles, rather than the thatch roof of yesteryears. Tables and benches are permanently set up for the great selection of food visitors bring, as well as for the annual meeting of the "Association".

In 1979, Raymond Elliott, former Dean of Music in Texas Tech, and Mildred Padon, wrote Of a People and a Creek, a book describing the community of George's Creek. Interviews provided factual information about ancestry and how it was "back then". Proceeds from the book purchased a CD which has grown into a large sum, providing perpetual care of the cemetery. Texas bluebonnets and wild flowers literally cover this peaceful area.

There is no town of George's Creek now and hasn't been for many years. In the 1920's, nearly twenty cotton gins were active. There is still a small church not far from the Cemetery, and perhaps one or two white houses.

Driving down the narrow road which winds by the clear creek towards the cemetery, I can almost hear the blacksmith's steady hammering . . . My great grandmother Permelia is hurriedly walking towards Chambers Store. She stops along the way to visit with a church friend she usually sees only on Sundays. Permelia has her sunbonnet on and a shopping list in her hand. She needs to purchase flour to make a cream cake for Anna's birthday, and thread for a patch on Andrew's shirt. But mainly, she will make the final payment on her Singer sewing machine, purchased in 1882

Mr. Faulconer says it is a follow-up of a book he compiled in 1984, entitled <u>Thomas Faulconer and His Descendants</u>. It traces many lines of the Faulconer family, going back to Thomas Faulconer who arrived in Virginia in 1622. While that book is out of print, unbound Xerox copies are available (see below.)





- 7. If you are sending copyrighted material, we cannot use it without the complete source. Please give the title, author, publisher, copyright date, and page. If it is not copyrighted, please cite the source so that credit may still be given.
- 8. If you want your submissions returned, please provide return postage.
- 9. If you send family group sheets, <u>number</u> each sheet in the order that it is to be interpreted. This is extremely important especially if it is used in our publication, but also for my indexed files.
- 10. Put your name or initials on every page you send.
- 11. Please put the date on your letters as well as on the material you submit. It is helpful if you use an inside address on your letters. I file your letters but not the envelopes in my notebooks.
- 12. If you are a new member, it is hoped that you will send a family group sheet or pedigree chart.
- 13. We urge our members to take advantage of submitting queries. You may do this once a year, and they can be in "standard" form or in letter form. Since we have new members all the time, your query will still be new to them.
- 14. Suggestions welcomed.
